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院長的話

吳密察 國立故宮博物院 院長

108 年重要施政成果

改善北部院區空間設施

本院以參觀者角度出發，重新設計一樓服務台與導覽大廳，同時改善捷運站來院交通資訊及相關指標，讓遊客可以有效率地、有品質地觀展，以提升參訪體驗。

積極辦理北部院區整擴建計畫，除辦理公聽會凝聚共識外，亦依據公聽會意見修正計畫，並於 108 年 10 月完成專案管理廠商招標，推動先期規劃作業，同時持續辦理南側基地暨有建築物整建工程。

強化南部院區景觀、交通設施

為提升南部院區交通便利性與可及性，本院提供往返高鐵嘉義站及園區內免費接駁服務，並開放大型遊覽車靠館下客，縮短觀眾步行距離。另為增加遊客休憩空間，重整南部院區大門入口、迎賓大道景觀，規劃特色主題花園，並於湖邊增設環湖木棧道與休憩廣場。

國立故宮博物院設立宗旨為整理、保管、展出原國立北平故宮博物院及國立中央博物院籌備處所藏之歷代古文物及藝術品，並加強對文物藝術品之徵集、研究、闡揚等，歷年來在本院前輩及同仁共同努力維護及推展下，均能圓滿完成使命。

密察於 108 年 2 月受命承乏本院院務，以「使用者友善化」為核心理念，積極推動新故宮計畫等專案計畫，並務實辦理本院各項典藏、研究、展示、教育、文創等博物館業務。本刊出版之目的是在具體呈現本院 108 年度的綜合業務內容、資料統計與豐碩成果，期以系統地建構本院院史參考資料，並供各界參考運用。

在此，密察除藉本刊特別感謝本院同仁辛勞付出外，並擇要說明 108 年重要施政成果及 109 年工作重點：

國寶館建築工程已於 108 年與內政部營建署簽訂代辦採購協議書，委由該署全程專業代辦。

擴大博物館資源公共化參與計畫

本院執行「百萬學子悠遊博物館專案平台」、「故宮遊藝思—學子嗨 FUN 參訪北部院區」等偏鄉學校合作計畫，邀請學子到院參觀，提升文化藝術鑑賞能力，落實美感教育向下扎根。並為提升多元族群參與之機會，秉持社會共融理念推動各項參觀導覽與教育活動。

積極辦理各項兒童、親子及青少年創意活動，並與高中職以下學校共同規劃館校合作專案，發展以本院文物為素材之主題課程；同時辦理「博物館人才培育計畫」，提供大專院校學生寒暑假實習機會，並與多所大學合作，提供諮詢及協助教學，以培養新一代博物館觀眾群及博物館從業人員。

聯合國內九大人氣博物館發行「愛臺灣博物館卡」，鼓勵民眾在休閒出遊時，善用博物館資源。

院內珍藏文物、數位展示

本院 108 年舉辦多元主題文物展覽及數位展示，常設展有「慈悲與智慧—宗教雕塑藝術」等 20 檔；專題特展有「適於心—明代永樂皇帝的瓷器」25 檔；國外借展有「悠遊風景繪畫—俄羅斯普希金博物館特展」等 4 檔；院內數位展有「古畫動漫—明人出警入蹕圖」等 6 檔；院外數位巡迴展有「動物大觀園」等 12 檔。

舉辦各項研討會等各式交流活動及學術研究成果

108 年本院召開「醫學典籍、醫藥知識及其流通運用」國際研討會、論壇及工作坊等共 11 場，同仁於研討會發表論文計 64 篇，另參與及邀請國內外學術交流計 117 項，充分展現本院學術研究之量能。

另除與美國胡盈瑩及范季融基金會、德國德

勒斯登國立博物館、大阪市立東洋陶磁美術館合作、交流外，本院並與泰國國家探索博物館機構締結姐妹館，象徵故宮接軌國際的亮眼成績。

109 年工作重點

109 年新春伊始，全球籠罩在嚴重特殊傳染性肺炎 (COVID-19) 的陰影下，本院於防疫期間，配合中央流行疫情指揮中心相關防疫措施，強化各項防疫整備作業，以維護遊客與全體同仁之安全健康。

但因疫情嚴峻導致到院遊客量大幅減少的情況下，更凸顯《博物館法》中博物館應秉持公共性，提供民眾多元之服務內容及資源的重要，本院以落實「文化平權」的社會功能與國際競爭力精神為願景，提出新時代博物館的關鍵轉型計畫—「觀眾服務數位轉型計畫」，並以下列項目為工作重點：

一、 規劃設計新式導覽 App，結合語音導覽與定位功能，推展新型態博物館觀眾服務。

二、 建置票務電子化系統與整合服務，提昇行政效率與服務品質。

三、 線上服務升級，包含擴大 Open Data 平台應用服務、擴增官網友善服務內容、文創商品購物網站改版、數位典藏系統升級等。

期許透過網站、購票、導覽、展示等系統建置，以行動科技搭配新型導覽，提供觀眾行程規劃、購物推薦、文化推播等即時性資訊服務，快速因應新的博物館觀眾服務需求。並以大數據、AI、區塊鏈、行動服務等科技，分析、累積及建立訪客資料，進而開發新世代博物館客群，翻轉博物館定型服務，建構以智慧為核心、觀眾視角為主軸之創新博物館營運模式。

本院將持續優化各項服務，期許面對新世代觀眾，達成新時代博物館的使命，並面向國際推展台灣文化軟實力，發揮故宮最大價值。懇請院內外各界，仍本於愛護、支持之忱，繼續鞭策指教。

A Word from the Director

The established purpose of the National Palace Museum (NPM) is to organize, preserve, and exhibit the ancient cultural relics and artworks once housed by the National Beiping Palace Museum and the Preparatory Department of the National Central Museum. The NPM additionally strives to enhance its functions in acquisition, research, and interpretation. The museum has successfully worked towards completing its mission through the joint effort of the museum's past and current staff members in upholding and exhibiting the collection.

Since appointed to my position as Director in February 2019, I have been taking "user friendliness" as my core philosophy to actively promote initiatives such as "The New NPM Plan" and pragmatically handle the museum's collection management, research, exhibitions, educational programs, cultural creativity, and other related operations. This report aims to not only represent the comprehensive business content, data statistics, and achievements of the museum in 2019, but also to systematically conduct reference material on museum history and provide a publicly available resource.

In addition to thanking the museum's staff for their hard work, I have chosen to explain the museum's important achievements in 2019 and institutional goals for 2020, as follows:

2019 Achievements

A.Renovating Spaces and Facilities in the Northern Branch

Taking visitor perspectives into account, the museum redesigned the service desk and orientation hall. Additionally, transportation information and museum signage at the MRT Shilin station were improved. These changes allow guests to visit the museum more efficiently and enhance the visiting experience. The NPM has also actively handled the Northern Branch expansion plan, which was revised in order to better address consensus made during public hearings. While a project & construction management (PCM) company was appointed to handle project planning in October 2019, building renovation on the southern site continued.

B.Improving Landscapes and Transportation Services in the Southern Branch

To improve transit to the Southern Branch, the museum started providing a free shuttle service between the HSR Chiayi station and the museum.

Additionally, large tour buses are now able to drop off passengers near the museum in order to shorten the walking distance of visitors. Landscaping at the entrance and the main venue of the museum was rearranged, a themed garden was planned, and a boardwalk and rest plaza were added to the lakeside.

In 2019, the Construction and Planning Agency of the Ministry of the Interior signed the "National Treasure Building Construction Project" agency agreement with the NPM to manage and oversee the procurement process.

C.Publicizing Museum Resources

The NPM's outreach programs such as "Million Students Visit the NPM" and "NPM Travel, Art & Thoughts — Students Visit Northern Branch with Hi Fun" invited students in rural, remote, and isolated schools to visit the museum to enhance their cultural and artistic appreciation and encourage aesthetic education in their learning. Adhering to the concept of social inclusion, the museum provided diverse tours and educational activities for the participation of different demographic groups.

The NPM actively held various creative activities for children, parents, and young people; developed themed courses with primary and secondary schools using the museum's collection; provided college students with internship opportunities during winter and summer vacations through the "Museum Intern Training Program"; and cooperated with universities to assist in teaching a new generation of museum audiences and practitioners.

In 2019, the NPM also issued the "iTaiwan Museum Pass," encouraging the public to take advantage of unlimited museum visits, discounted admission, and shopping in their leisure time.

D.Exhibiting Museum Collections and New Media Arts

In 2019, the NPM organized many themed exhibitions based on museum's collections and new media arts creations. The museum offers 20 permanent exhibitions covering all types of artworks. There were 25 special exhibitions, including "Pleasingly Pure and Lustrous: Porcelains from the Yongle Reign (1403-1424) of the Ming Dynasty." Four international loan exhibitions were held, including "Masterpieces of French Landscape Paintings from the Pushkin State Museum of Fine Arts, Moscow." Seven digital exhibitions were held within the museum, including "Painting Anime — Departure Herald and Return Clearing," and 12 touring digital exhibitions were held outside of the museum, including "ANiMAL: Art, Science, Nature, Society."

E.Scholarly Communication and Interaction

In 2019, the NPM held the "International Colloquium on Antiquarian Medical Texts, Traditional Medical Knowledge, and their Digital Archiving," and an additional 11 forums and workshops. A total of 64 papers were published by museum staff and as the result of seminars, and staff participated in 117 domestic and international academic exchange programs. Over the course of the year, the museum fully demonstrated the quantitative capabilities of its academic research. In addition to partnerships with institutions like the Staatliche Kunstsammlungen, Dresden, and the Museum of Oriental Ceramics, Osaka, the NPM newly established a sister pavilion with the National Discovery Museum Institute of Thailand. These exchanges showcased the dazzling achievements of the National Palace Museum's international presence.

2020 Vision

At the beginning of 2020, the world was shrouded in the shadow of the COVID-19 pandemic. In conjunction with the relevant measures of Taiwan's Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC), the NPM has strengthened epidemic prevention operations during this period in order to maintain the health and safety of visitors and staff.

However, due to the severity of the pandemic, the number of visitors to the museum has been greatly reduced. The crisis has highlighted the importance of upholding the public nature of museums, and providing the public with diverse services and resources. Striving to implement equal cultural rights and the spirit of international competitiveness, the NPM has proposed a key project moving toward an era of modern museums: "The NPM Digital Transformation Plan." Here is an outline of the plan's major goals:



1. Building an infrastructure that supports all museum services, including ticketing, tour booking, shopping, and more in order to improve administrative efficiency and service quality.
2. Expanding/optimizing on-line service platforms, including Open Data, Museum Shop, Digital Collection Management, and Ticketing System to provide friendly service.
3. Developing new applications using location-based, real-time information and multimedia technology to explore greater museum resources and enhance visitor experience.

Hopefully, with the above resources, the NPM will be able to create innovative museum services that can quickly respond to the needs of a new generation of museum audiences. Visitors will also be able to connect to related services such as itinerary planning, shopping recommendations, and other cultural promotions. The NPM is looking forward to applying big data, artificial intelligence, block chain, mobile services, and other advanced technologies to accumulate and analyze visitor information in order to develop an intelligence-based and audience-centered model of museum services.

We will continue to provide better services to achieve our mission, targeting a new generation of museum visitors, promoting Taiwan's culture on the global stage, and maximizing the value of the National Palace Museum. I sincerely invite every individual, inside and outside the museum, to continue to offer their guidance and support.

Remarks:

According to the organizational laws and regulations of the National Palace Museum (NPM), the museum has one Director, two Deputy Directors, and one Chief Secretary. The museum has a Department of Antiquities, Department of Painting and Calligraphy, Department of Rare Books and Historical Documents, Department of Registration and Conservation, Department of Cultural Creativity and Marketing, Department of Education, Exhibition and Information Services, Department of the Southern Branch Museum Affairs, Security Management Office, Secretariat and General Affairs Office, Human Resources Office, Accounting Office, and a Civil Service Ethics Office. In total, there are seven departments and five offices, which handle various statutory duties and related business.

常態性物抽點

本院為切實檢視文物典藏管理工作執行情形，每年分四季由院長進行抽點各類文物。108 年抽點各類文物共計 1,458 件。

Collection Management

By December 31, 2019, the NPM had a total of 698,736 works in its collection. The registration, conservation, preservation, exhibition, and photography of the collection were handled in accordance with the "National Palace Museum Collection Management Operating Guidelines."

Storage Management

Due to the NPM's responsibility for the protection and conservation of its collection, the NPM has continued to strengthen the monitoring of all access to the museum's storage facilities and has improved various security mechanisms so that artifacts are properly preserved and can be systematically managed.

Regular Inventory Spot Checks

To closely monitor the management of the museum's collection, every season the Director selects works for spot inventory checks across all artifact categories. In 2019, a total of 1,458 works were examined.



Acquisition of Artifacts

The acquisition policy of the NPM focuses on the collecting of Chinese artifacts; however, in recent years the NPM has begun to collect important artifacts from across Asia. In 2019, the NPM purchased a total of 105 items and received 863 items in donation (including 2 national gifts). The details are as follows:

Exhibitions and Exchanges



文物展覽及交流

本院依常設展及特展兩種方式，策劃書畫、銅器、瓷器、玉器、漆器、雕刻、善本圖書與文獻檔案等展覽，並搭配出版圖錄或導覽手冊，讓觀眾一覽豐饒的華夏文化。同時，也積極與國內外單位合作辦理展覽，呈現博物館普世價值。

◆常設展

常設展覽最能呈現博物館藏品內容的廣度與系統性。本院收藏可追溯自新石器時代，歷經宋、元、明、清皇室收藏，藏品以皇室品味為主，質地精美，呈現歷代高品質的藝術成就。本院依材質、年代等主題規劃常設展。

「慈悲與智慧－宗教雕塑藝術」

佛教造像除傳達宗教信仰外，文物本身同時具有獨立的藝術價值。北魏的樸實稚拙，唐代的飽滿生動和宋代以後的親切平易，一方面展現不同時代的工藝水準，一方面說明造像主導者的美感訴求。因此，欣賞佛教造像，不僅能體驗其宗教的善，同時更能透過雕塑藝術，感受其普世之美。

「貴胄榮華－清代家具展」

本院收藏著一批主要來自清代恭親王府的紫檀木傢俱。紫檀自古就是名貴的木材種類，質地最堅；份量最沉，色澤或不如黃花梨那般華美亮麗，入眼卻是一種非常靜穆沉穩的感覺。而這些傢俱雖源自一處，其時代風格卻包含了從十七到十九世紀者，所以原本並非全然成套。但順應現代混搭的流行風，本展覽仍嘗試相互組配出分屬兩種環境的組合：一是熱鬧的起居之室；另為寧靜的文房之所，並且參考清代院畫中的場景，置入各色書畫、清玩及陳設器，讓本來失去了真實環境，而侷促在展櫃裡，角色變得有點模糊的文物，重新歸屬到原本的空間中。

「集瓊藻－院藏珍玩精華展」

「集瓊藻」是乾隆皇帝所藏一件多寶格的名稱，意指蒐羅眾多珍貴美好的物品。本院珍玩類藏品，多數源自宮廷生活用器。有的用於祭祀儀式，有的作外交饋贈用，有典禮中佩帶的裝身器，也有閨閣內堂梳妝品，有的是廳堂上的陳設或文房几案的用具、休閒把賞的巧玩，還有收納多寶玩器的箱匣等，無一不是設計巧妙、工藝精緻。至於其裝飾題材，不時地穿插歷史典故、民俗傳說、吉祥圖案，深刻浸潤於中國文化底蘊間，營造生活中的端莊、文雅與趣味。

「搏泥幻化－院藏陶瓷精華展」

本展覽乃根據本院典藏切入，觀察各個時期、各個窯口的不同釉彩變遷，及官樣裝飾在不同階段的發展。整個展覽依序分成「新石器至五代」、「宋至元」、「明」和「清」四個展區展出。「新石器至五代」呈現瓷器由原始到成熟的階段。宋金元時期則從生活美學的角度，來看各個窯口瓷器的裝飾與美感。明朝部分旨在陳述景德鎮御器廠的成立，燒造瓷器成為國家大事，而地方民窯亦與之競爭市場。清朝部分，呈現康雍乾三朝皇帝親自指揮御窯廠，官樣影響發揮至極致的現象；隨著國勢式微，終導致晚清的官樣作品混合著民間趣味。

「鐘鼎彝銘－漢字源流展」

古時「金」也泛指黃澄澄的銅，故銅器銘文又稱「金文」；銅禮樂器以鐘、鼎為首，故亦名「鐘鼎文」。在銅器上鑄銘文，以述功紀德、祀享於宗廟，藉以光宗耀祖、傳及子孫，既是真切的史料實錄，也是漢字發展史上的寶貴源頭。

「宗周鐘」是傳世西周天子——厲王胡自作器中最重要的樂器；「毛公鼎」則是西周宣王的叔父兼重臣——毛公所鑄禮器，鼎內鑄有舉世最長的彝銘。鐘銘 122 字、鼎鑄 500 字，二器合計 620 餘字的「鐘鼎文」，恰足作為探討漢字源流的題材。

「南北故宮 國寶薈萃」

為創造臺灣南北文化雙亮點，實現藝術均富的理念，北部院區正館 302 室與南部院區至寶廳，同時分別展出翠玉白菜、清乾隆金甌永固杯、玉燭長調燭臺、肉形石、越南青花猴王像、印度喀什米爾或喜馬查邦鄧瑪一大自在天等院藏品，以人氣國寶南北輝映，串聯藝術文化的動線。

「吉金耀采－院藏銅器精華展」

青銅文明，在鐘鼎彝器的「禮與樂」中讚揚；在立功祭祖的「祀與戎」中頌讚，在周人範鑄紀銘的「其命維新」與「郁郁周文」裡娓娓訴說；歷經東周繁華絢麗的新階段；到秦漢的統一，銅器雖逐步退出禮制的中心，卻轉化成為一種典型，更加的深入思想、文化的底蘊，而文化之美，即深藏在此一器一物之間，致廣大而盡精微，極高明而道中庸，讓觀眾整體認識銅器在商周貴族生活中的功用與文化底蘊。

「敬天格物－院藏玉器精華展」

近八千年的發展，玉雕具體地展現了華夏民族敬天法祖的宗教倫理，中世紀以後，形神兼備的寫實手法達於高峰，說明中國文化中重視格物致知的治學傳統。

展覽分「玉之靈」、「玉之德」、「玉之華」、「玉之巧」、「玉不琢不成器」、「玲瓏璀璨」等六單元，選展 400 餘件，「敬天格物」詮釋了中華民族玉文化之特性，也說明了中華古玉最深層的內涵。

「院藏清代歷史文書珍品」

本展覽將以往深藏大內的官書詔令、檔案奏摺、名臣傳記、檔冊輿圖等珍貴史料公諸於世，使觀眾對清代文書發展與面貌有更深入的認識，亦得從中瞭解大清王朝的政治祕辛、君臣關係、政經文化與朝代興衰。此外，臺灣位處中國大陸東南沿海，其地方政務與民瘼輿情素為清政府所重，因而留下許多官方文獻、奏摺輿圖、地方志書史料。本院因之規劃專區，精選展件，方便民眾藉由人、地、事、物的觀照，見證清代兩百餘年間對斯土斯民的關注。

「院藏善本古籍選粹」

本展覽題以院藏二十餘萬冊善本古籍、佛教經典以及輿圖版畫等珍本書冊為基礎，佈陳內容含「清宮藏書」及「訪舊蒐遺」兩大單元，復各分若干子題。前者旨在說明前清宮廷圖書庋藏與分佈概況，兼及其卷帙之浩繁、裝幀之考究；後者則以介紹故宮成立後不斷蒐購、徵集、獲贈之所得為要，其中不乏本院所欠闕，且深具文化學術價值者。此番展出之件皆為一時之選，觀眾置身其間，當可進一步認識院藏善本古籍的遞嬗過程及其文化意涵，以及中國傳統印刷技法與圖書裝幀之類型特色。

「看畫・讀畫－歷代名蹟選萃」

本展覽藉由人物、花卉翎毛、山水等畫科中的風格典範，與不同時代、不同流派的變革，來說明中國繪畫的發展脈絡。基於維護有機類材質文物的考量，每季均會更新展品內容。

「筆墨見真章－歷代書法選萃」

書法是漢文化圈特有的藝術，長久以來在中國文化傳統中蔚成體系，也自然應用在日常生活裡，了無古今隔閡。有關中國書法從古至今發展的歷程，是古今中外世人所關心的課題，本展即由此出發，揭示中華文化的書法藝術發展脈絡。基於維護有機類材質文物的考量，每季均會更新展品內容。

「受贈寄存名品展」

本院 108 年舉辦 3 次受贈寄存書畫展，概因近 50 年來社會各界人士陸續捐贈、寄存作品，為感念捐贈者之無私捐助，亦使大眾能欣賞新入藏文物之美，遂有相關展覽之規劃。共計選展居廉、高劍父、楊善深、黃君璧、林玉山、王壯為、傅狷夫、江兆申等近現代名家之作品，期盼未來各界人士持續共襄盛舉，以饗全民。

「巨幅名畫」

本院典藏歷代書畫名蹟之豐富性與藝術性，素為全球所稱譽。部分尺幅超大的作品，無法於一般展櫃中陳列，僅能藉由 202 室的挑高大陳列櫃中展出。歷年來「巨幅名畫」已經成為本院頗具特色的常設展，也是來院書畫藝術愛好者必看的展覽。

「認識亞洲－新媒體藝術展」

本展以立足臺灣、放眼亞洲為主軸，製作了「認識亞洲」、「印度文化圈」和「華夏文化圈」三部影片，以創新而精緻的詮釋，搭配先進科技的拍攝手法，細膩地呈現陳列室中各項展覽的藝術文化精品，讓觀眾貼近亞洲文明的深邃與遼闊。

「旭日初昇－嘉義史前文化展」


本院南部院區座落在嘉義，為了與地方聯繫，特別以院藏歷史文物及新媒體藝術手法策劃本展。故宮南院藉由國立自然科學博物館在嘉義魚寮、阿里山地區的考古發掘，看見嘉義早期生活的樣態和文明的發展，也讓包含嘉義縣定古物的球形豆、高腹圓罐等嘉義史前光輝，再次在大家眼前躍現。

「佛陀形影－院藏亞洲佛教藝術之美」

本展覽以泛亞洲的視野，向觀眾呈現佛教藝術在亞洲各地的豐富面貌。展覽在一件北印度秣菟羅 (Mathurā) 地區的佛塔欄楯作為開場，分為「誕生的喜悅」、「佛陀的智慧」、「菩薩的慈悲」、「經藏的流轉」與「密教的神奇」等五單元展出，其中第四單元展出本院重要典藏康熙八年《龍藏經》。

「穿上亞洲－織物的交流與想像」

本展覽以院藏亞洲織品服飾，包括東亞文化圈、東南亞文化圈、及中西亞文化圈的織物。介紹不同文化圈的織物及服飾特色，並進一步探討貿易交流下織物的跨域交流與想像。另設一展覽簡介教育推廣區域以深入淺出的方式介紹織物技法。

「玉見亞洲 - 院藏玉器展」

本院所藏亞洲玉器主要來自清宮舊藏，不但光彩奪目、精緻絕倫，為宮廷文化帶來了異域風尚，也豐富了傳統的玉器工藝技術，這些作品的製作時間軸橫跨十五至十九世紀，空間軸指向昔日蒙兀兒帝國、印度土邦、鄂圖曼土耳其帝國等地以及中亞東部的新疆，希冀能更清晰呈現各地不同風土下的玉器風貌。

「芳茗遠播 - 亞洲茶文化展」

本展覽共分為「茶鄉 - 中華茶文化」、「茶道 - 日本茶文化」、「茶趣 - 臺灣工夫茶」等三單元，展出院藏茶文化相關文物，呈現各區域特有的品茗方式與文化；並藉由明代茶寮、日本茶室及現代茶席等情境空間展示，營造出不同時空飲茶的特有氛圍，帶領觀眾認識茶在亞洲的傳播與交流，如何發展出各具特色又相互融通的茶文化。

◆ 年度特展

特展屬本院典藏單位研究成果展，能深入呈現策展同仁之研究心得。

「適於心 - 明代永樂皇帝的瓷器」

本院典藏的傳世永樂瓷器，質量俱精，本次展覽特別精選一百件左右的作品，分為三個單元。第一單元「內府燒造」，呈現永樂時期瓷器的性質、面貌及特色。第二單元「對外交流」展現瓷器上所見與西藏以及中西亞文化交流的軌跡，第三單元「承襲與模仿」，呈現明代永樂、宣德時期的瓷器在清代康熙、雍正、乾隆時期的仿作，希望透過本次展覽，參觀者能從中看到傳世永樂官方用瓷的時代面貌及文化意涵。

「紫砂風潮 - 傳世器及其他」

此次展覽以「紫砂風潮」為題，分成四個單元依序展出相關器類。第一單元「皇家茶器」，展出珍稀罕見的宜興胎畫琺瑯茶器。第二單元「魅力琺瑯彩」，則藉由盜胎、金屬胎、玻璃胎畫琺瑯等文物，說明宜興胎畫琺瑯茶器製作背景存在的工藝與文化交流面向。第三單元「宜興・歐窯與廣窯」，旨在透過傳世定為宜興窯的作品，呈現古今理解宜興窯產品的轉變。第四單元「茶・饗宴」依據本院典藏品，規畫一個帝王專屬茶席，想像清宮茗事可能的樣貌。

「天香茄楠 - 香玩文化特展」

本展覽分成兩部分，一是「香之道」，通過本院所收藏的宮廷茄楠沉香，看過去的日子裡，稀有的沉香是如何被珍藏、穿戴及薰燃品玩，故分為「收藏陳設」、「隨身佩飾」、「品香香具」三個單元，以了解古人是如何使用這種價比金高的香中鑽石，讓生活更有味道。二為「香之味」，看今日除收藏、佩戴外，過去數十年來，臺灣復興了品香文化。以品香為主，發展出完整的香席器用，藉由展出「香具藝術」與「品香空間」二單元，讓這些優秀的創作來說明現代人如何玩香，同時傳遞著屬於現代人生活的美感。


「寶幻之間 - 院藏戰國至漢代玉器特展」

此次展覽共展出戰國至漢代精選玉器 212 件，不僅呈現此時代璀璨紛呈的藝術美感，也足以說明這個時代的玉器故事。戰國至漢代玉器追求動態錯覺的目標儘管一致，身形也依循相同的蜿蜒體態，但作品的錯覺效果卻截然不同，如戰國玉龍是足爪錯置、動靜互見的平面形式，而漢代玉獸則為身形扭轉、張馳各異的立體形態。為了探明這些問題，展覽共分「動感十足的玉器時代」、「戰國至漢代玉器的藝術風格」、「感知世界與物理世界的對話」、「引人入勝的錯覺藝術」四個單元來理解。

「亞洲探險記 - 十七世紀東西交流傳奇」

本展覽以荷使出行成功觀見大清皇帝的旅程，作為敘事切入的視角，並且精選本院和荷蘭阿姆斯特丹國家博物館、日本海杜美術館、大阪市立東洋陶磁美術館、臺南市政府文化局、國立臺灣大學圖書館、藝術史研究所等合作單位的館藏，共同呈現一段迴盪於東西之間的交流故事。

本展覽分成四個單元，序幕「行旅足跡」 - 展示荷使旅程所見相關紀錄與物件。第二單元「異國奇珍」 - 展現兩個端點的人們對異國充滿期待與想像，促使具有東方風格或看起來像是西方情調的物品，競相湧現。第三單元「東方風情」 - 儘管十七世紀的時空背景下，觸手可及外來文化的衝擊，然而明朝皇帝仍然一如往昔地祭祖謁陵，而隱身於書齋中的文人，亦暢所欲言談個人品味。最後「寰宇交會」單元 - 則以同時混融東西特色的裝飾風格，如瓷器上的裝飾紋樣，蘇州版畫和世界地圖中

的轉譯手法，重建十七世紀的世界觀，以及東西交會影響下的藝術與文化。

「小時代的日常—一個十七世紀的生活提案」

這個展覽訴說的小時代是指十七世紀，那是一個有趣，並且充滿各種可能性的時期。以現代物質文化研究來看，既可從東西交流的角度，一窺當時探險家跋山涉水開拓航道的故事，也能從江南視線瞭解文人世家看似平淡，其實分外講究質感，別有一番趣味的日常。此次通過十七世紀的小資文青文震亨（1586-1645）書寫《長物志》歸類而出的「書畫」和「器具」兩個章節作為策展基礎，除了重新發掘博物館藏品蘊含的人文脈絡之外，也探索古人游賞於物的點滴細節，從中梳理與之相關的交遊網絡，以及賞古風逐漸影響一般居家日用的面向。嘗試從古人處理身外之物的態度，回看現代的人與物的關係。

「皇帝的多寶格」

所謂多寶格可以理解成是一種文物的組合，而「皇帝的多寶格」展顧名思義展出清宮傳世經過皇帝降旨處理過的一組組文物。雖然聚集文物使之成組的構想，並非帝王專利。但是由於國立故宮博物院藏品的組成，有一大部分來自於清宮舊藏，且其中充滿著歷代皇帝的鑑賞痕跡，兼且對照清宮檔案，也得以追溯出多數文物重裝、成組於清乾隆朝（1736-1795）。故展覽又將聚焦於乾隆皇帝，看他如何在前朝既有的文物整理與組裝基礎上，進一步發揮創意，讓清宮文物的收納與陳設顯得更為井然有序。

「古人掌中書—院藏巾箱本特展」

今人所稱的袖珍書、口袋書或掌中書，即古時的「巾箱本」，其外型小巧細緻，攜帶方便，深受古今社會民眾喜愛與收藏。古代袖珍書內容廣泛，包括商人旅行書、考生挾帶書、學子經書詩文，以及通俗小說、醫書等，兼具裝飾性與實用性。時至今日，袖珍小冊仍為大眾愛不釋手的隨身讀物。觀眾透過院藏袖珍本特展，當能以古證今，目睹圖書演變史。

本展覽旨在呈現巾箱本的淵源歷史、裝幀形式、開本尺寸與內容差異，計分為「巾箱本五經」、「古人展書讀」、「皇家藏袖珍」，以及「大書配小書」、「巾箱走四方」五單元。另外，此次特別規劃教育推廣區，分別展出借自國家圖書館典藏國內私人藏家寄存的西洋袖珍本，以及黃震南先生所藏臺灣早期袖珍圖書，和當代袖珍書。

觀眾透過展覽，不僅可瞭解古人藏書於箱籤的文化背景，兼亦想見其行旅坐臥書必隨身，或展卷誦讀，或把玩賞鑒的文化現象。尤有進者，觀眾於欣賞文物之際，亦得以古證今，目睹袖珍本在圖書發展歷程中所展現的不同面貌。

「壽而康：院藏醫藥圖書文物特展」

本展覽分成「人之始生」、「身體的透視」、「面對疾病」、「外證治療」、「本草與醫方」、「宗教與醫療」、「養生與延壽」、「國家與醫療」等八個單元，透過院藏醫藥圖書、文獻及相關歷史文物，從人之生命史的角度切入，展示人類、疾病、醫藥與養生之道彼此間在歷史上的互動。

透過本特展，期能引領觀眾進入古人疾病、醫藥與養生的世界，同時藉此反思現代社會的疾病與醫療觀，進而喚醒大家對健康議題的重視。並希冀透過古籍文獻文物與多媒體製作；使參觀民眾得以更深入瞭解本院醫藥圖書文物之價值。

「來禽圖－翎毛與花果的和諧奏鳴」

古代畫家習慣將禽鳥稱為「翎毛」，國立故宮博物院典藏有超過兩千件以上，以翎毛為描繪對象的古畫。「來禽圖」特展，共遴選卅一組件，分別於 202 及 212 陳列展出。作品時代囊括宋、元、明、清至近代，型態可區分為「果熟來禽」與「鳥語花香」兩類。展出同時，並會搭配禽鳥的寫真照片一併陳列，觀眾可以透過繪畫與照片的詳細比對，具體理解歷代畫家對於禽鳥生態縝密的觀察力，以及當想要突破形似侷限時，如何藉助筆墨與萬物對話，來抒發內心情感的創作力。

「巨匠的剪影－張大千 120 歲紀念大展」

大千先生的畫藝深受石濤（1642-1707）和八大山人（1626-1705）影響，並溯源至隋唐、北魏，長年沉浸於古代諸名家，盡收傳統筆墨技法之精髓，從山水到人物、花鳥、畜獸等，各種畫科無一不臻妙境。熱衷於古書畫的研究學習，讓他成為重要的鑑賞家，對繪畫史也有精闢見解。晚年發展出氣勢撼人的潑墨潑彩畫風，開拓水墨新境界，成為標誌性的代表。書法兼擅諸體，善於臨仿不同書風，更融合成奇肆雄強的鮮明書風，與其精妙畫風相得益彰。長達六十多年的畫齡，加上勤於創作，傳世作品數量空前龐大，為世人留下可觀的文化資產。大千先生與國立故宮博物院關係匪淺，身後將他珍藏之書畫及用印遺贈予本院典藏，同時也將居所摩耶精舍捐出成立紀念館，由本院代為管理。

108 年適逢張大千一百二十歲生日，特從本院豐富典藏及國立歷史博物館寄存之作品中，精選出書畫精品、印章與珍貴照片，具體反映大千先生早、中、晚不同時期的藝術特色與精神，讓觀眾重睹其精采絕倫的藝術傳奇與大師風采。


「以文會友－雅集圖特展」

雅集是古代文人的派對形式之一，舉辦聚會的理由各式各樣，規模亦可大可小。在雅集活動裡，主人與賓客除了享用精緻美味的佳餚，也會有吟詩、鼓琴、對弈、觀畫、品茗等助興活動，更不用說宴會上即席揮毫、題詠等具紀念性質的副產品產出。宴集上文人之間相互激盪與較勁，因此雅集亦可說是文化力的孕育搖籃。雅集圖不僅是聚會之後的圖像紀錄方式，也是對前人盛會景況的追摹想像，經由畫家的巧手，使之具象化，甚至加入新的表現元素。流轉於不同時空的雅集圖，也因此有了新的生命。本次展覽以「晉唐風流」、「雅集典範」、「想像雅集」、「亂世唱和」、「慶生為名」、「皇權宴會」六個單元向觀眾介紹這些歷史上著名的雅集盛事。其中也會穿插一些趣味小品，呈現文人缺乏靈感的狀態。

「名山鉅作－張大千廬山圖特展」

〈廬山圖〉不僅是張大千（1899-1983）晚年的潑墨潑彩傑作，更是存世最大的整絹繪畫，108 年 2 月由文化部正式核定為國寶。

張大千本名爰，籍貫四川內江。早年即銳意專研五代迄清的歷代名跡，奠定傳統書畫根基。抗戰期間（1941-1943）復前往敦煌臨摹唐宋壁畫，歷時 2 年 7 個月，自此畫風日趨恢弘瑰麗。50 歲後卜居海外，履蹤遍涉歐美諸國，閱歷既廣，更能兼融中西，在傳統筆墨基礎上，另創潑墨、潑彩的新格局，成就了後期藝術的典型風格。79 歲由美國返臺，築室臺北外雙溪摩耶精舍。雖體力漸趨羸弱，猶堅持作畫不輟，甚至勇於挑戰自我極限。縱 178.5 公分、橫 994.6 公分的〈廬山圖〉（1981-1983）即為其最後的精彩鉅製。此作雖非出自對景寫生，但凝聚了大千畢生的畫藝精粹，筆墨縱橫排盪，並融合潑彩大寫意法，畫面布局宏偉，吞吐著極其撼人的氣勢。

「圓滿—〈青花柳葉鳥紋盤〉修復成果特展」

106年7月18日的早晨，當南部院區博物館管理員進行例行開館巡檢時，驚覺「揚帆萬里—日本伊萬里瓷器特展」展廳內展品〈青花柳葉鳥紋盤〉受損並脫離支架。本院組成修復團隊檢測盤體、分析數據，做科學化的驗證，解明其自然崩壞原因，並以日方指定的「金繕」方式進行修補；「金繕」是日本傳統的技法，也蘊含著作品的新歷史以及兩館友好的美麗記憶。黏合、描漆與敷金，每一個過程，團隊都竭盡心力；修護後的瓷盤，綴上了美麗的金線；盤體中央呈現出如英文字母「Y」狀的修補痕，宛若金色的生命線，讓將近四百歲的〈青花柳葉鳥紋盤〉獲得了新生。

「赤壁與三國群英形象特展」

本展以赤壁及三國群英為題，精選鄭問筆下之三國主題漫畫原稿，結合院藏相關主題精品，敘說一場驚心動魄的戰爭，成就傳唱千百年的歷史。展覽包含關於三國主題的弩機、銅印、繪畫、書法、拓片、刻本等珍貴故宮藏品，並包括日本江戶時期浮世繪與葛飾北齋《北齋漫畫》及臺灣漫畫家鄭問的創作原稿等展品。本展覽不只說明「赤壁」主題跨越時空、地域影響至今，更空前擘畫古代文物及當代藝術的精采對話。



「占婆的微笑—越南林迦罩特展」

林迦的梵文之意為「標誌」，濕婆神廟的中心聖龕中往往立著林迦，說明林迦崇拜在印度教濕婆派中占有中心地位。這件作品不僅體現占婆王朝美學，同時見證皇權中印度教濕婆信仰的一個特殊面相。就目前已公布的資訊，包含此件，越南境內僅存兩件；全世界各公、私收藏總計不到20件，多數僅存頭像，或罩體已殘破。本院此件罩體相對完整，更顯珍貴。

「泥土的座標—院藏陶瓷展」

本次展覽以東亞陶瓷為主題，以本院豐富多元的收藏為基礎，從清代盛世康熙、雍正、乾隆三朝官窯瓷器作為開端，呈現中國陶瓷製作技術、資源、經驗與能量皆燦然大備的巔峰，接續再以釉色、紋飾、器形等要素，盤點中國與周邊各國家陶瓷文化的交流與交融。續依風格特色，分列越南、泰國、柬埔寨、緬甸與韓、日等地域單元，精選代表性文物，呈現東亞各地瓷器競起的樣貌，進而述及文化交流議題，讓泥土的座標妝點出東亞陶瓷文化的華麗大觀。

「蔡牽與王得祿特展」

今天嘉義太保市之名，因為清代臺灣首位獲得太子太保封銜的王得祿（1770—1842）而來。嘉義人王得祿，是清代臺灣籍最高武官，嘉慶年間投身水師，護送冊封琉球國王特使，也打擊海上勢力，步步晉升到從一品提督。本展結合院藏清代檔案、奏摺，搭配地方傳說和藏於民間的畫像、袍服、誥命以及臺灣各宮廟收藏有關贈匾，整合官方與地方資料，藉由民間梟雄蔡牽與官方提督王得祿的海上對決，闡述19世紀臺海間的海洋史，展開歷史人物、事件的多元詮釋。

「人氣國寶展」

為了讓南部觀眾更有機會親近本院名品，南部院區特闢至寶廳選件展陳人氣國寶。首展推出肉形石，其與翠玉白菜同列故宮巧雕名品。此塊肉形石的質地為不透明的玉髓，工匠掌握此塊玉層層堆疊的紋理特性加工，在其上鑽孔製造毛孔的效果，並將最上層染成紅褐色，使之看來像浸過醬油的肉皮般的鮮嫩多汁，工匠的巧藝使一方冰冷的玉石化為令人垂涎的「東坡肉」，逼真工藝技術令人讚嘆。

「薩瓦蒂泰—故宮泰文化特展」

「薩瓦蒂」取泰文 Sawasdee 吉祥美好之音譯。本次展覽全面盤點故宮院藏所有泰國相關文物，包含數百年來暹羅與中國來往的外交文件、記載暹羅國歷史的善本古籍、宗教雕塑、外銷陶瓷器、絲織品等近百件文物，介紹予臺灣觀眾。並藉由泰國暹羅博物館、泰國貿易經濟辦事處、財團法人成陽藝術文化基金會、國立政治大學歷史學系及臺灣新住民團體的支持與協助下促成，期透過本展引領觀眾在觀光旅遊之外，更深入認識精彩的泰文化歷史與藝術內涵。

「四海名物：國立故宮博物院新入藏亞洲文物精選」

對今日的人們而言，「旅行」已成了生活中相當重要的部分；在歷史上，各樣的旅行包含了商貿、宗教傳播、朝聖、使節往返甚至戰爭與民族遷徙，促成了亞洲各區域古文明間以及與亞洲之外的歐洲、非洲間的聯繫。本展覽藉由 12 個旅行者的故事帶出，呈現故宮近年來在文物購藏方面的成果。以全亞洲的視野，範圍包含東亞、東南亞、南亞、中西亞、喜瑪拉雅等各區域；材質則有銅、瓷、漆、木、織品、平面繪畫等，其中有近 30 件文物為入藏後首度公開展出。

「奇幻嘉年華：21 世紀博物館特展」

「狂歡節」(Carnival，亦翻譯嘉年華)源自於中世紀的街頭狂歡，象徵一種大眾感官的愉悅展演與解放。本展覽中以「奇幻」為字眼，以「奇」字象徵美術館物質文明的珍奇，「幻」字則意指科技世界下的虛擬幻境，以故宮既有之新媒體藝術展件策劃的純虛擬藝術展，並首度邀集羅浮宮、橘園美術館、泰特現代美術館、柏林舊國家畫廊、慕夏基金會等近年製作的虛擬實境展件，開啟一場遊走奇幻景觀與文化解放的狂歡節。

配合「2018 臺中世界花卉博覽會」行銷

1. 花之禮讚—四大美術館聯合大展

本院配合「2018 年臺中世界花卉博覽會」，特別規劃與東京富士美術館、奇美博物館與國立臺灣美術館共同合作主辦「花之禮讚—四大美術館聯合大展」，於臺中國立臺灣美術館展出。透過跨國交流與館際之間的合作，企圖展現臺灣、華夏、日本與西洋四種不同文化脈絡的世界觀與價值觀。

本展覽榮獲《藝術家》雜誌「十大公辦好展覽」第九名。

2. 「花事・閑情—品味花器與生活」特展

於南部院區舉辦「花事・閑情—品味花器與生活特展」，以「花事・閑情」為題，呼喚人與花的千古情緣。此外，臺灣早期花器兼融中國花藝、日本花道及本土工藝，形成獨具特色的臺灣花器，頗有可觀之處，展覽特闢單元，觀眾可一睹臺灣本土花器的風采。展覽亦透過新媒體創造的超現實花園「月影梅」，邀請觀者進入花器的奇幻世界，體驗科技與藝術完美融合的絕妙意境。

3. 故宮花蝶館—新媒體藝術展

近年來致力結合人文歷史與科技創新應用，以藝術與科技跨域之多重視野，著重於數位藝術教育之推廣，本院為響應「2018 年臺中世界花卉博覽會」，特別規劃建置「故宮花蝶館」，以臺中當地之花、馬主題特色、園區「生態・Nature・自然共生」核心價值為發想，將故宮本院典藏重要文物，轉化為新媒體藝術，並融合教育推廣面向，打造全新沉浸式美學體驗場域。

◆與院外機構合作辦理特展

北部院區「悠遊風景繪畫—俄羅斯普希金博物館特展」

本展由聯合數位文創公司向本院提案申請，以俄羅斯普希金博物館世界著名的法國 19 世紀風景繪畫為主題，精選 17 世紀至 20 世紀名家如巴洛克派的法國風景名家克勞德・洛罕、洛可可派大師布雪、巴比松派的柯洛、印象派的雷諾瓦、塞尚、盧梭、高更等 48 位重量級藝術大師共 65 件作品。展覽以「近代風景繪畫的起源」、「讚頌大自然」、「巴黎城市光影」、「巴黎近郊的自然景致」、「南法明媚風光」及「海外的異想世界」為主題，引領民眾認識法國近代風景繪畫。

北部院區「故宮動物園」

本展為國立故宮博物院第一次針對國小兒童舉辦之特展，也是本院首度與國內「三園一館」，包括臺北市立動物園、新竹市立動物園、高雄市壽山動物園與屏東國立海洋生物博物館共同合作。展場內陳列著各式各樣的動物圖畫，一一秀出各種蟲、魚、鳥、獸，滿足大家在視覺、觸覺、聽覺和嗅覺上的不同感受。畫作旁搭配真實動物的照片，讓小朋友馬上就能分出圖畫和真實動物的差別。「三園一館」分別提供了園(館)史的資料和動物的聲音影像檔，對於畫作所繪物種的判別提供了專業上的意見，讓大小朋友得對各園(館)有了基本的認識之外，對於古今動物的差別也能獲得正確且即時的識別效益，從中埋下「文資保存」、「生態保育」與「動物福利」的種籽，進而思考生活中博物館和動物園存在的意義和價值。

南部院區「交融之美—神戶市立博物館精品展」

從臺灣所在的東亞海域出發，全面地呈現大航海時期以來，東亞海域周邊地區在多方相會下所發生的文化撞擊與交流。為了說明這段精彩的故事，本展特別借重神戶市立博物館的精品，另精選故宮典藏文物及荷蘭國家博物館、荷蘭臺夫特王子博物館及國立臺灣歷史博物館的收藏，為觀眾講述一段 16 至 19 世紀歐亞藝術的奇遇與交融。陣容可說是神戶市立博物館在海外亞洲最具規模的一次展出。

南部院區「法國凱布朗利博物館面具精品展」

本展覽以法國凱布朗利博物館百餘件造型豐富多樣的面具為基礎，在材質和形式上，具有相當程度的豐富性，揭示出世界各地的文化，如何透過充滿創意造形的面具，形塑心目中的神靈與靈魂的形象。其中亞洲面具涵蓋日本、韓國、印度、泰國、印尼、越南等戲劇儀式用面具，透過這些面具可瞭解亞洲地區流傳悠久的史詩與戲劇。本展希望提供觀者欣賞並瞭解來自世界各地豐富多元的文化，並體驗這些面具的非凡創造力之美。

參加國際博物館協會 (ICOM) 2019 年年會大展

國際博物館協會三年一度大會於 108 年 9 月 1 日至 7 日於京都國際會館盛大召開，年會期間故宮以「東方博物之美」(Reinterpreting Tradition) 為展覽主題，呈現故宮近年來所累積的數位轉化成果，依據官方網頁統計，本次大會會議計有來自 141 個國家，多達 3,000 名各委員會會員出席盛會，展場空間設計以故宮形象與氛圍為基調，展覽內容以多年來的數位科技轉化成果為主，以 VR 互動裝置、AR 虛擬畫瓶花、8K 數位影片等為敘事策略，傳遞「博物館作為文化樞紐 - 傳統的未來」可能性，影片精選以故宮近幾年經典作品，在展期間搭配代表臺灣文化特色體驗活動，開啟從文物內涵延伸的深度體驗模式，展現故宮在多元數位化先驅的引領趨勢，成功吸引來自世界各地的博物館專業會員，達成國際行銷目標。

Exhibitions and Exchanges

The NPM curates permanent and special exhibitions on painting and calligraphy, bronzes, ceramics, jades, lacquer wares, sculptures, rare books, and historical documents. Exhibitions are accompanied by catalogues, guidebooks, and pamphlets, offering visitors an overview of the rich and vibrant nature of Chinese art and culture. The NPM also actively promotes exchange exhibitions with local and international museums, connecting the NPM with the rest of the world and allowing it to express its universal values as a museum.

◆ Permanent Exhibitions

Permanent exhibitions best display the breadth and systemization of the museum's collection. The NPM houses artifacts dating back to the Neolithic Age along with works from the imperial collections of the last four Chinese dynasties—the Song, Yuan, Ming, and Qing. The collection represents imperial aesthetic tastes as well as the beauty and refinement of past artistic achievements. The NPM curates permanent exhibitions according to medium, time period, and theme.

Compassion and Wisdom: Religious Sculptural Arts

Besides the religious content of Buddhist sculptures, these objects also possess their independent artistic merit. Northern Wei sculptures tend to be modest and simple. Tang sculptures are often rotund and lively. Starting from the Song era, sculptures became more closely associated with ordinary people. In addition to revealing the technical development of each period, they also reflect their own standards of beauty. Thus, appreciating religious sculpture not only imparts ideological ideals, but also conveys universal concepts of beauty.

Splendors of Qing Furniture

The collection of the National Palace Museum includes a set of red sandalwood furniture originating principally from the imperial residence of Prince Gong. Red sandalwood has always been valued for its hardness and density. Though not as brilliant or beautiful as rosewood in terms of color, red sandalwood nonetheless imparts a sense of serenity and stability. Though these pieces of furniture derive from the same source, they were not originally from the same set, the styles actually ranging from the 17th to 19th centuries. However, much attuned to the modern taste of mixing and matching styles together, this exhibition is an attempt to construct two complementary sets of furniture arrangement: one for the more active setting of a living room and the other for the quietude of the scholar's studio. Consulting scenes of Qing dynasty life depicted in imperial paintings, various pieces of painting and calligraphy, curios, and display objects have been included here to provide a more accurate reconstruction of a room at the time. With these objects, whose original meaning may be obscured by placing them alone behind glass walls in display cases, we can rediscover their original setting within the simulated time and place seen here.

A Garland of Treasures: Masterpieces of Precious Crafts in the Museum Collection

“A Garland of Treasures” is the title given in the Qing dynasty by the Qianlong emperor to a curio box in his collection. As the name suggests, it means a group of small but precious artifacts. The collection of precious crafts in the National Palace Museum mostly derives from items used in daily life at the imperial court. Some were ritual objects and others diplomatic gifts. There are accessories that were used for ceremonial purposes, while others formed part of the dress and make-up for those living in the ladies' quarters. Some crafts were displayed in palace halls, served as curios to be appreciated at leisure, or were found in the scholar's studio. Others are also rare collectibles stored in chests that were all specially designed and marvelously produced. As for the subjects to decorate them, they often interweave auspicious patterns, folk legends, and historical allusions, being profoundly steeped in the essence of Chinese culture to create a sense of dignity, elegance, and delight in life.

The Magic of Kneaded Clay: Ceramic Collection of the National Palace Museum

This exhibition illustrates the history of Chinese ceramics based on the collection of the National Palace Museum. From the perspective of various glaze colors, it is possible to see how glazes evolved at different kilns and periods as well as how official models of decoration formed over time. The exhibition is divided into four sections: “Neolithic Age to the Five Dynasties,” “Song to Yuan Dynasties,” “Ming Dynasty,” and “Qing Dynasty.” “Neolithic Age to the Five Dynasties” represents a long period of time when ceramics evolved from simplistic beginnings to a more sophisticated stage. Using the perspective of daily aesthetics, “Song to Yuan Dynasties” explores the decoration and beauty of various wares from different kilns. The “Ming Dynasty” section narrates the establishment of the Jingdezhen imperial kilns, as porcelain production became a state affair and local civilian kilns competed for market share. The “Qing Dynasty” section shows how three emperors, Kangxi, Yongzheng, and Qianlong, personally gave orders for the imperial kilns, the influence of official models reaching a peak at that time. As the dynasty began to decline, the styles of folk art began to creep into late Qing imperial wares.

The Bell and Cauldron Inscriptions--A Feast of Chinese Characters: the Origin and Development

Newly-cast bronzes shine like gold, so the ancients sometimes referred to them as *jin* (golden). In epigraphy, the words cast or engraved on bronzes are called *jinwen* (Golden Script), or *zhongding wen* (Bell and Cauldron Script). These vessels were commissioned to commemorate notable accomplishments or great merits. They could also be used to offer memorial sacrifices in family shrines in order to honor ancestors and to pass them down to future generations. Today, the accompanying inscriptions are not only primary sources but also valuable resources for understanding the subsequent development of Chinese characters. The *Zong Zhou Zhong* (Bell of Zhou) is the most important musical instrument commissioned by King Li of the Western Zhou. The *Mao Gong Ding* (Cauldron of Duke Mao) was commissioned by an important high official named the Duke of Mao, who was also the uncle of King Xuan, and carries the longest bronze text known in existence. The Bell is engraved with 122 characters and the Cauldron is engraved with 500 characters. The combined 620 plus characters of these two noble vessels provide sufficient context and clues to explore possible origins.

A Gathering of Treasures in the National Palace Museum North and South

To ensure equality in the richness of artifacts and establish the two NPM branches as shining attractions in the North and South, a collection of treasured artifacts is exhibited in both branches of the museum in order to establish a thread of art and culture across Taiwan. The artifacts include the “Jadeite Cabbage,” “Gold Chalice of Eternal Stability,” “Jade Candlestick of Constant Harmony,” “Meat-Shaped Stone,” “Hanuman Figure in Underglaze Blue and Overglaze Colors” from Vietnam, and the “Uma-Mahesvara: Kashmir or Himachal Pradesh” from India.

Rituals Cast in Brilliance: Masterpieces of Bronzes in the Museum Collection

The Bronze Age is celebrated in “Rites and Music” with bells and cauldrons; in “Worship and Warfare” for honoring ancestors; and in the Zhou's “Newly Endowed Mandate” and “Elaborate Textual Repertoire.” The Bronze Age progressed through the splendors of the Eastern Zhou period all the way to the ultimate unification of China under the Qin and Han Dynasties. Bronze gradually yielded its central role in the ritual system but transformed into a cultural legacy, both imbued with and manifesting the essence of thought and culture. It is found within each object: extensive and elaborate, profound yet moderate. These bronze items allow visitors to comprehensively learn about the function and cultural significance of bronze vessels used in the daily lives of the noble classes of the Shang and Zhou Dynasties.

Art in Quest of Heaven and Truth: Masterpieces of Jades in the Museum Collection

Over nearly eight millennium of development, jade carvings have embodied Chinese belief and ethics that were in awe of heaven and revered ancestors. Later, art that pursued realism in both form and spirit peaked after the medieval period in China, manifesting in the academic heritage of Chinese scholars seeking out the intrinsic nature of things. The exhibition is divided into six sections: “The Spirit of Jade,” “The Virtue of Jade,” “The Blossoms of Jade,” “The Ingenuity of Jade Carvings,” “Selection: Jade without Grinding is of No Use,” and “Dazzling Gemstones and Jewelry.” Through more than 400 items, “Art in Quest of Heaven and Truth” conveys the uniqueness of Chinese jade culture and expresses the deeper meaning of ancient Chinese jades.

Treasures from the National Palace Museum’s Collection of Qing Dynasty Historical Documents

This exhibition makes public archives that were once guarded in the imperial palace and kept strictly out of bounds. Imperial decrees, official documents, palace memorials, biographies of eminent officials, maps, and illustrations all help visitors garner an understanding of the development of official documentation during the Qing dynasty. In addition, they offer a glimpse into how the Qing government was administered, the secrets of court life, and the relationship between emperors and their officials, the politico-economic and cultural landscapes, and the rise and fall of the dynasty. The exhibition also features a dedicated section for archives relating to Taiwan. During the Qing dynasty, the local affairs and living conditions of people on the island off the southeast coast of China were a focus of the court’s attention, and thus many official documents, memorials, maps, and local gazetteers were produced. The selected items in this section offer visitors an overview of the people, places, affairs, and products of Taiwan as documented during the Qing dynasty, providing testimony to the Qing court’s management of Taiwan over a span of more than two hundred years.

Gems from the National Palace Museum’s Collection of Rare and Antiquarian Books

Based on the more than 200,000 volumes of rare and antiquarian books, Buddhist scriptures, cartographic materials, and prints, the exhibition is divided into two sections, each containing several segments. The first, “The Qing Imperial Libraries,” sheds light on the distribution of texts in the Qing palace, the size of the collections, the types of books collected, and the exquisiteness of their binding and decoration. The second section, “The Continued Quest for Books Rare and Antiquarian,” illustrates how the National Palace Museum has continued to broaden the scope of the collection since its founding by making acquisitions and receiving donations and bequeathals, many of which have high cultural and academic value and complement existing holdings. The works on view in this exhibition are some of the most precious gems in the collection. They offer the visitor a glimpse into the history and provenance of the rare and antiquarian titles, their cultural significance, and the characteristics and techniques of traditional Chinese printing and book binding.

A Closer Look at Chinese Painting: Selected Works from the Ages in the Museum Collection

This exhibition illustrates the development of Chinese painting through the styles and traditions of figure, flower, and landscape paintings, and through the changes of different eras and schools. In consideration of maintaining and preserving the fragile materials of these works, the contents of the exhibit are rotated every season.

The Expressive Significance of Brush and Ink: Selections from the History of Chinese Calligraphy

Calligraphy is a special art form within Han Chinese cultural circles. It has long formed a systematic structure within Chinese cultural tradition, and it is naturally applied in daily life. The history of Chinese calligraphy, from ancient times to the present, is a topic of concern both at home and abroad. This exhibition is based on this concern and reveals the development of Chinese culture. In consideration of preserving the fragile materials of the works, the contents of the exhibit are rotated every season.

Famous Paintings Donated and Entrusted to the National Palace Museum

The National Palace Museum has remained passionately devoted to expanding its collection ever since its establishment in the 54th year of the Republic of China (1965). This exhibition showcases a rotating selection of works donated to the NPM over the years. Due to the conservation requirements of paintings and calligraphy, in addition to limited exhibition space, it is not possible to permanently display all donations.

The NPM hopes the seasonal selections will encourage further research, promote gift giving, and entice the general public to enjoy these cultural treasures. The museum offers its deepest gratitude to the donors who allowed these works to emerge into the public light. At the same time, the NPM looks forward to people of all backgrounds assisting in ensuring that the museum remains one of humanity's most prized and shared possessions.

Oversize Scrolls of Painting and Calligraphy

The richness and artistry of the NPM's collection of paintings and calligraphy is known world-wide. Some oversized works cannot be exhibited in general display cases and can only be shown in the oversized cases of Gallery 202. Over the years, the museum's display of oversized paintings and calligraphy has become a distinctive permanent exhibition and a must-see for lovers of Chinese art.

Multimedia Gallery Guide: Understanding Asian Art

This gallery uses Taiwan as a foothold for gaining a perspective of Asia as a whole. The NPM produced three films for this exhibition: "Getting to Know the Art of Asia," "The Cultural Sphere of India," and "The Cultural Sphere of China." Together, they offer an innovative and fascinating approach using the latest video technology. The films present in detail the precious artworks and cultural artifacts on display in the various galleries, allowing audiences to gain both a deeper and wider appreciation of Asian civilization.

The Beginning: A Look at Chiayi's Prehistoric Cultures

The Southern Branch of the NPM is located in Chiayi. In order to connect with the local area, this exhibition is specially planned with historical relics and new media art techniques. Utilizing the archaeological excavations of the National Museum of Natural Science in the Yuliao and Alishan areas of Chiayi, the National Palace Museum shows the early lifestyle of people in Chiayi and the development of civilization. The exhibition includes artifacts from Chiayi County such as a spherical dou vessel and high-bellied urn, allowing the prehistoric glory of Chiayi to emerge once again.

Imprints of Buddhas: the Buddhist Art in the National Palace Museum Collection

This exhibition presents the richness of Buddhist art across Asia to expose viewers to the diversity of pan-Asian Buddhist artistic practices. The exhibition opens with a stupa railing from the Mathurā region of North India. The exhibit is divided into five themes: "The Joy of Birth," "The Wisdom of the Buddha," "The Compassion of the Bodhisattva," "Transmission and Transformation of the Buddhist Scriptures," and "The Mystery of Esoteric Buddhism." Among the exhibited works is the "Kangxi Manuscript Kangyur in Tibetan Script," an important part of the NPM collection completed in 1669.

Wearing Asia--The Exchange and Creation of Textiles

This exhibition presents Asian textiles in the National Palace Museum's collection, including fabrics from East Asia, Southeast Asia, and Central and Western Asia. The exhibit introduces textiles from different cultures while exploring the cross-regional exchange and creation of fabrics facilitated by the flow of trade. In addition, an educational area in the exhibition introduces different textile production techniques in an easy-to-understand way.

Discover Asia in the Eyes of Jade: An Exhibition on the Jade Collection of the National Palace Museum

Most of the NPM's Asian jade artifacts are from the Qing court collection. The exquisite jade artifacts not only shine with dazzling brilliance, but, more importantly, also deal with exotic cultures brought to the Qing court and diversified traditional jade carving techniques. The timeline of these works spans from the 15th to 19th centuries and originates in the Mughal Empire, Indian regional states, Ottoman Empire, and Central Asia. This exhibition clearly presents the characteristics of jades from different territories.

The Far-Reaching Fragrance of Tea: The Art and Culture of Tea in Asia

This exhibition is divided into three sections: "The Homeland of Tea: Chinese Tea Culture," "The Way of Tea: Japanese Tea Culture," and "The Enjoyment of Tea: Taiwanese Gongfu Tea." Selected artifacts from the NPM's collection are showcased to illuminate Asia's many unique tea cultures and approaches to tea appreciation. Through the replication of a Ming teahouse, Japanese tearoom, and modern tea table, the visitor is introduced to tea appreciation in different settings. This exhibition is intended to inform viewers about the dissemination and exchange of tea practices between different regions in Asia, and to demonstrate their distinct yet interconnected tea cultures.

◆ Special Exhibitions

The special exhibitions are curated according to theme and represent the achievements in research at the National Palace Museum. They highlight the research findings of the departmental curators.

Pleasingly Pure and Lustrous: Porcelains from the Yongle Reign (1403-1424) of the Ming Dynasty

The Yongle porcelains in the collection of the National Palace Museum are considerable both in terms of quantity and quality. This exhibit features a special selection of approximately one hundred works divided into three sections. The first section, "Fired for the Court," presents the character, appearance, and unique features of porcelains made in the Yongle reign. The second, "Interaction with the Outside," shows how exchange between the Ming court and Tibet, as well as Central and West Asia, was manifested in porcelains. The last section, "Tradition and Imitation," demonstrates how porcelains of the Yongle and Xuande reigns in the Ming Dynasty were emulated in the Kangxi, Yongzheng, and Qianlong reigns of the following Qing Dynasty. We hope that through this exhibition, visitors can appreciate the period and cultural significance of surviving Yongle official porcelains.

The Phenomenon of Yixing Ware: Treasured Legacy and Beyond

"The Phenomenon of Yixing Ware" is divided into four units to present the exhibit works accordingly. The first, "Tea Ware from the Royal Court," displays exquisitely enameled Yixing tea vessels. "The Charm of Painted Enamels" is the second section, consisting of painted enamels on porcelain, metal, and glass wares and illustrates aspects of crafts and cultural interaction in areas where Yixing vessels were produced. The third section, "Ware of Yixing, Ou, and Guang," focuses on interpreting artworks defined as Yixing ware and further demonstrates how the understanding of Yixing ware evolved over time. Finally, the fourth part, "The Ceremonial Event of Tea," arranges a tea ceremony devoted to the emperor based on the collection of the NPM and imagines the possible features of tea events at the Qing court.

Scents to the Heavens: A Special Exhibition on Agarwood and the Culture of Incense

This exhibit is divided into two parts, the first of which is entitled "The Way of Incense." From the NPM's agarwood collection, we see how this kind of rare and precious wood was treasured, worn, and used in this past. "The Way of Incense" is further subdivided into three sections: "Collecting and Display," "Adorning the Body," and "Utensils for Appreciation." They show how people at the court used this fragrant wood, which was considered more valuable than gold, to enhance the aesthetics of their lives. The second part of the exhibit is "The Taste for Incense," which reveals that beyond just collecting and using agarwood, Taiwan has played an important role in the revival of incense culture over the past few decades. The art of incense has led to the development of a complete set of utensils for appreciation. Two subsections on "The Art of Incense Utensils" and "Space for Appreciating Incense" highlight the elegant creations defining the ways people nowadays use incense and, at the same time, convey an aesthetic unique to contemporary lifestyles.

Betwixt Reality and Illusion: Special Exhibition of Jades from the Warring States Period to the Han Dynasty in the Collection of the National Palace Museum

In this exhibition, 212 specially selected jade artifacts from the Warring States period to the Han Dynasty are presented. Each artifact is exemplary, and together they not only reflect the brilliant and diverse aesthetics of their time but also present a comprehensive narrative of jade artifacts. From the Warring States period to the Han Dynasty, the pursuit of dynamic illusion remained consistent in jade craftsmanship, and decorative designs maintained the same sinuous shapes. However, the illusory effects of works from different ages are clearly distinct. For example, jade dragons from the Warring States period are typically of a flat two-dimensional style, with misplaced legs and claws that can induce shifts between ambiguous states of movement and stillness. Jade beasts from the Han Dynasty, on the other hand, are three-dimensional, with distorted bodies and changes in tension and slackness. To better explore these differences, this exhibition has been further subdivided into four sections: "The Age of Dynamic Jades," "Artistic Styles of Jades from the Warring States Period to the Han Dynasty," "Dialogue Between the Perceived World and the Physical World," and "Mesmerizing Illusory Art."

Expedition to Asia: The Prominent Exchanges Between East and West in the 17th Century

This exhibition is inspired by the journey of Dutch envoys that successfully presented themselves to the Qing emperor and exhibits exquisite artworks in the collections of the National Palace Museum, Rijksmuseum of Amsterdam in the Netherlands, Japan's Umi-Mori Art Museum and the Museum of Oriental Ceramics of Osaka, the Cultural Affairs Bureau of the Tainan City Government, National Taiwan University Library, and the Graduate Institute of Art History at National Taiwan University. The story of exchange between East and West is presented by the joint efforts of these institutions.

The exhibition is divided into four sections. The opening section is entitled "Adventurous Footprints" and exhibits records and objects related to the journey of Dutch envoys. The second section on "Exotic Curios" presents how people from opposite sides of the globe imagined foreign lands, which encouraged objects with an oriental style or in western taste to appear. The third section, "Oriental Sentiment," reflects that even under the circumstances in the 17th century, the impact of foreign cultures was within reach. Finally, "Global Encounters" reconstructs the worldview of the 17th century through styles with blended features of East and West, such as the decorative patterns on porcelains, Suzhou prints, and interpretation of world maps, which accentuated the art and culture under the influence of exchange between East and West.

The Literati's Ordinaries: A Proposal of Life from the 17th Century

This exhibition illustrates a transitional time in the 17th century, a period that was both intriguing and full of possibility. From the perspective of modern material culture studies, not only can we glance at the story of adventurers who explored new sea routes through East and West exchanges, but also at the viewpoint of the Jiangnan area to understand the seemingly ordinary but in fact detail-oriented quality of literati families' daily rituals. The curatorial focus of the exhibition concentrates on "calligraphy and painting" and "objects," which are two chapters extracted from the *Treatise on Superfluous Things* written by the literati Wen Zhenheng (1586-1645) in the 17th century. In addition to rediscovering the cultural contexts embedded in the museum's collection, we can also explore the fine elements of the ancients' appreciation towards objects. In the process, the picture of a related social network is built up and the gradual trend to admire antiquarian styles that had influenced home accessories is also clarified. The purpose is unfolded by examining the ancient mindset about belongings and then looking into the relationship between people and objects in modern times.

Curio Boxes of Qianlong Emperor

The concept of the "curio box" can be perceived as the combination of assorted items. This exhibition presents curio boxes made under the Qianlong emperor of the Qing dynasty. The act of gathering objects into an assembled unit was not exclusive to emperors, but the collections of the National Palace Museum mainly came from the Qing palace. This suggests that the artifacts are imprinted with the traces of connoisseurship from generations of emperors. Meanwhile, the *Archives of the Imperial Workshops* give the indication that most of the assembly and formation of curio boxes was done during the Qianlong reign (1736-1795). Therefore, the exhibition concentrates on exploring how Qianlong emperor took the existing arrangements as his foundation and used his creativity to further elevate the storage and display of curio boxes into even more organized system.

Books in the Palm of Your Hand: the Kerchief-Box Editions in the National Palace Museum Collection

The ancient kerchief-box edition finds its modern equivalent in the miniature, pocket, or palm-sized book. Its small size and ease of carriage and storage secured its popularity among scholars and the reading public alike. This exhibition consists of five sections that provide an overview of the history, binding, formats, and contents of kerchief-box editions: "Five Classics in a Kerchief-Box," "Propagation of the Kerchief-Box Editions," "Imperial Collection of Miniature Editions," "Same Titles of Different Format Sizes," and "Kerchief-Box Editions for Traveling Literati." Additionally, Western pocket-sized books, on loan from the National Library, and early to contemporary Taiwanese small-sized books, borrowed from private collectors, are also on display.

Through the exhibition visitors can not only understand the cultural practice of storing books in kerchief-boxes, but also gain insight into how bibliophiles in historical China were sentimentally attached to books in their daily lives and during their travels, as well as the delight they took in appreciating their collections. At the same time, viewers may even get to know the development of the small-sized editions and their many facets in the history of the book in China.

Traditional Chinese Medical Texts on Life, Health and Longevity in the Collection of the National Palace Museum

This exhibition is divided into eight sections: “The Beginning of Life,” “The Human Body in Perspective,” “The History of Disease,” “Treating External Symptoms,” “Medical Recipes and Prescriptions,” “Religion and Medicine,” “Cultivating Health and Longevity” and “Medicine and the State.” By showcasing rare medical texts, documents, paintings, and artifacts from the Museum’s collection, it is intended to trace the development of traditional Chinese medical scholarship and its interactions with life, disease, religion, and institutions, and to show their mutual influence through the ages. Visitors are invited to explore the traditional ways to healing and health, to reflect upon modern views of life and medicine, and to appreciate the essence of leading a long and healthy life. Through ancient literature, cultural relics, and multimedia productions, visitors will hopefully have a deeper understanding of the value of the museum’s medical rare books and artifacts.

Of a Feather Flocking Together : Birds, Flowers, and Fruit in Melodic Harmony

In ancient times, painters frequently referred to birds by one of their most distinctive features--feathers. The National Palace Museum, as it turns out, has more than two thousand paintings in its collection on the subject of birds, in various styles and formats. This special exhibition presents a selection of 31 works/sets of birds in Galleries 202 and 212. The works, which date from the Song, Yuan, Ming, and Qing dynasties up to modern times, can be divided into the two categories of “Ripe Fruit Beckon Birds” and “Birds Sing of Floral Fragrance.” Also on display are photographs of the birds depicted in the paintings, allowing audiences to closely compare images of the brush and camera to see how artists over the centuries observed the world of birds with great detail. In their quest to overcome the constraints of formal likeness, artists used brush and ink to engage in a dialogue with their myriad surroundings to express the emotions and creativity of heart and mind. In this age when conservation is increasingly important, we encourage all to appreciate a beautiful melody of birds, flowers, and fruit in harmony.

Silhouette of a Great Master: A Retrospective of Chang Dai-chien’s Art on the 120th Anniversary of His Birth

Chang Dai-chien’s early painting was strongly influenced by the Ming-Qing individualist artists Shitao (1642-1707) and Bada shanren (1626-1707), but he also looked back to the Sui-Tang period and the Northern Wei of China’s past. In fact, Chang spent years studying the works of ancient masters, absorbing the essence of traditional brush and ink methods. In the end, he achieved excellence in the major techniques and subjects of Chinese painting, from landscapes to figures, birds-and-flowers, and animals. Learned and practiced in art, he was moreover a keen connoisseur who offered astute insights into the history of Chinese painting. He is perhaps most famous, however, for developing a breathtaking manner of painting known as “splashed colors.” Taking traditional splashed ink into new territory, he created a style that would become a trademark of his art. In calligraphy as well, Chang Dai-chien excelled at copying various script types, fusing them into a highly individual and powerfully fresh manner that is a perfect complement to his versatile skill in painting. With a career as an artist spanning more than six decades and seemingly unlimited energy, a large number of his works survive today. Together, they testify to the great cultural heritage that Chang left behind for the world to admire.

What many people may not realize is that Chang Dai-chien had a close relationship with the National Palace Museum. In accordance with Chang’s bequest, a large number of his precious artworks, along with the seals that he used, were donated to the collection of the Museum after his passing. At the same time, his Abode of Maya was presented as a memorial residence and is now managed by the Museum as well. 2019 marks the 120th anniversary of Chang Dai-chien’s birth. In commemoration, a selection from the finest works in the National Palace Museum collection and those temporarily entrusted from the National Museum of History of his painting and calligraphy, seals, and precious photographs has been made for this special exhibition. It offers a retrospective of the features and essence of Chang Dai-chien’s art from the early, middle, and late stages of his career, providing audiences with a comprehensive outline to the unparalleled legacy of this legendary master of modern times.

Friends Through Culture: A Special Exhibitions of Paintings on Elegant Gatherings

A congregation of scholarly and cultivated friends, known as an “elegant gathering,” was an important form of social interaction in traditional China. Such “parties” among literary circles were held for various reasons and could be large or small. During elegant gatherings, the host and guests not only enjoyed fine food and drink, they also took part in other refined activities of the traditional scholar, such as reciting poetry, performing the zither, playing Go, viewing works of painting and calligraphy, and enjoying tea. Naturally, such events often involved participants taking out brush and ink to produce related works (such as painting, calligraphy, and poetry). These “mixers” involving cultivated acquaintances offered many opportunities for inspiration and friendly competition, which is why they have been called a cradle of culture and creativity. The painting of elegant gatherings was a method to pictorially document these cultivated meetings and an important source of emulation to depict such events from the past. The places, people, and activities at the gatherings, even the arrangement and display of related things, were objectified in the minds of later artists, who even added or injected new elements from their imagination and period to the works. Elegant gatherings from various times and places in Chinese history were thereby infused with new life as a result of such creativity and transformation. And though the cultural competition at gatherings may have been a source of pressure for participating scholars, it was wrapped in the unique conventions and elegant packaging of tradition, becoming an interesting byproduct of these activities.

Masterpiece of a Mountain: A Special Exhibition of Chang Dai-Chien’s “Panorama of Mount Lu”

“Panorama of Mount Lu” is not only a late masterpiece of splashed colors and ink by Chang Dai-chien (1899-1983); it is also his largest surviving painting on a single bolt of silk. As such, it has been confirmed by the ROC’s Ministry of Culture as a National Treasure. Chang Dai-chien studied Chinese art from the Five Dynasties period to the Qing Dynasty, laying a solid foundation for his training in traditional painting and calligraphy. From 1941 to 1943, during the Second Sino-Japanese War, he traveled to Dunhuang and copied Tang to Song Dynasty and other wall paintings there. Spending two years and seven months in the area, his painting style became grander and more opulent. After the age of fifty, he took up residence overseas, traveling throughout Europe and the Americas to expand his vision and integrate the art of the East and West. He developed a new technique of splashed colors and ink that became a trademark of his later years. After living in the US, he then returned when he was 79 to stay in Taiwan, taking up residence on the outskirts of Taipei City. Though he became frail in body, his spirit in the arts was unchecked, as he often dared to overcome personal limitations. A perfect example is his “Panorama of Mount Lu,” which is 178.5 centimeters tall and almost ten meters long. It is his final masterpiece and the culmination of his career in art. Although not based on observation of a landscape, the work nonetheless crystallizes the essence of Chang Dai-chien’s lifetime devotion to art. The composition is likewise majestic, bursting with the creativity and expressiveness from the heart and mind of this twentieth-century master.

The Restoration of a Blue-and-White Dish with Design of Willow Trees and Birds Special Exhibition

During a routine inspection on the morning of July 18, 2017, the Japanese Blue-and-White Dish with Design of Willow Trees and Birds, the first item in the first display cabinet in the exhibition “Sailing the High Seas: Imari Porcelain Wares” was found damaged and detached from the prop stand, but no external force was recorded.

In the proceedings of the incident, the NPM put together a restoration team to investigate the cause through examination, data analysis, and scientific verification. Then, the restoration team resorted to the “golden repair” method, a traditional Japanese technique. As the collaboration signifies a new history made for the relic as well as friendly ties between the NPM and the Museum of Oriental Ceramics, Osaka, the restoration team dedicated considerable effort to the restoration procedures which included adhesion, tracing, and metal joinery. After adhesion was completed, the dish was traced with golden lines, echoing the western proverb, “Every cloud has a silver lining.” In addition, the remaining Y-shaped crack in the center of the restored dish appears like a golden life line that commemorates the rebirth of the nearly 400-year-old Blue-and-White Dish with Design of Willow Trees and Birds.

Timeless Legend: the Red Cliff and Historic Figures of the Three Kingdoms

This exhibition gathers precious artifacts of the National Palace Museum and original illustrations for the video game “Chen Uen’s Three Kingdoms” by Taiwanese cartoonist Chen Uen to present the heroic “Red Cliff” era. These heroic deeds occurred in the 3rd century and have been praised by painters, poets, and historians of later generations over a thousand years. Exhibited works include bronze crossbows, and seals, paintings, calligraphy, rubbings, woodblock prints, and other precious items from the NPM’s collection. The exhibition also features Ukiyo-e painting, Katsushika Hokusai’s Hokusai Manga, and the original manuscript of Taiwanese cartoonist Chen Uen. This exhibition illustrates the “Red Cliff” theme spanning time, space, and region, providing an unprecedented dialogue between ancient painting and contemporary art.

Smiling Shiva: The Lingakosha from the Kingdom of Champa

In Sanskrit, “linga” means “sign.” Lingakosha are often found in the central shrine of Shiva temples, indicating the central position of linga worship within Hinduism. In the kingdom of Champa, which extended across the coast of what is today central and southern Vietnam, this ritual symbolized the royal family offering the most noble gift to the Shiva, hoping to be repaid in return. There are only two known lingakosha from Vietnam. Due to their fragile craftsmanship, only around 20 exist in the world. This lingakosha is relatively complete and, thus, rarer. This first public exhibition of the lingakosha not only allows visitors to learn about the Shiva belief in the extensive Hindu cultural circles, but also about the mysterious aesthetics of the kingdom of Champa.

The Coordinates of Clay: Ceramics in the National Palace Museum Collection


“The Coordinates of Clay: Ceramics in the National Palace Museum Collection” celebrates the richness and diversity of the NPM’s collection of East Asian ceramics. It opens with Chinese wares from the imperial official kilns during the long period of peace and prosperity under the reign of the Kangxi (1662-1722), Yongzheng (1723-1735), and Qianlong (1736-1795) emperors in the Qing Dynasty, presenting the culminating brilliance of centuries of skills, resources, experiences, and creative energies within Chinese ceramic culture. The exhibition goes on to illustrate the parallels in glaze, decoration, shape, and other elements between Chinese ceramic culture and its neighboring counterparts. It selects representative pieces to showcase the diverse styles and regional characteristics of ceramic cultures in Vietnam, Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar, Korea, and Japan. A display of artistic richness and cultural diversity, “The Coordinates of Clay” demonstrates how ceramic cultures in East Asia emulate, exchange, and intersect with each other.

CAI Qian and WANG Delu

The Southern Branch of the National Palace Museum is located in Taibao, Chiayi, a city with an interesting historical background. The city of Taibao was named after the official title of a local hero, WANG Delu of the Qing Dynasty. He was given the title “Taizi Taibao” (Junior Guardian of the Heir Apparent) by the Qing emperor Jiaqing. To memorialize this extraordinary honor, his hometown was therefore renamed Taibao. Wang earned this honor for defeating CAI Qian, a once dominant force in the South and East China seas. In his heyday during the 19th century, CAI’s power extended from China’s Zhejiang to Vietnam. He was the most powerful marine force in the region ever since ZHENG Zhilong of the 17th century. Over and over, CAI challenged the Qing Empire on the seas. He also had invaded Taiwan several times and stayed in Chiayi for a while. Legend has it that the descendants of CAI and his men are still living in Chiayi’s coastal areas. The fateful duel between CAI and WANG was not just about the bold fight between civilians and the government. It also shaped the regional development of Chiayi. The exhibition combines the NPM collection’s of Qing dynasty archives and memorials with local legends and collected folk portraits, robes, and plaques from Taiwanese sites and temples. Therefore, the Southern Branch of the National Palace Museum’s special exhibition of “CAI Qian and WANG Delu” presents the history of Chiayi from an additional viewpoint.

Our Beloved Treasures: Masterpieces in the National Palace Museum Collection

In addition to curating Asian art themed exhibitions, the Southern Branch of the National Palace Museum has made additional efforts to organize exhibitions of national treasures in the hope that southern audiences will get the chance to appreciate the history and splendor of these treasured works. The first exhibition featured



the “Meat Shaped Stone,” which like the “Jadeite Cabbage” is one of the most famous sculptures in the NPM’s collection. The meat-shaped stone is made from an opaque piece of banded jasper. The craftsman mastered the textural characteristics of the stone layer by layer, even drilling pores and replicating the skin by dying the topmost layer. The effect is what looks like a piece of pork soaked in soy sauce, tender and juicy, with the craftsman turning a piece of cold stone into mouth-watering “Dongpo pork.” The realism of the work is amazing.

Sawasdee Thailand: A Glimpse of Thai Culture at the NPM

Thailand, known as Siam up until 1939, has been a hub of international commerce and travel since ancient times. This exhibition provides a comprehensive inventory of all Thai-related cultural relics in the NPM’s collection, including hundreds of year’s worth of diplomatic documents between Siam and China, rare books recording the history of Siam, religious sculptures, export ceramics, silk, and other cultural relics. The exhibition was created with the support and assistance of Thailand’s Museum Siam, the Thai Trade and Economic Office, the National Culture and Arts Foundation, National Chengchi University’s Department of History, and the Taiwan New Immigrants Group. We hope the exhibition will provide viewers with a deeper understanding of Thailand’s wonderful cultural history and artistic legacy.

Cherished Objects: New Acquisitions of the National Palace Museum

Travel, for people today, is a common experience. But beyond travel for leisure or commerce, travel has historically included religious pilgrimage, international diplomatic missions, and even war and ethnic migration. Voyages like these facilitated exchanges between civilizations in disparate regions, especially between Asia and civilizations in Europe and Africa. This exhibition tells the stories of 12 travelers, showing the NPM’s achievements in preparing for the Southern Branch. Taking on the perspective of all of Asia, the scope of the exhibition includes East Asia, Southeast Asia, South Asia, Central Asia, the Himalayas, and other regions. Mediums include copper, porcelain, lacquer, wood, textiles, paintings, and more. Almost 30 artworks are being exhibited for the first time after entering the museum’s collection.

A Special Exhibition of 21st Century Museums at the Southern Branch of the NPM

The word “carnival” originated from the medieval period and is widely used to mean “celebration,” while festivals in the East can also be found in genre paintings throughout history. Mikhail Bakhtin, the 20th century Soviet philosopher, believed that “carnivals” were a release for the spirit and senses. Bakhtin’s ideas cohere nicely with the exhibition theme as new media art brings visitors a perception of illusion and multisensory experiences. In addition to presenting the National Palace Museum’s award-winning virtual reality (VR), augmented reality (AR), mixed reality (MR) programs, and other new media artworks, the exhibition also features incredible virtual reality experiences from leading museums around the world. The exhibition is co-organized with the Musée du Louvre, Tate Modern, Musée de l’Orangerie, Alte Nationalgalerie, and the Mucha Foundation.

2018 Taichung World Flora Exposition

Flowers of Immense Charm: A Masterpiece Exhibition by Four Major Museums

The museum specially cooperated with the Tokyo Fuji Art Museum, CHIMEI Museum, and the National Taiwan Museum of Fine Arts to host “Flowers of Immense Charm: A Masterpiece Exhibition by Four Major Museums,” which was exhibited at the National Taiwan Museum of Fine Arts. Through cross-border exchanges and inter-museum cooperation, the exhibition presented the worldview of four different cultural contexts and values in Taiwan, China, Japan, and the West. The exhibition won 9th place in Arts magazine’s “Top Ten Public Exhibitions.”

Floral Art for Pleasure: Appreciation of Flower Vessels and Lifestyle

This exhibition was presented at the Southern Branch of the NPM to reiterate the classical affinity of flower enthusiasts. In Taiwan, early flower vessels were a blend of local craftsmanship with Chinese and Japanese traditions of floral art, which resulted in unique characteristics. Such a distinctive development is also featured in this exhibition for the audience to better understand the splendor of local flower vessels. Additionally, a surreal garden created with multimedia leads visitors into the fantasy world of flower vessels, where they can experience the fantastic fusion of technology and art.

NPM New Media Art Exhibition

The National Palace Museum has been dedicated to the integration of the humanities and technological innovation, focusing on the promotion of digital art education from the perspectives of art and technology.

This exhibition is in response to the “2018 Taichung World Flora Exposition” and features the “NPM New Media Exhibition” based on Taichung’s local flowers and a horse ranch, as well as the park’s core values of “Ecology, Nature, and Natural Symbiosis.” The exhibition transforms the important cultural relics of the NPM into multimedia art, integrating with education, and promoting the creation of a new immersive aesthetic experience.

◆ In Cooperation with Outside Institutions

Masterpieces of French Landscape Paintings from the Pushkin State Museum of Fine Arts, Moscow

This exhibition was co-organized by the NPM, the Pushkin State Museum of Fine Arts, and udnFunlife Co., Ltd. The Pushkin State Museum of Fine Arts is particularly known for its treasured collection of French paintings. This exhibition features a total of 65 works of 17th to 20th century landscape paintings, focusing on masterpieces from important 19th century Impressionist and Post-Impressionist painters.

The six themes of this exhibition are “Springs of Modern Landscape Paintings,” “Admiration for Nature,” “Cityscapes of Paris,” “Outskirts of Paris—the Creation Inspired by Intimate Nature,” “Far from Paris—the Search for Brighter Sunshine,” and “Trips to Foreign and Imaginary Lands.” These themes are designed to improve public understanding of modern French landscape painting. One of the biggest highlights of this exhibition is Monet’s “Luncheon on the Grass.” Aside from this, the exhibition also features works from the French Baroque landscape master Claude Lorraine, Rococo master Francois Boucher, the Barbizon School’s Jean-Baptiste-Camille-Corot, and the Impressionists Renoir, Cezanne, Rousseau, and Gauguin, totaling 48 masterpieces that share the quiet elegance of French landscape painting with the audience.

The NPM Zoo: Animal Paintings in the Museum Collection

“The NPM Zoo” is the NPM’s first special exhibition created for elementary school children. It is co-hosted by the National Palace Museum (NPM), three public zoos (i.e., the Taipei Zoo, Hsinchu Zoo, and Shoushan Zoo), and the National Museum of Marine Biology & Aquarium (NMMBA), forming a brand new collaboration. Animal pictures are displayed with the paintings, featuring various insects, fish, birds, and other creatures one by one. The exhibition contains easy-to-understand descriptions and lively designs, offering a truly unique experience that not only incorporates sight but also sound, touch, and even smell. Photographs of actual animals share the stage with ancient paintings, allowing children to quickly see the difference between the creatures in art and those of the real world. Audio, video, and professional opinions identifying the species in paintings are provided from collaborating institutions. The goal of the exhibition is to draw young children to the NPM to see its exhibitions and teach them about concepts such as artifact preservation, ecological preservation, and animal welfare. The exhibition provides them with an opportunity to enjoy ancient paintings and enlighten them on the importance of protecting animals and preserving artifacts.

The Beauty of Interchange: Selections from Japan’s Kobe City Museum

Starting in the 16th century, fascinating moments of interaction took place between Europe and Asia via the sea. Given Taiwan’s position along East Asian sea routes, the exchange and combination of cultural artifacts offer a unique perspective and new vision when compared to previous exhibitions on cultural exchange. To present this engaging story of exchange between Europe and Asia, this special exhibition features fine works from the collection of the Kobe City Museum along with those from the National Palace Museum, Rijksmuseum, Museum Prinseh of Delft, and National Museum of Taiwan History. The exhibition narrates the fortuitous encounters and fusion of European and Asian art in the 16th to 19th centuries, and it is the largest showing of works from the Kobe City Museum overseas.

Masks-Beauty of the Spirits: Masterpieces from the musée du quai Branly-Jacques Chirac

This exhibition introduces a hundred masks from the collection of France’s musée du quai Branly - Jacques Chirac from Africa, Asia, America, and Oceania. The exhibition showcases the uses of masks in dramas, celebrations, social politics, and human-deity communication. Asian mask selections include masks for theatrical rituals from countries like Japan, Korea, India, Thailand, Indonesia, and Vietnam, allowing viewers to learn about the spread of epics and drama throughout Asia. This exhibition helps viewers explore different cultures around the world and appreciate the extraordinary creative beauty of the masks on display.

◆ International Conferences

Participated in the 2019 ICOM General Conference Museum Fair

The International Council of Museums (ICOM) held their general conference at the Kyoto International Conference Center from September 1 to 7, 2019. The National Palace Museum used the exhibition theme of "Reinterpreting Tradition" to present the NPM's digital transformation achievements of the last few years. According to official ICOM statistics, the annual conference included more than 3,000 council members from 121 different countries. The design of the museum's exhibition space was based on the appearance and ambiance of the NPM, while the content centered on recent achievements in digital technology conversion. Using technology like VR interactive devices, an AR virtual flower vase installation, and 8K digital videos, the exhibit conveyed the possibility of a future that embraces tradition. Films based on classic artworks in the NPM's collection were paired with activities that represent Taiwan's cultural characteristics. Using the meaning of cultural relics to create deep experiences, the exhibition showed how the NPM is a pioneer in the trend of digitization. The exhibition successfully attracted museum professionals from around the world, accomplishing international marketing goals.

To advance academic research, the NPM invited domestic and international experts and scholars to give lectures, organized seminars and conferences, and took part in academic and cultural exchanges, thereby stimulating academic studies and broadening our research horizons.

In 2019, the NPM held 11 international academic conferences.

Participants delved, within the paradigm of digital humanities research, into the direction of the digital archiving of medical texts to explore the potential, multi-faceted uses of digitized images to facilitate the sharing of cultural resources.</p>
2	07/20	<p>“The Beauty of Interchange: Selections from Japan’s Kobe City Museum” Workshop</p> <p>This workshop was a collaboration between the Southern Branch of the National Palace Museum and the Kobe City Museum, and resulted in a published paper on research results from the exchange and exhibition of cultural relics. The workshop theme was divided into the appearance of porcelains, new geographic discoveries, and new painting styles. A total of eight researchers published papers as a result, promoting international exchange as well as academic exchange and discussion.</p>
3	07/27	<p>“Curators of East Asian Painting Workshop and Exchange”</p> <p>Nine scholars and experts from Taiwan, Japan, Germany, the United States, the Netherlands, and France were invited to come share their curatorial experiences. Round table discussions facilitated interaction with on-site participants. In coordination with international loan exhibitions, small seminars and research took place.</p>
4	10/25-10/27	<p>“2019 Taiwan International Forum on Children and Museums”</p> <p>The NPM invited experts from the Centre Pompidou, France, the National Museum of Korea, the National Gallery of Singapore, and Texas Woman’s University in the US to give five keynote speeches on 21st century challenges in children’s museums and future trends in children’s museums. There was also discussion with domestic museum experts on using the museum as an educational space and building the future of children’s education.</p>
5	11/07-11/08	<p>“Workshop of Black-Glazed Ware”</p> <p>In order to promote research and educational promotion with The Museum of Oriental Ceramics, Osaka, and to present on the special characteristics and issues related to black-glazed porcelain in the museum’s Qing collection, the NPM invited experts from Taiwan, Japan, and South Korea to discuss related issues and recent research results. In total, there was one keynote speech, two presentations given by seven scholars, and a comprehensive discussion. On the second day, participating scholars observed and discussed the NPM’s black-glazed porcelain collection.</p>

8	11/27	“Forum on Cultural Property Research and Conservation Practices” In coordination with inviting foreign experts and scholars to participate in “Workshop: Scientific Studies on Pigments and Dyes,” the NPM also held the “Forum on Cultural Property Research and Conservation Practices.” Scholars introduced institutions in France, Italy, and Japan relevant to the development and current status of conservation practice. Attendees took part in discussions and exchanges with Taiwanese experts and scholars.
9	11/30	“The Therapeutic Power of Museums Workshop” The NPM invited Rebecca McGinnis, Senior Managing Educator of Accessibility at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, to conduct “The Therapeutic Power of Museums Workshop.” The workshop opened a dialogue on inclusive education, introduced the trend of international inclusiveness, and improved the overall perspective of museum culture.
10	12/12	“Perspectives of Ivory Balls Workshop” The NPM's current trajectory centers on building on existing exhibitions and research results to further combine digital technology with research in the humanities. This year, in collaboration with Rijksmuseum Amsterdam and CWI Amsterdam, the NPM launched CT scan technology on its carved ivory balls. The NPM promoted international academic exchanges through discussion and collaboration in the workshop, and comprehensively promoted the use of science and digital technology in museum collections and research. Three research publications and comprehensive dialogue were the result of the workshop.

11	12/16	“Neo Virtual × Open Reality of Tomorrow: International Symposium on Art and Technology in Museums of the 21st Century” Held in the Northern Branch of the NPM, the talks were divided into two main topics: “Art History and Virtual Reality (VR)” and “Digital Interpretation in Art Museums.” Participants discussed using VR in the 21st century, the challenges faced, and the future of art museums. This seminar was held alongside the exhibition of different international VR programs in “A Carnival of Fantasies: A Special Exhibition of 21st Century Museums.” The NPM invited speakers including Audrey Tang, Digital Minister of the Republic of China Executive Yuan; Dominique de Font-Réaulx, Director of Education and Cultural Programs at the Musée du Louvre; Marcus Mucha, Executive Director of the Mucha Foundation; and Cécile Debray, Director of the Musée de l'Orangerie. The representatives discussed the forward-facing results of using contemporary digital technology in museums and art galleries, and they also explored a wide range of digital content forms, aesthetics, and narratives.

保存修護

文物保存維護係本院的核心業務之一，本院在保存環境、修護作業上，皆以達到文物預防性保存及維持文物最佳狀況為目標，具體工作分下列三大項：

◆文物保存環境控管

文物保存環境控管項目	文物保存環境控管內容與說明
文物展存環境溫溼度監測	「文物保存環境溫溼度感知監測系統」建置完迄今 9 年，確實掌握保存環境的溫溼度動態變化，與空調機電相輔相成為文物展存環境切實勾稽，及時調控排除異常狀況，並依據文物類別協調展櫃溫濕度設定，共 130 櫃次。此外，另機動性地佐以溫溼度紀錄器，定時派員進行展場及庫房溫溼度檢視，務使文物保存在恆溫恆濕的環境。



Preservation and Conservation

The preservation and conservation of artifacts is one of the core tasks at the NPM. The NPM has always striven to maintain its collection, as well as to preserve it in the best condition possible through preventative conservation and appropriate conservation measures. The work is divided into three categories as follows:

◆ Control of the Artifact Environment

Project	Description
Monitoring Temperature and Humidity	The Wireless SSensor Network of the "National Palace Museum Environment Monitoring System," which has been in use for nine years, has greatly helped with monitoring real time changes in temperature and relative humidity. The system involves temperature and relative humidity monitoring of the exhibition environment of cultural relics, the timely adjustment and elimination of abnormal conditions, and the coordination of display case temperature and relative humidity settings according to object material, in a total of 130 cases. In addition, thermo-hygrometers are also used for staff members to regularly examine the exhibition and storage areas to ensure that the environment is properly maintained.
Micro-environment Regulation in Gallery Display Cases	In 2019, a total of 80 display cases were adjusted to control the micro-environment of relative humidity-sensitive artifacts, and crates were also regulated to stabilize relative humidity during transportation for loan exhibitions.
Light Intensity Adjustments and Filtering Operations	In 2019, in order to maintain lighting within pre-determined standards, light intensity was measured and adjusted before each exhibition and during special cases in which artifacts were being photographed. A total of 190 adjustments were made whilst light dimming and filtering in exhibition areas were carried out.
Checks on the Artifact Display Environment	In 2019, checks on the artifact display and storage environment, including galleries in the Main Exhibition Building, the storage rooms for the Department of Painting and Calligraphy, the Department of Rare Books and Historical Documents, the Department of Antiquities, conservation studios, wooden frames for conservation, as well as wooden exhibition cases, were performed 389 times in total to minimize the risk of pest invasion. An additional 275 checks took place in the Southern Branch.
Acidic Release Testing of Materials for Display and Storage	To prevent artifacts from deteriorating by acidic conditions, display and storage materials are tested for acid-release levels. In 2019, a total of 242 items were tested, including decorative board materials, wood parts, mixed paint, gaskets, carpeting, wall coverings, adhesives, paste filler, light filters, and prints.
Termite Prevention	Starting from 2012, 441 termite monitoring stations were placed around the Main Exhibition Building, Administrative Buildings, and the Library Building in the Northern Branch. In 2019, the NPM continued with 26 termite survey operations. The control rate was 99.8%. Since 2016, a total of 495 termite monitoring stations have been set up around the museum buildings in the Southern Branch. In 2019, the NPM conducted 11 termite survey operations. The control rate was 100%.
Preventing Insect Infestation of Organic-based Artifacts	In 2019, a total of 852 pieces were subject to anoxia treatment by oxygen scavenger, low oxygen or by nitrogen in relative humidity control cabinets, and freezing treatment to prevent infestation of organic-based artifacts.
Preventing Insect Infestation of Packaging/decoration Materials through Heating or Freezing	To ensure that no insects were carried into the exhibition or storage areas, in 2019, 263 materials for packaging or decoration of artworks were subject to preventative freezing or heating treatment.
Cleaning Management and Environment Disinfection	In addition to the regular cleaning and surveying of the exhibition and storage areas to prevent pests, exhibition areas were disinfected during changes in exhibitions. In 2019, there were a total of 10 disinfections in the Northern Branch and 14 disinfections in the Southern Branch conducted while changing exhibitions.

◆ Conservation of Cultural Artifacts

Conservation work, preservation, and relevant record keeping are necessary to maintain the NPM's artifacts in their best condition and prolong their longevity. Conservation practices are additionally performed through the examination of works during spot checks, acquisitions, and loan exhibitions.



◆ Scientific Research and Analysis

To aid artifact conservation and acquisition, and to enhance the understanding of artifact history and technology, the NPM continued to analyze cultural artifacts, enhance technological equipment, encourage both domestic and international professional exchange and cooperation, and also release its research for public reference.

教育推廣

為發揮博物館之教育推廣功能，提升社會大眾認識故宮文物之美，本院針對不同年齡、特性及地區之對象，規劃辦理多元豐富的教育活動，以服務廣大民眾。

◆參觀服務

本院延續 107 年 1 月起實施之新制參觀收費標準，並提供各項免費參觀服務，以提升博物館教育推廣功能，包括：年齡未滿十八歲、六十五歲以上（平日）及身心障礙證明、具教育部立案學校正式學籍學生等訪客。

108 年北部院區共計提供十八歲以下本國人士 40,907 人次、十八歲以下外籍人士 217,108 人次、本國學生個人 60,505 人次、身心障礙人士與陪同者 13,352 人次免費參觀；南部院區則共計提供十八歲以下人士 30,611 人次、學生個人 16,097 人次、學生團體 45,766 人次、身心障礙人士與陪同者 10,147 人次免費參觀。

此外，為響應政府擴大秋冬國民旅遊政策，本院自 108 年 9 月起推出「揪遊故宮」方案，內容包含：本國人士兩人同行一人免費、六十五歲以上全時段免費，以及北、南部院區之票務、商店消費等相關優惠措施。

◆藝文表演活動

邂逅南院—故宮下午茶」表演藝術活動

本院持續與雲林縣政府、嘉義縣政府、臺南市政府及在地文教機關合作辦理南部院區教育推廣及文化交流活動，營造優質藝文環境，並透過邀請雲嘉南地方藝文團體或學校團體到院演出，加強與在地的合作與連結，同時推廣雲嘉南地區的藝文團體。每週六下午 3 時固定舉辦「邂逅南院 - 故宮下午茶」表演藝術活動，108 年辦理 49 場次，觀賞人數共計 36,761 人次。表演活動涵蓋中西音樂、舞蹈、戲曲、民俗技藝、魔術等多元藝文內容。

故宮亞洲藝術節

南部院區第三屆「故宮亞洲藝術節—泰國月」活動，由泰國貿易經濟辦事處協辦，推出多元文化體驗、表演藝術、特展、講座、電影、主題書展、美食文創市集等活動，超過 2 萬 8 千人次參與，當月份參觀人數超過 12 萬人。本活動除邀請已為聯合國教科文組織登錄為人類非物質文化遺產代表作之泰國面具舞蹈劇「孔劇」（Khon）到院演出外，也以別出心裁的時尚秀，展演泰國詩麗吉王后所設計的八款近代「傳統」國服，期以創新方式，引領觀眾探索「熟悉又陌生的泰國」。

跨域實驗展演計畫

為促進本院與當代文化共融，使故宮典藏文物與大眾更親近，本院自 107 年起推動「故宮週末夜表演藝術活動」轉型為「跨域實驗展演計畫」，邀請當代表演藝術、視覺藝術及其他各創意領域工作者進行跨領域合作，以本院展覽或文物為主題發展故宮客製化創新展演創作，於本院公共空間公開演出，打造故宮為當代文化展演平臺，提供社會大眾多元感官體驗之教育推廣活動，創造更豐富精彩的博物館經驗。108 年共計執行活動 30 場，參與 12,000 人次，表列如下：

為吸引青少族群，以跨域整合的方式，與中華民國定向越野協會合作辦理，活動結合以文物為主軸，結合趣味競賽、知識問答等闖關方式，由中華民國亞青定向越野國手黃敏惠擔任這次「故宮狂歡運動會」傳遞聖火大使，邀請臺灣創價學會、順益臺灣原住民博物館、臺北市立至善國中及私立衛理女中等鄰近館校共襄盛舉，邀請喜愛定向運動之專業人士、青少年及親子等不同族群親近故宮，藉由此活動結合故宮文物知識，規劃多元文化體驗吸引觀眾參與博物館教育活動，本活動於 108 年 11 月 2 日舉辦，近 800 人次參與活動。

◆教育培訓

教師增能與館校合作

- 配合「花事・閑情 品味花器與生活特展」，辦理南部院區2天1夜教師研習工作坊1場，以專題講座、展廳導覽、手作課程等方式，引領參與教師進入「茶香花」的美好世界，並共同發想如何與課程結合，運用博物館資源豐富學生學習經驗，提升包含藝術與人文、環境、資訊、自主學習等領域素養，活動共計40人參與。
- 配合教育部中等學校以下執行十二年國民基本教育課程綱要總綱，進行彈性課程規劃，與高中職以下學校共同規劃執行館校合作專案，發展以故宮文物為素材之主題課程，以增進本院展覽多元運用成果及文物與學校課程連結，強化博物館與學校正式教育之互動，培養學校教師利用本院教育資源開發之能力。並以各校不同特色，進行館校合作活動，促進學校教師對本院資源之瞭解與運用。總計12所學校，634名師生參與，辦理情形詳如下表：

兒童、親子及青少年創意活動

- 本院為推廣優質兒童藝文活動，定期以不同主題之文物，舉辦之系列兒童課程。108年推出「歡迎光臨故宮X動物園」KPM兒童藝享創作課程，課程介紹故宮典藏文物所描繪的飛禽走獸、水中生物與古人想像的神獸及其代表的吉祥話語，帶著孩子去探索隱藏在文物裡的大小動物！並與臺北市立木柵動物園合作，一同安排活動課程，讓兒童除了故宮文物，拓展文化視野，並與現在生態保育連結，給予兒童一段充滿藝文、歡樂及動物保育的美好時光。共計辦理4梯次，每梯次招收學員50名，共有200名學童參加。
- 為推動青年主流化工作，本院成立「兒童暨青年事務推動諮詢會」，且為因應開放政府及具體實踐青年文化公民權、賦權年輕世代等政策理念，13位外聘委員，除來自網路社群、新媒體藝術、數位教育、創新科技等領域之學術界、產業界專家學者外，亦包含海選計畫遴選出的2位青年代表及1位高中生代表。藉由此一公私協力的平臺，整合、連結並重新建構內部與外部資源，從創作、展覽、教育、傳播、行銷、出版等全面推展青年業務。108年召開2次諮詢會(03/06、11/19)，並公開諮詢會設置要點、諮詢委員名單、會議紀錄於本院官網，並舉辦6場「跨界對談」(03/07、03/23、11/17、11/23、12/14、12/21)，引入外界專業知識，活絡本院青年業務。
- 推出主題行銷專案，透過影像拉近故宮與民眾之距離，強化本院公共化、在地化、年輕化之機關形象。「一日故宮影片製作行銷案」，共拍攝6支影片，總觀看數逾172萬，分述如下：

- 為推廣本院典藏文物，擴大青年參與，鼓勵青年學子運用故宮元素進行藝術創作，與實踐大學服裝設計學系合作107學年度第二學期課程，並由本院提供學生典藏文物知識背景，開創博物館資源結合課程典範。以影片「故宮動物園X實踐服裝設計」30秒版本與23分鐘創作全記錄呈現課程成果，至109年1月6日止，觀看次數共37,652次，觸及人數達125,892人次。
- 配合特展「小時代的日常」，並結合國內青年創意團隊「印花樂」，於108年11月30日與12月7日舉辦共4場次之「文青美感手作坊」，由印花樂設計3款專屬故宮特展圖板，運用文物資源融入美學，吸引年輕族群，4場報名共100人。
- 南部院區兒童創意中心配合本院各項特展舉辦親子活動，活動內容以多元學習方式，如辦理說故事劇場、親子體驗及手做DIY等各項教育推廣活動，提升親子觀眾對故宮文物及展覽之認識，108年南部院區辦理103場活動，計22,428人參與；南部院區兒童創意中心立基於院藏與南院常設展覽，以「亞洲陶瓷」、「亞洲茶文化」及「亞洲織品」為主，搭配「認識亞洲環型劇場」、

「羅摩衍那劇場」等專區，以彰顯亞洲各國豐富的文化特色，108 年更推出「泰國文化主題」及印度史詩 3D 動化影片，以激發兒童學習興趣，108 年參觀人次為 286,067 人。

7. 南部院區為響應「518 世界博物館日」，首度與臺灣路跑賽會服務協會合作，辦理以「博物館」為主題的賽事 - 「2019 故宮南院音樂星空馬拉松」，跑者沿著南部院區的綠茵湖畔步道競技之餘，也能同步欣賞南院園區白天夜晚獨特的建築光影美學，共計 3,200 人參加；而 2019 年主題為「博物館作為文化樞紐：傳統的未來」，配合五月期間節慶假日，進行全館展覽及活動整合宣傳，舉辦「慈母手中線—故宮南院織品展深度巡禮暨刺繡創作體驗」及「繁花・樂音・臺灣茶—故宮南院茶文化展深度巡禮暨創意茶席體驗」，本活動共 4 場次，共 150 人次參與。
8. 南部院區辦理「2019 夏日親子藝術月」活動，串聯當期國際大展「交融之美—神戶市立博物館精品展」，以「博物館大航家」為主題，推出夏令營、實境解謎遊戲、大型兒童劇表演、親子藝術工作坊、親子繪本營、水舞秀及 3D 水幕魔鏡秀等精彩活動，邀請大小朋友一同到南院，以五感體驗探索藝術文化的迷人魅力，兩月份活動共計約 11 萬人參與，參觀人數近 30 萬人。

兒童學藝中心

本院兒童學藝中心 108 年參觀人次為 149,496 人；自 97 年 5 月 18 日開館至 108 年 12 月 31 日止，參觀人數累計共 1,480,942 人次。109 年將啟動兒藝中心 2.0 改造計畫，運用故宮精美文物資源，結合數位科技，全面更新兒童學藝中心展示內容，以精進博物館兒童教育功能，激發兒童觀眾欣賞文物興趣。內容希能概念性的將故宮形象、參觀引導及文物之美做一生動呈現，建立博物館數位教育新模式。同時為提升親子觀眾觀展品質，設置「親子友善區」，增加哺乳室及洗手間等設施，使觀眾獲得豐富文物內涵知識與美好的參觀經驗。

臺灣兒童及博物館國際論壇

1. 政策說明
故宮 107 年啟動「Hand in hand 博物館友善親子串聯行動」，串聯設有兒童教育空間之國內博物館，108 年新增國立海洋生物博物館、臺南市美術館、國立臺灣史前文化博物館，宣布國內響應串連行動的博物館累積達 18 所，在「兒童虛擬博物館」入口網站推出「第二屆兒童虛擬展」線上開展，橫跨藝術、歷史人文與科學領域，共 20 件展品。另有「看展捉寶闖關趣」抽獎活動，歡迎親子逛完線上展後，攜「手」來趟博物館之旅，享受博物館豐富的教育資源。

2. 執行成效
「2019 臺灣兒童及博物館國際論壇」，108 年 10 月 25 及 26 日於文會堂舉辦，以「新世紀兒童博物館的挑戰」與「兒童博物館的未來趨勢」兩大議題，邀請法國龐畢度、韓國國立中央博物館、新加坡國家美術館及美國德克薩斯女子大學等地專家學者，展開五場國際專題演講，另分別就美感教育、兒童展覽、多媒體科技應用與文化平權等議題，與國內博物館專家與代表進行對談交流，藉由博物館共學共創構築兒童的未來。

志工招募培訓

結合民間資源，招募對藝術文化有興趣又有意願協助博物館教育推廣之社會各階層人士，積極辦理培訓與教育訓練，投入志工業務。截至 108 年 12 月底止，本院北部院區志工總數計 493 名（含成人志工 444 人、高中志工 30 人、小小志工 19 人）；南部院區志工總數計 247 名（含成人志工 217 人、小小志工 30 人）。

推動美感教育

本院自 103 年起持續與教育部合作共同推動美感教育中長程計畫，整合各類教推活動，並提出「全國各級學校團體免費參觀及導覽服務」、「增進全國各級學校教師藝術美感經驗專業知能」、「身心障礙學校師生團體服務」等三項具體方案，期使故宮文物資源發揮更大效益。

108 年申請教育部補助，延續前期計畫，與新竹市香山國小共同規劃執行美感體驗館校合作計畫，結合本院文物融入課程，配合 12 年國民基本教育理念，透過美學向下扎根，發展主題性跨學科整合課程，總計 325 人次參與。

為發揮博物館的教育功能，本院開發百萬學子遊故宮教案，特以南部院區豐富的典藏文物或展覽為中心開發文化體驗課程，豐富中南部地區文化資源較缺乏的學子藝文體驗活動，並邀請附近學校來院參觀導覽及進行手作體驗課程。108 年共開發 8 款文化體驗課程，分別為「拓印我認識的亞洲」、「手作紀念專屬胸章」、「尋寶南不南」、「圖騰紙雕花式盒 DIY」、「絕妙好盜 - 青花三繫茶壺手創萬用卡」、「一躍成佛 - 彈跳誕生佛」、「漫遊三國小書」及「南院大發現 - 魔術方格翻翻卡」，計 35,477 人參與體驗課程。

實習生培訓

為培育大專院校學生博物館教育推廣相關領域之實務經驗與職場技能，本院教育展資處長期提供大專院校學生寒暑假實習，108 年共 22 位實習生，包含國立東華大學、國立雲林科技大學、國立臺北藝術大學、國立臺東大學、國立臺灣大學、國立臺灣師範大學、國立臺灣藝術大學、文藻外語大學、東海大學、淡江大學、輔仁大學等。

博物館人才培育計畫

1. 本院執行「博物館人才培育計畫」，目的為結合大學院校或社會資源，針對博物館專業需求，共同推動博物館事業之人才培育，並透過擴大文化參與及產業合作連結，提升學生的博物館專業知能，以加強博物館營運之專業效能。
2. 108 年共補助國立雲林科技大學、國立嘉義大學、輔仁大學、臺北醫學大學、臺南應用科技大學、文藻外語大學等 6 校辦理「雲科大 plus 新故宮 - 用文物修復力，促進故宮公共化」等 7 案計畫，邀請本院研究員或於本院執行博物館文化工作相關之專業工作坊、專題講座、專業導覽、故宮實習、製作文創商品與教育推廣等內容，共計 34 場次。
3. 為建立長期館校實習合作關係，本院南部院區與國立勤益科技大學、國立嘉義大學、國立高雄科技大學（第一校區）、文藻外語大學及臺南應用科技大學等中南部地區大專院校簽訂實習合作計畫，結合南院文物意象及地方人文特色，培育博物館專業人才及拓展博物館展覽內涵。108 年已開設 72 小時課程，合計 131 位參與實習。

◆文化平權服務

為提升多元族群文化參與之機會，秉持社會共融 (Social Inclusion) 理念推動各項參觀導覽與教育活動，積極與國際博物館專業交流，以提升能見度，本院 108 年文化平權服務辦理狀況說明如下：

提升文化近用權之相關措施

1. 本院近年來致力於提升各類觀眾的文化近用權，例如聽障朋友參觀時可以使用多媒體手語導覽機，視障人士參觀時除了可以使用口述影像語音導覽、觸覺地圖、點字參觀手冊等輔具，也可

以申請體驗「跨越障礙・觸摸美麗」教育推廣活動，配合活潑生動的導覽解說，及觸摸原比例的複製文物。另外也配合常設展及特展，增設視障輔具，並且主動走向大眾，推動多項故宮樂齡學習及身心障礙教育活動。

2. 此外，無法親自造訪的民眾，亦可利用本院建置的網路學習資源，不限時地，隨時探索無牆博物館。本院自 103 年建置《故宮教育頻道》，並著力於針對偏鄉及教育優先區中小學進行數位內容推廣。107 年至 108 年，為因應中小校 108 課綱實施及教育部美感教育計畫推動，積極以跨領域、實作體驗以及博物館數位資源為內容，以「故宮創客魔幻列車」巡迴全國北中南東各地，由本院教育團隊親自走訪城鄉推廣博物館教育，以博物館數位資源及 STEAM 教案為內容，適時結合原住民族在地文化與傳統技藝，開創行動教學模式，擴大推廣至中小學校內課程。為求達到虛實整合的學習效果，本院積極透過與民間企業及教育團體的協作，邀請偏鄉學子實際回訪本院或地方展區，連結線上線下學習到的藝術美感與文物知識，以期促進多元化社會共榮與族群文化平權之目標。
3. 108 年首度為心智障礙朋友設計故宮易讀版導覽手冊共計二冊，由心智障礙者擔任專業顧問，協助測試與審稿，圖文排版皆運用歐盟及各國推行的易讀易懂 (Easy Read) 原則設計，適用對象擴及兒童、高齡者及一般觀眾，實踐資訊平權及文化近用的觀念，同時首次開發臺灣版易讀易懂的識別圖示，作為心智障礙者參觀各博物館、藝文及其他場館使用的友善指南，並可從官網分享及自行下載運用。
4. 本院南部院區為提升文化平權服務品質，除依法設立無障礙專用停車服務設施外，另建立全方位無障礙接駁服務流程，由現場保全人員主動通報或遊客自行通報遊客服務中心，本院即派遣免費接駁車到院區協助接駁到館內參觀，並由館內第一線服務人員協助購票及參觀。

身心障礙團體導覽

本院持續服務身心障礙團體，108 年度提供來院參觀身心障礙團體導覽解說服務計 59 團次，2129 人次參與。此外，本院亦積極主動走出故宮服務身心障礙學童。自 106 年起，本院執行文化部「友善故宮・學習無礙—到校服務推廣活動計畫」，以本院典藏及展覽為基礎，結合國內各級特殊教育學校及在地文化團體或單位，共同走進特殊教育學校的場域，依照各身心障礙類別之特殊需求，並結合在地文化特色，設計主題教育活動。自 106 年起，本院執行文化部「友善故宮・學習無礙—到校服務推廣活動計畫」，以本院典藏及展覽為基礎，結合國內各級特殊教育學校及在地文化團體或單位，共同走進特殊教育學校的場域，依照各身心障礙類別之特殊需求，並結合在地文化特色，設計主題教育活動。

院外無障礙導覽服務

本院多年來延續辦理赴院外服務身心障礙學生之教育推廣活動，108 年 5 月，本院至臺中市立臺中特殊教育學校舉辦「中特走馬看花趣—小勇者的故宮藝文之旅」，服務該校師生與鄰近身心障礙學校及社福團體共 19 場次，總計 466 人次參與。108 年 10 月與臺北市立啟明學校合作，辦理「跨越障礙・觸摸美麗—臺北啟明到校服務活動」，共計 6 場次，服務 162 人次。

樂齡觀眾服務

1. 108 年持續擴大樂齡觀眾服務對象，除與臺北市及新北市安養護中心、社區敬老院合作辦理各項樂齡講座與活動、邀請長者來院參觀等服務，並繼續開拓在地與跨區域之院外機構如區域健康中心、社福慈善單位、社區大學等合作客製化樂齡系列課程與講座等。108 年和院外單位合作

之樂齡系列課程，包含延續與臺北士林區健康服務中心第二年合作之「樂在故宮 8 月天」（8-9 月）、首次與臺北仁濟院合作二梯次之「故宮尋寶趣」（5-6 月、8-9 月）等課程，結合文物賞析、複製文物觸摸體驗、手感創作課程及來院實地參訪等。另為失智症長者及照顧者，與士林區健康服務中心合作續辦第二年之樂齡團體文物課程。以上由本院教育人員和資深導覽志工針對長者屬性發展之客製化樂齡課程內容，均深獲學員踴躍報名與熱烈好評。108 年共舉辦 41 場樂齡活動，長者參加人次為 927 人。

2. 為推動更多樂齡觀眾接觸故宮文物，擴大服務對象與範圍，並讓故宮文物更加融合於大眾生活中，108 年特別精選本院 8 件經典文物並結合健康操概念，由本院教育人員、資深導覽志工與職能治療師共同討論，由文物發展出適合長者及大眾的健康操動作，讓長者及所有年齡層大眾可透過觀察文物樣貌姿態與健康操運動過程實際操作，與文物在單純視覺賞析外產生進一步肢體等多感官之對應感受，並達到同時促進文化涵養與身心健康的效果。本院於 108 年 11 月 28 日發表國寶動動操及 MV 與動作示範影片，未來將結合樂齡文物課程等活動持續應用推廣國寶動動操，讓民眾享受多元的文物教育推廣活動，並與故宮文物產生更多生活化之連結。

低度參與觀眾服務

1. 本院為提升多元族群之文化參與，結合社工師、藝術治療師、戲劇治療師、社區戲劇工作者等，共同為資源不足的朋友策劃「藝術關懷行動計畫」(The Arts Care Project)，將故宮文物意涵轉化到個人生命經驗之藝術創作，以促進身心健康及社會參與，對象包括精神障礙者、心智障礙者及安置兒童青少年等，合作單位為臺北市立陽明教養院、臺北市三玉啟能中心、新北市慈芳關懷中心等社會福利單位，共計 55 場次，服務 804 人次。
2. 為將文化資源傳遞至臺灣偏鄉地區，今年 8 月至與臺東地區「國立臺灣史前文化博物館」合作，舉辦「走進實幻之島—故宮 × 史前數位遊樂場」微型數位展覽，時間為 108 年 8 月 16 日至 25 日，總參觀人數為 5,110 人次，同時辦理絹印工作坊，共 120 人參與；另外，8 月 20 日至 24 日為臺東當地安置兒少機構及弱勢家庭兒童「私立臺東基督教阿尼色弗兒童之家」、「孩子的書屋」舉辦戲劇營隊，用活潑、有趣的方式開啟青少年對博物館的興趣，服務 105 人次，團隊結合臺北及花東地區博物館、戲劇、教育、社工專業人員共同執行，並於 8 月 25 日舉辦「博物館戲劇共融工作坊」，培力在地博物館、教育、社工、戲劇等領域專業人才，共 20 人參與。
3. 為增進偏鄉學子到訪故宮參訪學習機會，實踐文化平權，提升臺灣學子之美感體驗及文化藝術鑑賞能力，引發學子對藝術興趣，透過「故宮遊藝思—學子嗨 FUN 參訪北部院區」專案，邀請全國高中以下學子參訪故宮，總計 133 間學校，6,660 名師生受惠。
4. 加強文化扎根與多元互動，及豐富學子藝文體驗經驗，使之親近並善用博物館學習資源，邀請中南部各級學校到館參觀，透過「百萬學子悠遊博物館專案平臺」申請及搭配專題展廳導覽加手作體驗 DIY，獲得完整美感學習經驗；本案提供中南部地區學校接駁服務，108 年以嘉義縣市國中小學生優先進館。108 年共計 314 間次學校參訪，共 24,819 位學子受惠，其中包含 80 間偏鄉學校，3,962 人次參與，並針對偏鄉學校加強宣傳及優先錄取。
5. 本院南部院區為推動展覽普及化，使鄰近嘉義社區的民眾能更瞭解及親近南院所辦的展覽，與臺灣創價學會 (Taiwan Soka Association) 一同辦理「送藝術到社區」計畫，自 108 年 9 月中起，深入嘉義縣市多所國中小及樂齡社區、鄉鎮市公所、文教基金會等機構進行南院的展覽、園區景觀及交通資訊宣傳與推廣。

6. 為呼應國際博物館學會 (ICOM) 在 2020 年訂定的國際博物館日主題：多元與共融，舉辦「療癒博物館：故宮文化平權全臺巡迴講座」，地為全臺北中南東之博物館、大學、醫療院所等場所，共 11 場，總計 612 人參與。

教育巡迴展

1. 與蘭陽博物館合作，於 108 年 6 月 14 日至 9 月 3 日「生態想想—故宮 × 臺博 × 蘭博聯合特展」中，規劃「深海食堂」教育推廣微型展（該館大廳）及「海洋想想」、「藝遊自然」等 6 堂生態教育及藝術教育系列推廣活動。微型展參觀人次為 92,185 人，教育活動參與人次為 169 人次。
2. 延續「故宮藝術陪伴計畫」，與法務部誠正中學合作辦理「非行少年藝術飛行計畫」，以本院文物為核心，結合誠正師資與外部藝文、職涯探索專業團隊，自 4 月至 11 月辦理展前教育活動如教師研習、文物導賞、藝術手作、戲劇教育、音樂創作、職業體驗、動力自造等 81 堂課程，服務人次約 838 人次，108 年 12 月於該校禮堂辦理「聽見上河的聲音」故宮非典型教育展，總計含企業、學校等觀眾參訪及教育活動等總計 1,166 人次，展期間臉書行銷貼文與館校跨域成果影片分享瀏覽觸及率為 251,455 人次。

Educational Outreach

To fulfill our educational purpose and to help viewers appreciate the beauty of our collection, the NPM has created a wide range of activities to serve members of the public of all ages and all regions.

◆ Visitor Services

The NPM has continued the new fee system implemented in January 2018. At the same time, in order to more broadly promote museum education, free admission is provided to the following groups: visitors who are under the age of 18 or over the age of 65 (on weekdays), visitors who have proof of being physically and mentally challenged, and visitors who have an official school registration from the Ministry of Education.

In 2019, the Northern Branch provided free admission to a total of 217,108 foreign nationals under the age of 18; 40,907 nationals under the age of 18; 60,505 domestic students; and 13,352 people with disabilities and their companions. The Southern Branch provided free admission to a total of 30,611 visitors under the age of 18; 16,097 students visiting independently; 45,766 students visiting as part of a group; and 10,147 people with disabilities and their companions.

In addition, in response to the government's expansion of tourism policies for Taiwanese nationals during autumn and winter, the NPM launched the "Travel to the NPM" program in September 2019. The program included free admission for two Taiwanese nationals visiting together and all nationals over the age of 65, as well as other preferential measures such as ticketing and museum shop discounts in both the Northern and Southern Branches.

Extended Opening Hours

To alleviate crowding and improve the quality of the visiting experience, the NPM has continued to offer extended opening hours. The Northern Branch is open daily at 8:30 AM and closes at 6:30 PM. On Fridays and Saturdays, closing time is extended to 9:00 PM.

The Southern Branch is 9:00 AM and closes at 5:00 PM, Tuesdays to Sundays. Starting May 1, 2019, on national holidays as well as Saturdays and Sundays the closing time is extended to 6:00 PM.

In addition, in order to encourage Taiwanese citizens to visit the NPM during off-peak hours, nationals can visit the Northern Branch free of charge after 4:30 PM, and residents of Chiayi County and Chiayi City can visit the Southern Branch free of charge after 3:00 PM.

Visitor Services

A. Information Desk: Information about the NPM and its exhibitions is available in Chinese, English, and Japanese. In 2019, the Northern Branch of the NPM answered 210,513 on-site requests and 3,710 telephone enquiries. The Southern Branch answered 433 online enquiries and 16,962 telephone enquiries.

B. Gallery Service: On-site service is available on the B1 floor and the first floor of the Main Exhibition Building to provide visitors immediate service and to shorten their time in navigating exhibitions and other resources.

C. Wireless Internet Service: Wireless internet access is available in all public areas.

Brochures and Pamphlets

A. The quarterly NPM Newsletter is available in Chinese, English, and Japanese, providing its readers the latest information on exhibitions, outreach activities, publications, and visitor information. Copies are mailed to libraries, hotels, cultural institutions, and travel agencies. Four issues were published in 2019 with a total of 76,000 copies.

B. Posters, programs, and educational pamphlets are printed for special exhibitions and activities to enhance the effectiveness of related educational outreach.

C. In 2019, a total of 900,000 copies of museum maps were printed, available in Chinese, English, Japanese, Korean, Thai, Vietnamese, and Indonesian. The texts are adjusted and compiled according to changes in exhibitions, events, and facilities in the museum.

Response to Visitors' Feedback

A. Response to Visitors' Feedback: In 2019, the Northern Branch received 234 visitor suggestions and comments. Sixty of them were related to the exhibitions, 39 to the facilities, and 135 to service quality. The Southern Branch received 222 visitor suggestions and comments. Among them, 48 were related to the exhibitions, 94 to facilities, and 80 to service quality. There were 1,075 inquiries made through the Facebook page. The Facebook page reached an average of one-hour response with a response rate above 90%, a testament to the NPM's commitment to quality customer service.

B. Monthly Meetings for Improvement in Service Quality: NPM-wide meetings are held regularly to address issues brought up by visitors and to come up with solutions to better the service and exhibition quality.

C. Annual Visitor Satisfaction Survey: According to the Annual Visitor Satisfaction Survey, in 2019, 93.6% of interviewed visitors at the Northern Branch and 93.5% of interviewed visitors at the Southern Branch expressed overall satisfaction with their experience at the NPM.

◆ Art Seminars

Northern Branch

To cultivate an understanding among the public for Chinese art, the NPM's collection, and the artistic beauty of life, the NPM regularly organizes artifacts seminars. The 2019 Winter Art Seminar was held from February 14 to 16. The Summer Art Seminar was held from August 15 to 17. The Summer Cultural Relics Workshop, held from July 22 to 23, was co-organized with the Taipei City Library. On August 3, August 31, and September 7, the NPM co-hosted the lecture series "Treasures of the NPM × the Pleasures of Learning in National Central Library" With the National Central Library. On September 22, the NPM co-sponsored a lecture with the Hsinchu County Archive of Cultural Affairs Bureau. A total of 32 lectures were held in 2019, and 6,511 participants attended. ◆ Artistic Performances and Activities

NPM Southern Branch Afternoon Tea" Performing Arts Event

The NPM continues to cooperate with the Yunlin County Government, Chiayi County Government, Tainan Municipal Government, and local cultural and educational institutions to handle education promotion and cultural exchange activities in the Southern Branch; to create a high-quality environment for art; to invite local art and school groups to perform at the museum and strengthen cooperation and links with the local community; and to promote local arts and cultural groups. Every Saturday at 3:00 P.M., the "NPM Southern Branch Afternoon Tea" performing arts event was held. In 2019, 49 sessions were held, and a total of 36,761 visitors attended the events. The performances covered a wide range of artistic content, such as Chinese and Western music, dance, opera, folk art, and magic shows.

Managing the NPM "Asian Art Festival"

The third annual "Asian Art Festival" held in the Southern Branch of the NPM, which this year had the theme "NPM Asian Art Festival 2019--Thai Month," was co-organized with the Thai Trade and Economic Office Taipei. The one-month special event featured a series of multicultural events, performances, special exhibitions, lectures, film screenings, themed book fairs, as well as cultural and creative markets. More than 28,000 people participated in the event, while more than 120,000 people visited the Southern Branch that month. The festival featured a performance of the Thai masked dance drama "Khon," a masterpiece of cultural tradition, which is included in UNESCO's list of Intangible Cultural Heritage. It also featured a unique fashion show showcasing the designs of Queen Sirikit of Thailand. The eight "traditional" national costumes enabled the audience to explore "familiar and unfamiliar Thailand" in innovative ways.

“Cross-Domain Experiment Show” Plan

In order to promote the integration of the NPM and contemporary culture, and to bring the museum's cultural relics closer to the public, since the beginning of 2018 the museum has promoted the “NPM Weekend Night Performing Arts Activities” as a “cross-domain experimental performance program.” The program invites contemporary performing artists, visual artists, and other professionals to develop creative and innovative programming using the NPM's exhibitions and cultural relics as inspiration. Public events like these turn the NPM into a platform for contemporary cultural performance that provides the public with educational activities and multi-sensory experiences, creating a richer and more exciting museum. In 2019, a total of 30 performances were held and 12,000 people attended, as listed below:

“The NPM Carnival” Treasure Hunt Experience

In order to attract young people to the NPM and encourage the integration of different disciplines, the NPM combined the museum's cultural relics with an orienteering competition during “The NPM Carnival” in collaboration with the Chinese Taipei Orienteering Association. The activity combined cultural relics with fun competitions, quizzes, and other activities. The Taiwanese orienteer Huang Min-hui served as the torch ambassador for the event. The NPM invited the Taiwan Soka Association, the Shung Ye Museum of Formosan Aborigines, Taipei City Chih Shan Junior High School, Taipei Wesley Private Girls High School, and other nearby schools to participate. Professionals, youths, parents, and children from different ethnic groups attended the event. Combining the cultural heritage of the NPM with orienteering, the activity was a multicultural experience that attracted new audiences to participate in museum education activities. It was held on Saturday, November 2, 2019, and included nearly 800 participants.

Held “A Carnival of Fantasies: A Special Exhibition of 21st Century Museums at the Southern Branch of the NPM” Tour

The NPM and The General Assembly of Chinese Culture jointly held the Southern Branch carnival to cultivate the public's habit of visiting museums and promote “A Carnival of Fantasies: A Special Exhibition

of 21st Century Museums at the Southern Branch of the NPM.” Held on December 21, 2019, the Southern Branch carnival combined family-friendly markets and music technology exhibition activities to promote public awareness of cultural relics.

◆ Education and Training

Teacher Empowerment Programs and Educational Resources

A. In coordination with the exhibition “Floral Art for Pleasure--Appreciation of Flower Vessels and Lifestyle,” the Southern Branch held a two-day, one-night teacher training workshop. Through special lectures, exhibition tours, hand-on courses and more, participating teachers were guided into the beautiful world of floral art. Teachers learned how to use museum resources to enrich student learning experiences and improve literacy in fields including the arts and humanities, environmental science, information science, and independent learning. A total of 40 people participated in the workshop.

B. To respond accordingly to the 12-Year Basic Education Curricula Guidelines, the NPM collaborates with schools below the senior high school level. Schools in various regions of Taiwan are invited to plan the curricula of thematic courses using the NPM’s cultural relics, promoting diverse uses of the NPM’s exhibitions to construct a link between the museum and formal education. Teachers are cultivated their abilities to use museum resources for teaching. In 2019, a total of 12 schools and 634 teachers and students participated. The details are as follows:

Creative Workshops for Children, Families, and Youth

A. To promote high-quality educational activities for children, the NPM regularly organizes children’s workshop series with different themes. A total of four sessions were held, with 50 students participating per session, totaling 200 students. In 2019, the “Welcome to the National Palace Museum x Zoo” KPM children’s art creation course was introduced. The workshop series introduced all sorts of creatures hidden in the NPM: birds, beasts, aquatic life, and animals imagined by ancient artists. Children were able to explore the cultural relics to discover animals large and small, surrounded by the auspicious words of the animals and their representatives. In cooperation with the Taipei Zoo, the NPM arranged activities allowing children to expand their cultural horizons through cultural artifacts while connecting with ecological conservation. The course provided children with a wonderful experience full of art, culture, and learning about animal conservation.

B. In order to promote youth engagement, the NPM set up the “Children and Youth Affairs Promotion Meeting” so as to implement youth cultural citizenship and empower younger generations. Experts and scholars in academia, industry, and other fields such as the online community, new media art, digital education, innovation, and technology participated. Also included were two youth representatives and one high school student representative. This public-private partnership platform allows for integration, the reconstruction of internal and external resources, and the comprehensive promotion of youth engagement with the museum through creation, exhibition, education, communication, marketing, and publishing. In 2019, two meetings were held on March 6 and November 19, and the key points, advisory members, and meeting minutes were published on the official NPM website. Six “cross-disciplinary talks” were held on March 7, March 23, November 17, November 23, December 14, and December 21, introducing outside professional knowledge and activating youth business in the museum.

C. To help narrow the distance between the museum and the public, the NPM launched a themed marketing project and strengthened the image of the museum as a public, local, and youthful institution. During the “One Day NPM Film Production and Marketing Case,” a total of six films were shot, receiving a total of more than 1.72 million views. The films are described below:

- (A) “Brother Yulin Comes to Work” went live on September 10, 2019, with over 710,000 views and reaching about 1 million people.
- (B) “Off from Work, Go Have Fun!” launched on September 18, 2019, with a total of over 100,000 views.
- (C) “Investigating Craftsmanship” was launched on September 2, 2019, with a total of over 100,000 views.
- (D) “Secrets of the Trade--Scientific Research” was launched on September 12, 2019, with a total of over 100,000 views.

(E) “Secrets of the Trade--Seeking Technical Perfection” was launched on September 4, 2019, with a total of more than 100,000 views.

(F) “Subverting History” was launched on October 1, 2019, with a total of more than 610,000 views.

D. In order to promote the collection’s cultural relics, expand youth participation, and encourage using aspects of the NPM for artistic cooperation, the NPM cooperated with the Shih Chien University Taipei Campus Department of Fashion Design in the second semester of the 2018 academic year. The program provided students with knowledge of the NPM and created a model for integrating museum artworks with academic classes. The results of the course were a 30-second version of the film “NPM Zoo x Practical Fashion Design” along with a 23-minute full version. As of January 6, 2020, the total number of views was 37,652, reaching 125,892.

E. In conjunction with the special exhibition “The Literati’s Ordinaries,” the NPM collaborated with the domestic youth creative team “inBlooom” to put on four “Hipster Handcraft Workshops” on November 30 and December 7, 2019. inBlooom designed three exclusive NPM drawing boards, using cultural relics to integrate aesthetics. The workshops attracted younger audiences, with a total of 100 people participating in the four workshops.

F. The NPM organizes family activities to complement the museum’s special exhibitions. These include multiple learning methods, such as storytelling theater, family experiences, and DIY activities. These events enhance both parents’ and children’s knowledge of the NPM’s artworks and exhibitions. In 2019, the Southern Branch held 103 events with 22,428 total participants. The Southern Branch’s Children’s Creative Center draws on the collections and exhibitions of the Southern Branch, primarily focusing on “Asian Ceramics,” “Asian Tea Culture,” and “Asian Fabrics.” The “Understanding Asia” 360-degree theater and “Ramayana Theater” highlight the rich cultural characteristics of Asian countries. This year, the “Thai Cultural Theme” and Indian epic 3D animations were launched to encourage children’s interest in learning. The Center welcomed 278,230 visitors in 2019.

G. To celebrate International Museum Day on May 18, the Southern Branch collaborated with the Taiwan Road Race Service Organization for the first time to organize the museum themed “2019 Southern Branch of the National Palace Museum Marathon.” Held on the grounds of the Southern Branch, runners could appreciate the unique architectural aesthetics of the museum during the day and night. The 2019 International Museum Day theme was “Museums as Cultural Hubs: The Future of Tradition.” Through festivals, exhibitions, and holidays in the month of May, this theme was integrated into all museum programming--such as the “In-depth Tour of the NPM Textile Exhibition and Embroidery Creation Experience” and “Flowers, Music, and Taiwanese Tea--An In-depth Tour of Tea Culture in the Southern Branch and Creative Tea Experience.” Four events were held in total, with 150 participants.

H. The Southern Branch held the “2019 Parent-Child Art Month” event, which connected with the exhibition “The Beauty of Interchange: Selections from Japan’s Kobe City Museum,” and additionally launched summer camps, puzzle games, large-scale children’s plays, family art workshops, family drawing lessons, water dance shows, a 3D water curtain magic show, and more. In total, about 110,000 people participated in the events and 300,000 people visited the Southern Branch during the month.

Children’s Gallery

In 2019, the Children’s Gallery received 149,496 visitors. Since its opening on May 18, 2008, the Gallery has attracted a cumulative total of 1,480,942 visitors. In 2020, the transformation plan for the Children’s Gallery 2.0 will be launched. The cultural relics of the NPM will be combined with digital technology to comprehensively update the exhibition content of the Children’s Gallery. The renovation will improve the children’s educational role of the museum and inspire young audiences to appreciate cultural artifacts. Additionally, the new content will conceptually present the image of the NPM, available guided tours, and the beauty of the collection while establishing a new digital model for the museum. In order to improve the quality of family visits, a “Family Friendly Area” will be set up, and the addition of facilities such as breastfeeding rooms and family restrooms will improve visiting experiences.

Taiwan International Forum on Children and Museums

A. Policy Description

The NPM launched the “Hand-in-hand Family Friendly Museum Action” in 2018, connecting Taiwanese museums with designated children’s educational spaces. In 2019, the National Museum of Marine Biology & Aquarium, Tainan Art Museum, and National Museum of Prehistory were added to the action. With a

total of 18 museums involved, the “Second Children’s Virtual Exhibition” was launched on the “Children’s Virtual Museum Portal.” The virtual exhibition spans the fields of art, history, humanities, and sciences, with a total of 20 exhibits. Families are welcomed to come visit the museum in person after viewing the online exhibition and enjoy the rich educational resources inside the museum.

B. Performance

The “2019 Taiwan International Forum on Children and Museums” was held from October 25 to 26 in Wenhuitang Auditorium at the Northern Branch, with the two main topics of “Challenges of Children’s Museums in the New Century” and “Future Trends of Children’s Museums.” Scholars from the Centre Pompidou in France, the National Museum of Korea, the National Gallery of Singapore, and Texas Women’s University gave five keynote speeches. They also engaged with Taiwanese museum experts on topics such as aesthetic education, children’s exhibitions, multimedia technology applications, and cultural equity.

Volunteer Recruitment and Training

In combination with private resources, the NPM recruits people who are interested in art and culture and are willing to assist in museum education and promotion. The NPM actively carries out education training to invest in its volunteers. At the end of December 2019, the total number of volunteers in the Northern Branch was 493 (including 444 adult volunteers, 30 high school volunteers, and 19 elementary school volunteers), and the total number of volunteers in the Southern Branch was 247 (including 217 adult volunteers and 30 elementary school volunteers).

Promoting Aesthetic Education

Since 2014, the NPM has been cooperating with the Ministry of Education to launch a mid-to-long term program in aesthetic education, combining resources from the Northern and Southern Branches to create a variety of educational and promotional activities, and launching the “Aesthetic Education Project.” The project includes three proposals: “Free Admission and Guided Tour for Schools,” “Advancements of Artistic and Aesthetic Experiences, Expertise, and Knowledge for All School Teachers,” and “Overcoming Barriers, Touching Beauty” for students and teachers with disabilities.

In 2019, the NPM applied for a subsidy from the Ministry of Education and worked with Xiangshan Elementary School in Hsinchu City to implement a cooperation project in combination with the NPM’s cultural relic integration curriculum and, in line with the 12-year national basic education concept via aesthetic cultivation, develop cross-disciplinary integrated courses. There were a total of 325 participants.

In order to emphasize the educational function of the museum, the NPM has developed a plan for one million students to visit. As part of the initiative, the NPM has developed cultural experience courses based on the rich artworks and exhibitions in the Southern Branch, enriching cultural and artistic experiences for students who lack resources in central and southern Taiwan. Local schools are also encouraged to visit the museum for guided tours and handcraft workshops. A total of eight courses were developed in 2019, including “Printing the Asia I Know,” “Handmade Memorial Badges,” “Treasure Hunting in the South,” “Carved Flower Box DIY”, “Excellent Porcelain--A Handmade Blue and White Card,” “Jump into Buddhism,” “Roaming the Three Kingdoms,” and “A Big Discovery at the Southern Branch--Magic Cards.” A total of 35,477 people participated in experiential courses.

Internships

In order to cultivate practical experience and workplace skills in college education, the Department of Education, Exhibitions, and Information Services has long provided internships for college students during winter and summer vacations. In 2019, there were 22 interns from institutions, including National Donghua University, National Yunlin University of Science and Technology, Taipei National University of Arts, National Taitung University, National Taiwan University, National Taiwan Normal University, National Taiwan University of Arts, Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages, Tunghai University, Tamkang University, and Fu Jen Catholic University.

Museum Talent Development Plan

A. The NPM implemented the “Museum Talent Development Plan” to combine university resources with the

professional needs of museums and jointly promote the cultivation of museum professionals. Through the expansion of cultural participation and industry links, students' knowledge of museums on a professional basis can be improved while strengthening the professional efficiency of museum operations.

B.In 2019, six schools including National Yunlin University of Science and Technology, National Chiayi University, Fu Jen University, Taipei Medical University, Tainan University of Applied Sciences, and Wenzao Ursaline University of Foreign Languages participated in seven different plans. These plans involved inviting researchers from the NPM, professional workshops, special lectures, professional tours, internship positions, the production of cultural and creative products, and educational promotion. A total of 34 events were held.

C.In order to establish long-term internship and cooperation relationships, the Southern Branch of the NPM cooperates with universities and colleges in the central and southern regions, such as National Chin-Yi University of Technology, National Chiayi University, National Kaohsiung University of Science and Technology, Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages, and Tainan University of Technology. The internship program combines the cultural relics of the Southern Branch with local humanities programs, cultivating future museum professionals and expanding exhibition content. A total of 131 students participated in the internship.

◆ Educational Activities for Disadvantaged Groups

In order to enhance the opportunities for diverse, multicultural participation, the NPM promotes visits and educational activities through the concept of social inclusion and actively communicates with international museums to enhance visibility. The 2019 social inclusion service status of the museum is described as follows:

Related Measures to Improve Cultural Accessibility

A.In recent years, the NPM has been committed to improving the cultural access of various audiences. For example, when hearing-impaired people visit, they can use a multimedia guide with Taiwan Sign Language (TSL). The visually impaired can use audio description guides, tactile maps, and braille book. Visually impaired visitors can also apply for assistive tools such as "Cross Barriers · Touch the Beauty" educational activities, with lively guides, and touch reproductions of original cultural relics. In addition, the NPM also cooperates via permanent exhibitions and special exhibitions, aids for the visually impaired, and proactively reaching out to the public, such as educational activities design for elders and disabilities. In addition, people who cannot visit in person can also use online learning resources created by the museum to explore the museum at any time. The NPM established the "NPM Education Channel" in 2014, focusing on digital content promotion for primary schools and education areas. From 2018 to 2019, in response to the implementation of the 2019 syllabus for elementary and junior high schools and the Ministry of Education's aesthetic education program, the NPM's "NPM-Maker Magic Train" toured the country's northern, central, and southeast areas. In all these places, the education team personally visited urban and rural areas to promote museum education. The museum's digital resources and STEAM lesson plans were used, and indigenous cultures and traditional skills of local peoples were combined to create teaching models and expand the curriculum to primary and secondary schools. Students from rural areas are invited to return to the museum or local exhibition areas through collaborations with private institutions and educational organizations to connect the cultural relics online and offline while promoting diversity. The goal of the initiative is social co-prosperity and ethnic cultural equality.

B.In 2019, for the first time, the NPM designed two guidebooks for mentally challenged visitors. With such, mentally challenged people served as professional consultants to assist in testing and reviewing the books. The graphic layout is based on the principle of Easy Read implemented by the European Union and other countries. They are applicable to children, the elderly, and general audiences, and implement the concepts of equal rights and cultural use, developing Taiwanese versions of easy-to-understand icons so visitors can attend museums and arts institutions with ease. The guides can be shared on the official website and downloaded for use in the museum.

C.In order to improve the quality of cultural affirmation services, in addition to establishing barrier-free parking facilities in accordance with the law, a comprehensive barrier-free connection service was established at the Southern Branch. The museum offers free shuttle buses to assist visitors in getting to the museum, and front-line service staff within the museum can help with ticket purchases and visits.

Guided Tour for Disabled Visitors

The NPM continues to provide service for disabled visitors, not only providing guided tours at the museum but also proactively traveling to remote areas to serve students with disabilities. Since 2017, the NPM has implemented the Ministry of Culture's "Friendly NPM: Learning without Disabilities" school service promotion program based on the museum's collections and exhibitions. In conjunction with special education schools at all grades throughout the country and local cultural groups, the NPM caters themed educational activities according to the special needs of each type of disability and to local cultural characteristics.

Accessibility Guided Tour for Those Outside the NPM

Over the years, the NPM has continued to provide education outreach activities for students who are physically and mentally challenged at schools outside of the NPM. In 2019, the NPM organized the "Viewing Flowers from Horseback--Little Yongzhe's Art and Literature Tour of the National Palace Museum" at Taichung Special Education School, serving the school's students and teachers. Nearby special education schools and social welfare organizations also participated, with the program serving 466 people.

Senior Citizen Programs

A.In 2019, the NPM continued to expand audience services for senior citizens. The museum collaborated with local and cross-regional organizations, such as Taipei and New Taipei City care centers, community nursing homes, health centers, social welfare charity units, and senior community colleges to offer customized courses and lectures for senior citizens. In 2019, a number of collaborative courses were offered, including the second "Happy Days at NPM in August" (August-September) with the Taipei Shilin District Health Service Center; the "Treasure Hunt in the NPM" (May-June, August-September) with the Taipei Renji Institute, etc. All courses involved art appreciation, touching replicas, sensory courses, and visits to the museum. The museum also cooperated with the Shilin District Health Service Center to continue customized courses for elders with dementia and their caregivers. Our education staff and senior guide volunteers developed programming according to the different needs of seniors, which was well received. A total of 41 activities for senior citizens were held in 2019, with 927 senior citizens participating.

B.To encourage more senior citizens to learn about the museum's collection, expand service objectives and scope, and integrate the NPM's artworks into everyday life, this year eight master pieces were developed into health exercises by physical therapists, museum education staff, and senior guide volunteers. The exercises were designed to be suitable for the elderly and were inspired by the museum's collection so that seniors and the general public can learn about artworks while exercising. The program simultaneously promotes cultural cultivation and physical and mental health. The national treasure exercises were announced on November 28, 2019. In the future, the museum will continue to apply and promote the national treasure exercises in conjunction with senior programs, so that the public can establish connections to the museum.

Social Disadvantage Groups Service

A.In order to enhance the cultural participation of the diverse community, our collaboration with social workers bring together art therapists, drama therapists, and community drama workers to jointly plan "The Arts Care Project." The program targets socially disadvantaged groups, including, mentally challenged individuals, adults with learning disabilities, and adolescents from foster homes. The program transforms the cultural relics of the NPM into artistic creations to promote physical and mental health and social participation. A total of 55 sessions were held, with 804 people participating.

B.To spread cultural resources to rural areas of Taiwan, from August 16 to 25, the mini-digital exhibition "Entering the Island of Real Fantasy-- NPM x NMP Digital Playground" was held in cooperation with the Taitung National Museum of Prehistory. A total of 5,110 people attended. At the same time, a silkscreen workshop was conducted with a total of 120 participants. From August 20 to 24, a drama camp was held for local private children's institutions and vulnerable families in Taitung, including the Private Taitung Christian Anisepher Children's Home and Children's Book House. The lively and fun program served 105 people. On August 25, a "Museum of Drama and Theater Integration" workshop was held, with 20 local professionals working in the museum, education, social work, and drama fields participating.

C.The Fun NPM--Hi Fun Visits the Northern Branch

In order to broaden opportunities for students from different parts of Taiwan to visit the NPM, practice

cultural equity, enhance the aesthetic experiences of Taiwanese students, and support students' appreciation of culture and art, students from lower secondary schools nationwide were encouraged to visit the NPM. In 2019, a total of 133 schools were invited to visit the museum, benefiting 6,660 teachers and students.

- D.To strengthen cultural roots, enrich students' experiences with art and the humanities, and utilize the NPM's learning resources, the NPM invited schools in the central and southern regions to visit the Southern Branch through the "Million Students Touring the Museum Project." Special tours and DIY projects gave visitors a complete aesthetic learning experience. In 2019, primary and middle school students in Chiayi County and Chiayi City were given priority access. A total of 314 school visits benefited a total of 24,819 students. This number included 3,962 students from 80 rural schools, which enjoyed enhanced publicity and priority admission.
- E.To popularize exhibitions in the Southern Branch, the NPM worked with the Taiwan Soka Association on the "Send Art to the Community Project." Since mid-September 2019, the partnership has conducted in-depth exhibitions, park landscapes, and traffic information publicity and promotion of the Southern Branch in schools and to senior citizens in Chiayi County, as well as in other towns, townships, and cultural and educational foundations.
- F.In response to the 2020 International Museum Day theme of "Diversity and Inclusion" set by the International Council of Museums (ICOM), the "Healing Museum: National Palace Museum Cultural Equity Tour Seminar" was held at museums, universities, and medical institutions in Taiwan. A total of 11 sessions hosted 612 people.

Educational Touring Exhibitions

- A.In cooperation with the Lanyang Museum, from June 14 to September 3, 2019, "Eco-Rethink: NPM × LYM × NTM Joint Exhibition" planned a "Deep Ocean Canteen" mini-exhibition, and ecological and art education activities such as "Ecology of the Ocean," and "Art Nature Tour". There were 92,185 visitors to the mini-exhibition and 169 participated in the educational activities.
- B.Continuing the "NPM Art Accompaniment Project," and cooperating with Chengzheng High School of the Ministry of Justice, the "Young offender Art Flight Plan" was held. With the museum's cultural relics at the core, the project combined Chengzheng faculty with external art professionals. From April to November, pre-show education activities were held, such as teacher workshops, cultural relic tours, drama education, musical creation, professional experiences, and more. There were 81 courses held, serving about 838 people. From December 20 to 29, the school's auditorium held the "Able to Hear the Sound of the River" atypical education exhibition with the NPM, which attracted 1,166 visitors and educational activities by companies and schools. Video sharing of the event reached 251,455 views.

本院典藏文物蘊含無盡的藝術價值，更是我國發展文化創意產業最重要的活水源頭。近年來積極鼓勵文創業者利用本院文化創意資產開發商品、協助產業活用典藏文物，讓富涵文物元素之創作走入民間生活；另加強多元行銷及授權推廣，並加強文創人才之培養，健全文化創意法令，對我國文創行銷工作之推廣與落實，成效顯著。

◆鼓勵廠商利用故宮文化創意資產開發文創商品

合作開發

108 年與本院合作開發各類文創商品之廠商，最高時期有 113 家，截至 12 月底為 104 家，合作開發商品品項共 2,042 種；營業總額約新臺幣 341,794,954 元整，總計銷售 1,416,281 件。

出版授權

108 年底仍在契約期限內共計 12 家廠商，授權出版品 46 種，權利金收入共計新臺幣 36,641,005 元。

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品牌授權統計至 108 年 12 月 31 日止，履約中之品牌授權廠商共計 26 家，品牌授權簽約金收入合計新臺幣 2,500,000 元，商標授權金（即銷售回饋金）為新臺幣 17,516,758 元。

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圖像授權案件統計至 108 年 12 月 31 日止，共計 195 件，權利金收入共計新臺幣 5,910,354 元。

◆多元行銷商品及授權推廣故宮文化創意資產

引進專業廠商經營博物館商店

本院北部院區商店、南部院區商店及網路商城服務委託經營管理案於 106 年 8 月整合成本院附設博物館商店暨網路商城服務委託經營管理案，107 至 108 年持續履約執行，108 年度營業總額約新臺幣 561,828,306 元（含稅）。

參與國際展會活動，拓展國際營銷通路

為持續推廣本院品牌及文物衍生商品形象，參與第 27 屆臺北國際書展、德國法蘭克福國際書展、第 39 屆美國拉斯維加斯國際授權展、第 12 屆海峽兩岸著作權論壇等等國際展會，以積極拓展國際市場及授權版圖，並向世界各地遊客宣傳推廣本院品牌形象。

透過網路，擴大行銷推廣面向

本院已建置網路商城多年，每月約 170 萬營業額。另故宮精品 Facebook 在 108 年底已累積約 10 萬多名粉絲人數，擁有豐沛之社群網路能量。此外，108 年 11 月於 Pinkoi 電子商務設計平臺上架，藉此電子商務平臺將吸引到不同族群客戶，有助於提升基金經營績效及本院文創品牌形象效益。

委託承銷

為擴大本院文創商品通路，本院除本院北部院區、南部院區及網路商城外，同時與其他承銷商簽訂委託承銷契約，透過各特色廠商申請設置專櫃之方式進行銷推廣，達成博物館教育推廣之目的。108 年履約中之委託承銷商計 20 家，承銷商設店位置遍及全臺各地。

國際圖像授權代理商授權合作

108 年合作廠商為法國 RMN 公司、北美地區 Art Resource 公司、亞洲地區朗智品牌公司及日本地區 DNPAC 公司。

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◆自行印製及發行出版品

108 年本院出版品銷售營業額為 73,374,675 元，總計銷售 169,434 冊。出版之新書包括圖書類 17 種、期刊類 15 冊（如下表），以及創意出版品如手做立體卡片、故宮文物大月曆等。

◆生活產業品牌專案合作

為落實本院年輕化及在地化政策，並同時推廣本院文化創意資產，積極與國內生活產業品牌專案合作，以吸引更多族群認識故宮。

108 年本院與茶湯會股份有限公司聯名合作，該公司使用本院文物圖檔「八段錦」及花卉古畫等製作 5 款功夫主題杯，5 款總計印製 1,400 萬杯，使用於全省 210 間門市，該公司並同時搭配各門市布置、每個月網路行銷活動等加強曝光效益。本項合作將本院文物圖像帶入全臺茶湯會各門市，短時間內大量又密集的露出，有效提升本院文物之能見度並且深入地方民眾生活，落實年輕化及在地化政策。

◆侵權維護

本院於 108 年分別委託 2 家專業律師事務所積極處理國內外包含海峽兩岸、跨境侵權案件，及智慧財產權及其他權利受侵害之法律諮詢專業服務案，維護本院權利。

主動侵權查緝

108 年以本院人氣文物及暢銷商品，如：朕知道了紙膠帶商品、翠玉白菜、肉形石、毛公鼎、郎世寧、臺北故宮、四庫全書等關鍵詞為查緝範圍，查察大陸地區網路購物平臺侵權商品皆已下架。

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本院未開放之典藏文物圖像及其他智慧財產權（如商標權、專利權、著作權等），使用人若侵害本院權益者，本院仍將分別就司法追訴及公務協助兩方面進行救濟，以維護權益。

◆國寶衍生商品設計競賽

107 年至 108 年持續以「NPM AWARD」競賽品牌辦理第八屆競賽活動，本屆設計競賽以「民俗節慶」為主題，以故宮 Open data 資料開放平臺的精選文物為發想，高中職以上（含）及社會人士皆可參加，為擴大影響力，本屆更首次開放非本國籍投件，廣邀國內外設計好手馳騁設計，結合藝術與生活，擴展故宮文化附加價值，為故宮典藏文物發掘跨世代與跨國界的新詮釋。

◆文創人才培育

與國立臺灣科技大學合作，由該校編列預算設計「生活空間創意學分學程—文物與創新」課程，108 學年度自 108 年 9 月 12 日至 109 年 1 月 9 日開設為期 1 學期 3 學分之課程，課程總計 18 週，本院並配合提供文物、文創實務及參觀導覽共計 9 週 27 小時，約 360 人次參與。

◆檢討法規，完善廠商與本院之合作機制

本院於 108 年 5 月及 7 月停止適用「藏品圖像授權圖檔借用須知」及「智慧財產權維護小組設置要點」，並著手修正影音及圖像等授權規範，以讓授權規定與時俱進。

另於 108 年 7 月停止適用「出版品寄銷須知」，院外出版品寄銷可依出版品主題內容與本院典藏、展覽、業務運作之關係衡酌是否接受申請再請博物館商店銷售。

Cultural Creativity Development

The NPM's collection of cultural relics has endless artistic value, and it is a source of inspiration for the cultural and creative industry in Taiwan. In recent years, the NPM has actively encouraged the development of merchandise, the use of the collection of cultural relics, adding value to cultural heritage, the strengthening of multi-marketing and licensing, and the cultivation of cultural and creative talents. The improvement of cultural and creative laws and regulations has led to remarkable achievements in the promotion and implementation of Chinese cultural and creative marketing work.

◆ Encouraging Manufacturers to Use the NPM's Cultural and Creative Assets to Develop Goods

Cooperative Development

In 2019, cooperation with the NPM led to the development of various types of cultural and creative goods. At its peak, there were 113 companies cooperating with the museum. At the end of December 2019, there were 104 companies, and 2,042 kinds of jointly developed products. The total revenue was about NT\$341,794,954 from the sale of 1,416,281 items.

Publication Licensing

At the end of 2019, a total of 46 copyrighted items were licensed to 12 companies, for a total of NT\$36,641,005 in royalty revenues.

Brand Licensing

As of December 31, 2019, the NPM has 26 companies under contract. This generated NT\$2,500,000 in revenue from signing bonus and NT\$17,516,758 in royalty revenues.

Image Licensing

As of December 31, 2019, a total of 195 copyrighted images of the NPM's artifacts were licensed for a total royalty revenue of NT\$5,910,354.

◆ Multi-marketing Goods and Licensing to Promote the NPM's Cultural and Creative Assets

Introducing Professional Distributors to Operate Museum Stores

The physical and online shops of the NPM's Northern and Southern Branches were contracted to outside companies for management in August 2017. Such management continued from 2018 to 2019, with a total revenue in 2019 of NT\$561,828,306 (including taxes).

Participating in International Exhibition Activities and Expanding International Marketing Channels

In order to continue the promotion of the NPM's brand and cultural relics worldwide, the museum participated in the 27th Taipei International Book Exhibition, the Frankfurt Book Fair, the 39th Las Vegas Licensing Expo, the 12th Cross-Strait Copyright Forum, and other international exhibitions.

Expanding Marketing Promotion through the Internet

For many years, the NPM has had an online store with revenues totaling around NT\$1,700,000 per month. Additionally, the NPM's museum shop Facebook page accumulated more than 100,000 fans by the end of 2019 and has abundant social networking influence. In addition, the NPM was added to the Pinkoi e-commerce design platform in November 2019. This e-commerce platform attracts customers from different groups, which helps improve the operating performance and the NPM's cultural and creativity brand image.

Merchandising

To expand the sales channel for cultural and creative goods of the NPM, in addition to the Northern Branch, Southern Branch, and online shop, the NPM also signed contracts with other underwriters for commissioned

sales. Vendors can apply to set up special counters for marketing and promotion to fulfill the NPM's goal of educational promotion. In 2019, 20 underwriters were commissioned and the counters they set up are located throughout Taiwan.

Collaborating with International Image Licensing Agents

In 2019, the NPM collaborated with RMN of France, Art Resource of North America, Long Wise Inc. Ltd. of Asia, and DNPAC of Japan.

Database Marketing

On January 1, 2019, the NPM made its academic publications, catalogues, and other publications open to the outside world through application for non-exclusive authorization, which can be further planned as products or services.

◆ Museum Publications

In 2019, the sales revenue of museum publications was NT\$73,374,675 with a total sales volume of 169,434 copies. The new publications include 17 books, 15 periodicals (see the following table), and creative publications, such as the NPM pop-up flower card set, the NPM calendar (on the theme of cats), and more.

◆ Brand Project Collaboration in the Lifestyle Industry

In order to act on the NPM's youthfulness and localization strategies, and promote cultural and creative assets of the museum, the NPM actively cooperates with domestic lifestyle industry brands to attract groups to know the NPM.

In 2019, the NPM cooperated with TP TEA, which used the NPM's cultural relics, and ancient flower paintings to make 5 kungfu-themed cups. A total of 14 million were manufactured and sold in 210 stores across Taiwan. The company also enhanced exposure by re-designing store layout and launching monthly online marketing activities. This cooperation brought the NPM's cultural relics to all TP TEA stores, effectively improving the visibility of our cultural relics and deepening ties to local people's lives.

◆ Infringement Maintenance

In 2019, the NPM commissioned two professional law firms as our legal advisers to actively handle domestic and foreign legal disputes, including cases regarding intellectual property right infringement and breach of contract in order to protect the rights of the museum.

Active Infringement Investigation

The NPM uses keywords such as "washi tape," "Jade Cabbage," "Meat-shaped Stone," "Mao Gongding," "Lang Shining," "Taipei NPM," "Siku Quanshu," and so forth to investigate online infringement of the museum's popular cultural relics and best-selling products. All infringing commodities on shopping-commerce platforms were removed.

Mechanism for the Protection of Intellectual Property Rights of the NPM

Through physical and virtual channels, the NPM investigates: 1) The use of images of cultural relics without the NPM's approval; and 2) The infringement of copyright derived from products and publications developed from the NPM's cultural relics. In order to protect the intellectual property rights of the NPM, the museum claims rights and punitive damages based on international intellectual property laws, fair competition laws, and related civil and criminal laws.

Establishing a Standard Operating Mechanism for Handling Infringement Cases

The NPM possesses still restricted cultural relic images and other intellectual property rights (such as trademark rights, patent rights, and copyrights). If users infringe upon those intellectual property rights, the NPM will file judicial prosecution and seek for assistance from other authorities to protect its rights and interests.

◆ National Treasure Merchandise Design Competition

In 2019, the 8th National Treasure Merchandise Design competition was held for the NPM AWARD with the theme of "Folk Festivals." Participants, of high school age and above, were encouraged to make full use of the resources of the museum's Open Data platform. Foreign and domestic designers were invited to better understand Taiwan's cultural treasures and use their creativity to combine art and life, and discover new interpretations of the NPM's cultural relics across generations and borders.

◆ The Cultivation of Cultural Talents

In cooperation with the Taiwan University of Science and Technology, the school budgeted for and designed the "Lifespace Creative Credits: Heritage and Innovation" course. Held from September 12, 2019, to January 09, 2020, the course offered three credits for one semester. The course lasted 18 weeks. The museum provided access to cultural relics, creative activities, and tours for a total of nine weeks and 27 hours, and about 360 people participated.

◆ Reviewing Regulations and Improving the Cooperation between Manufacturers and the NPM

In May and July 2019, the NPM ceased to apply the "Notices on Borrowing Authorized Images of the NPM's Artifacts" and "Guidelines for the Establishment of Intellectual Property Right Protection Taskforce." Meanwhile, the NPM amends licensing regulations for audio, video, and images to keep related rules up to date.

In addition, the "Notes on the Consignment of Publications" ceased to apply in July 2019. External publication consignment is weighed based on the relationship between the subject matter of the publication and the NPM's collections, exhibitions, and business operations. Those interested are encouraged to contact the museum store for further information.

安全管理

本院為世界重要博物館之一，所典藏者皆為世界特有文化資產，是以妥善保存文物、落實安全管理係本院重要院務之一。其中，監控中心作為院區安全維護之核心，採全年無休、24小時值勤方式運作，由專人搭配七大安全系統等各式科技設備複式監控院區內外；建築周邊亦設有嚴密警衛守望巡邏，全天候保護文物安全，並由安管專業人員執行文物進出戒護和天然災害防備；又為因應日益增加的觀眾，本院亦加強陳列室安全管理及展場秩序維護，以提升參觀品質。另有鑑於防災科技、設備及觀念日新月異，本院除舉辦各項教育訓練、演習外，亦逐步規劃更新各項安全設備，以強化並確保院區典藏文物安全。

◆院區安全維護（含文物運送）

- 由監控中心、駐警隊及展場管理員配合執行院區各項安全維護事宜，以防制及排除院區內一切危安狀況：監控中心全年無休，全天候24小時作業，由中央電腦監控系統掌握院區安全及預警情報資料之蒐集，一旦遇有危安狀況發生，立即以最迅速、最妥適之方式應變處理。其次，駐警隊負責守護文物、執行警戒巡邏、門禁管制，全面防竊、防搶、防制一切不法破壞；管理員負責陳列室之巡查及秩序維護等狀況之發現、反應、通報、初步處理與紀錄，並於災害發生時，負責緊急疏散遊客及逃生應變。
- 實施文物院內移動戒護勤務計235趟次；與警察機關合作，共同實施文物院外移動道路段警衛勤務計57趟次。南部院區108年執行文物運送戒護共計43趟次，勤務執行均正常，零意外事故發生。

◆展場秩序維護

- 入口安全檢查：驗收票口及排隊入口處隨時注意是否有可疑人士，展場入口處設置安檢門，並使用金屬探測器，必要時得視情形要求遊客打開皮包或背包受檢，以防制觀眾攜帶違禁品入場；另每日定時於整點及不定時數次實施陳列室及櫃門安全檢查，確保展場安全。
- 為維護展場秩序，提升遊客參觀品質，採行人流入場管控及分流機制，於驗收票口設置「流量辨識系統」，當進入展場遊客人數達2,800人次時，展場會啟動人流控管措施，分流個人票及團體票依序進入展場，而大門驗票同仁會機動視出館人數控管進入展場遊客人數，俾以維持展場安全。另針對熱門參觀展間實施動線管制，減少擁擠情形，並搭配走動式積極服務，適時舉牌勸導或疏導管理，維持展場秩序。
- 為配合行政院及所屬各機關推動業務委託民間辦理並使本院展場維護及遊客參觀品質能更加提升，自108年1月1日起以委外承攬方式進用人力因應。

◆院區安全系統

- 本院安全防護設施包括盜警系統（紅外線、碎音）、火警偵測系統、文物庫房及展覽陳列室門禁管制系統、閉路電視監控錄影系統、通訊及廣播系統、電梯管制系統、消防滅火系統等7大系統，以科技設備確保本院文物安全無虞。
- 為確保南部院區機電、空調及消防等設備正常運作，業辦理107-108年南部院區水電、空調及消防系統設施操作維護案。另為強化消防安全，增購防煙面罩、滅火器等設備，並於重要機房增設監視器等設備，以增加預警時間。

3. 為確保院區門禁、盜警、監視、消防等設備正常運作，辦理安全設施中央電腦控制系統及火警防災系統設施保養維護案。

4. 安全監控整合系統更新改善：辦理安全設施中央電腦控制系統升級汰換，並汰換陳列室及庫房等重點區域之安全設施不斷電系統。

5. 辦理數位無線電通訊設備採購，以強化通信品質。

Safety and Security

As one of the most important museums in the world, the NPM is a global cultural asset. Properly preserving the collection's cultural relics and implementing safety management is one of the most important functions of the museum. Among them, the Control Center is the core of the safety maintenance for the museum. It operates year-round, 24-hours a day. The museum is equipped with seven safety systems to monitor the inside and outside of the museum area. There are guard patrols around the buildings to protect the safety of cultural relics during all weather conditions, and security professionals are responsible for the protection of cultural relics and natural disaster preparedness. With an increasing volume of visitors, the NPM has also strengthened the safety management of exhibition galleries and improved the quality of visitors' experience. In view of the rapid development of disaster prevention technology, equipment, and concepts, besides conducting various educational training exercises, the museum also plans to gradually update its facilities in order to ensure the safety of its collection.

◆ Gallery Security (Including the Transportation of Artifacts)

- (1) The Control Center, police officers, and exhibition venue administrators cooperate with each other in carrying out various security maintenance matters in the museum area in order to prevent and eliminate all security concerns. The Control Center operates 24 hours a day all year, and the computer monitoring system is in charge of the security of the collection and early warning information in the museum area. The system deals with dangerous situations promptly and in the most appropriate manner. The security guard station is responsible for guarding cultural relics; performing security patrols, access control, comprehensive anti-theft and anti-grab protection; and preventing all forms of destructive actions. The administrator is responsible for the daily gallery check, response, report, and preliminary reaction to any unusual situation; for maintaining order within galleries; and, in the event of emergency or disaster, for evacuation.
- (2) In 2019, museum artifacts were transported by security guards within the museum a total of 235 times, and between the NPM and other exhibition venues with local police officers 57 times. Artifacts in the Southern Branch were transported by guards a total of 43 times. Overall, service execution was normal and no accidents occurred.

◆ Maintaining Order in the Gallery Spaces

- (1) Entrance safety inspection: To provide a high-quality visiting experience, the main entrance is always controlled and monitored. In addition to passing metal detectors, visitors are asked to open their bags for inspection when necessary, so as to prevent visitors from carrying contraband goods into the exhibition area. The staff inspects exhibition rooms and cabinet cases at regular and different times every day to ensure safety within galleries.
- (2) In order to maintain order in exhibition areas and improve the quality of visitors' experiences, the museum implements methods of visitor traffic control and diversion. A "flow detection system" is set up at the checkpoint. When the number of visitors entering the exhibition area reaches 2,800, staff will initiate flow control measures. Visitors with individual tickets and visitors with group tickets will be divided upon entry into the exhibition area sequentially, allowing the staff members to better control the number of visitors in the exhibition hall and maintain safety. Additionally, staff can implement further control measures in popular galleries to reduce crowding and maintain order in the exhibit halls.
- (3) In order to cooperate with the Executive Yuan and affiliated agencies to promote private sector business and to improve the quality of the NPM's maintenance and tourist visits, since January 1, 2019, the labor force has been contracted through outsourcing.

◆ Museum Security System

(1) The museum's safety protection facilities include seven systems: a theft alarm system (with infrared and glass-breaking detection), a fire detection system, an exhibition and storage room access control system, CCTV surveillance, a video system, a communication and broadcasting system, an elevator control system, and a fire extinguishing system. These systems ensure the safety of the collection using scientific and technological equipment.

(2) In order to ensure the normal operation of the mechanical, electrical, air conditioning, and fire protection equipment in the Southern Branch, the museum completed operation cases and maintenance over 2018-2019. In addition, in order to strengthen fire safety, additional equipment such as smoke masks and fire extinguishers were purchased, and monitors were installed in computer rooms to increase early warning time.

(3) Updating and improving the integrated system of safety monitoring involves: upgrading the central computer control system and replacing security facilities in key areas such as exhibition and storage rooms.

(4) In order to ensure the operation of security systems, the museum upgraded and replaced the central computer control system of the safety facilities and the safety facilities of key areas such as galleries and storage facilities were replaced with uninterrupted power systems.

(5) The museum has purchased digital radio equipment to enhance communication quality.

為因應電腦科技發展及全球化之趨勢，本院在「加速行動寬頻服務及產業發展計畫 - 故宮 4G 行動博物館」、「服務型智慧政府推動計畫」與「前瞻基礎建設計畫」等計畫支持下，完成多項數位成果。透過數位科技與多媒體應用，本院以無牆博物館「數位故宮」的角色逐步發展為服務大眾的「行動故宮」，並更進一步發展為「雲端故宮」，期望透過故宮資訊化服務，提供偏鄉民眾透過網路及行動載具觀賞故宮藝術典藏，藉由網路及數位資訊創新政府服務內容，達到文化平權，縮減城鄉數位落差之效益。

◆故宮 Open Data 專區

本院為提升政府資料開放品質、促進故宮資料在教學、個人賞析及營利使用之傳播，特別自 106 年起更新文物精選圖像下載等功能，所有圖像民眾無需申請，不限用途，不用付費，可直接下載使用。迄 108 年 12 月 31 日止，本院 Open Data 專區已開放 130,000 餘張低階文物圖像及 9,723 張中高階文物圖像。

◆前瞻基礎建設計畫

本計畫為本院近年來發展數位領域重要之計畫，將以「數位建設」因應高清畫質、影音串流等技術進展趨勢，讓本院數位內容可隨技術的進步而轉化應用，並呼應開放社會和公共化需求的到來，持續數位化高價值但尚未數位化之文物，進一步推動「資料開放、教育應用、文創發展」等多元面向，以「提升文化創意產業與教育推廣領域應用」，達成「博物館公共化和多樣化利用」的目標，108 年執行情形如下：

普及高畫質服務：

1. 以億萬像素 (Gigapixel) 之高品質，增加重點文物高解析數位化影像產製數量器物類 108 年達 3,327 件，增加圖書文獻類重點文物高解析數位化影像產製數量 100,102 頁。
2. 完成器物 3D 掃描建模 21 件，含青銅器 15 件、瓷器 5 件、珍玩 1 件，以作為未來多媒體展示、學術研究及教育推廣使用。

數位文創轉化應用：

1. 108 年 12 月至臺東縣、屏東縣、高雄市、南投縣、臺南市、彰化縣、雲林縣、臺中市、嘉義縣等縣市偏鄉小學、社區、部落等共計辦理 16 場臺灣原住民暨茶文化巡迴推廣。
2. 製作完成茶文化數位內容影片 1 支與虛擬實境影片 1 支，並辦理臺灣原住民影片製作如《鄒·神話》，另於 108 年 12 月 23 日完成「布農族」影片毛片審查。
3. 108 年上半年因配合原綱要計畫書核定本 (修正版) 調修作業，嗣核備後啟動執行，經於 108 年下半度簽奉核定加速辦理，預計於 109 年上半度完成執行。109 年「新媒體文創產值創造」預定繼續辦理文創品牌代表作品行銷推廣及產值創造。

雲端平臺線上發展：

1. 完成《走近故宮國寶》磨課師課程上架、開課與推廣。
2. 加速故宮雲端平臺文物數位化資料開放至 5,139 筆。

◆服務型智慧政府推動計畫

國家發展委員會於 106 年提出「服務型智慧政府推動計畫」(原「第五階段電子化政府計畫」)，將本院「博物館館校合作教育資料鏈結服務計畫 (107-109)」納入子項。本計畫推動以本院資料為核心，和既有各個機構之教育系統進行鏈結、API 介接、建立博物館各教學體系之間的資料鏈，以求教育資料利用之最大化。透過積極提供更多元之資源線上分享與服務，推動本院、學校、教學系統方、教育主管單位合作，建立資源共享的館校合作教育資料生態圈。根據上述理念，108 年本院教育團隊透過「創客魔幻列車」搭載教案與團隊的方式，巡迴走訪全國 40 所城鄉中小校，共計服務師生人數為 1,226 人，執行博物館 STEAM 教育實地推廣，並辦理博物館數位教育資源教育工作坊 2 場，並產製 20 套件以上中小學創客教案、VR360 博物館創新展示素材、數位遊戲式教材等應用資源，同時進行博物館教育資料之轉製、開發、介接及陸續開放使用等，期擴大博物館資料應用效益，達到館校合作、跨單位教育資料鏈結之計畫目標。

◆故宮教育頻道優化

雲端服務與串流頻道的趨勢，網路世界成為影片與聲音的分享國度，造就影音平臺成為當今數位內容共享的主體之一，因應此趨勢，本院以「故宮教育頻道」為基礎，建構互動影音 Interactive Video 平臺，藉由雲端和串流技術，整合本院、其他博物館和相關藝文學習之影音資源，打造以影音為主 (video-driven)、寓教於樂 (Edu-entertainment) 之博物館影音串流平，主動提供教師翻轉教學和體驗性學習之服務。

◆故宮全球資訊網與社群網站服務

1. 本院全球資訊網提供展覽、參觀、交通、活動及學習等各項即時資訊，108 年瀏覽人數計 833,405 人次，另南部院區資訊網於 108 年下半年導入網站流量數據分析，瀏覽人數計 176,323 人次。而為強化社群網站之服務，以本院正式名稱成立之 facebook 粉絲專頁，主要負責北部院區，截至 108 年 12 月 31 日止粉絲數為 183,859 人，以平均每日新增 80~90 位粉絲 (平均每月新增 2,500 名粉絲) 穩成長中；南部院區粉絲專頁，至 108 年 12 月 31 日止，已吸引超過 120,888 名粉絲。本院粉絲專頁已成為網友與本院間高效率之溝通平臺，在假消息及合併部分真假消息的不實訊息攻擊下，更作為本院主動及積極澄清之有效途徑。除經常作為各級政府機構之表彰案例外，更屢獲報章雜誌報導與推薦，以上互動均能有效與民眾溝通，宣導本院訊息及政策執行的確實成效及實績，更增進民眾對於本院文物的認知達到推廣教育之效。
2. 配合本院北部院區各項展覽、教育活動及服務空間的推出與開放，製作主題導覽網站，透過無遠弗屆的網際網路，將博物館最新的服務資訊提供予民眾，成為民眾觀展前的線上參觀指南、觀展時的數位導覽服務資源及觀展後的線上延伸學習資源，讓民眾快速的、輕鬆的悠遊於博物館優質的網路服務中，享受文化美學終身學習的樂趣。108 年共完成 31 款主題導覽網站，內容如下：

3. 本院近年來積極推動數位多元應用、深化網路服務、結合網路行銷，期望透過網路與數位科技，將博物館的老文物，注入新生命，與民眾生活全方位接軌，並豐富現代人的生活。於網路行銷與推廣部分：發送「故宮電子報」，積極將各項博物館即時資訊，分享予社會大眾。展現成效方面，本院中英文電子報雙週刊至 108 年 12 月底已有 280,199 訂閱數。

◆ 數位成果推廣

本院運用院藏珍品題材作為創作元素，結合新影像技術與互動型態，持續開發多媒體互動裝置、推出新媒體藝術展、建置故宮書畫多媒體室與古畫動漫展示區、發展數位文創影片等，利用豐富多元的數位內容，提供博物館虛實互補之教育經驗，達到寓教於樂的目的，屢獲海內外獎項肯定。本院依上述成果為基礎，走出故宮，積極推廣教育服務，提升博物館專業功能與服務品質，獲得民眾廣大迴響。



Digitization

In response to the development of computer technology and globalization, the NPM is accelerating the implementation of broadband services and technology development projects through the 4G Action Museum of the NPM, the Service-based Smart Government Promotion Project, and the Prospective Infrastructure Plan. Through the application of digital technology and multimedia, the museum has gradually developed the role of a “Digital NPM” as an “Action NPM” serving the public, and further developed the museum into a “Cloud NPM.” Through information services, the museum hopes to provide the public with access to its art collection through the Internet and mobile devices, and to innovate government service content using digital information, striving for cultural equality and reducing the digital gap between urban and rural areas.

◆ Open Data Area of the NPM

In order to improve the quality of publicly accessible government materials and to promote the use of NPM materials in teaching, personal appreciation, and for-profit applications, the museum has updated the accessibility of downloading select digital assets since 2017. All “Open Data” images can be downloaded and used directly, with unlimited use, and without payment. As of December 31, 2019, more than 130,000 low-resolution and 9,723 medium and high-resolution images of cultural relics have been uploaded to the “Open Data Area.”

◆ Prospective Infrastructure Plan

The NPM’s digital infrastructure plans are important projects in the development of the digital field. The museum uses digital infrastructure development to respond to technological advances, such as high-definition image quality and video streaming, so that the digital content of the museum can be applied to the advancement of technology. Responding to an increasingly open society and public demand, the museum will continue to digitize high-value cultural relics and promote the diversity of data and education applications. Aiming to encourage application in the cultural and creative industries as well as education promotion, the plan follows the museum’s goal of publicizing and diversifying the uses of its resources. The implementation of the 2019 plan is as follows:

Popularizing High-Quality Services

- A. In 2019, the number of key cultural relics with high-resolution gigapixel digital images increased by 3,327. The total number of high-resolution digital images of pages in important rare books and documents was increased by 100,102.
- B. The museum has completed 21 high-definition 3D virtual models of selected cultural relics, including 15 bronzes, 5 porcelains, and 1 curio, for future multimedia display, academic research, and education promotion.

Digital Creative Transformation Applications

- A. In December 2019, a total of 16 Taiwanese aboriginal tea and culture tours took place, in Taitung County, Pingtung County, Kaohsiung City, Nantou County, Tainan City, Changhua County, Yunlin County, Chiayi County, Taichung City, and Chiayi County.
- B. The museum produced one digital film on tea culture and one virtual reality video. It also produced the Taiwan aboriginal Zou • Mythology and completed reviewing the film Bunun on December 23, 2019.
- C. In the first half of 2019, after the revision of the original plan, further planning was done before implementation and approval signed in the second half of 2019 to accelerate the process. It is expected to be in the first half of 2020 that execution is finished. In 2020, “New Media Culture and Value Creation” is scheduled to continue handling marketing promotion and creative branding of representative works.

Cloud Platform Online Development

- A. The museum developed the course for “Approaching the National Palace” and its promotion.
- B. The NPM accelerated the digitalization of cultural relics to a total of 5,139 entries.

◆ Service-oriented Smart Government Promotion Plan

In 2017, the National Development Council proposed the “Service-based Smart Government Promotion Plan,” which included the “Museum-School Cooperative Education Service Plan (2018-2020).” This plan actively promotes the use of museum materials and links them with the educational systems of existing institutions and APIs. The plan also involves establishing a data link between the NPM’s various teaching systems in order to maximize the use of its educational materials. Through actively providing diverse resources for sharing and online services, the museum promotes cooperation among colleges and schools, establishing a resource-sharing information link. In 2019, the NPM’s educational team visited 40 urban and rural primary and secondary schools throughout the country with the “NPM Magic STEAM Train,” serving a total of 1,226 teachers and students. In doing so, the NPM carried out teaching plans and promoted STEAM education through digital education workshops and the production of more than 20 sets of teaching plans for primary and secondary schools. Also included were VR360 museum exhibition materials, digital game-based teaching materials, and more. The transformation, development, intermediation, and opening-up of museum educational materials is being carried out with the goal of expanding the use of museum materials and achieving museum-school cooperative education.

◆ NPM Education Channel Optimization

With the rise of cloud services and streaming channels, the Internet has evolved into a world of sharing film and sound, and the audio-visual platform has become one of the mainstays of digital content sharing today. In response, the NPM Education Channel aims to build an interactive video and audio platform that integrates the NPM, other museums, and related art and textual learning through cloud and streaming technologies. Videos of museum education resources are created to provide teachers with instructions and experiential learning.

◆ The National Palace Museum Website and Social Media Presence

(1) The NPM website provides real-time information on exhibitions, visits, transportation, activities, and learning materials. The total number of visitors in 2019 was 833,405. The Southern Branch’s website introduced website analytics in the second half of 2019, recording 176,323 visitors. The NPM Facebook page centers on the Northern Branch. As of December 31, 2019, the total number of fans was 183,859, with an average of 80-90 fans per day (2,500 new fans per month on average), and growing steadily. The separate Facebook page of the Southern Branch has attracted more than 120,888 fans as of December 31, 2019. The museum’s Facebook pages have become highly efficient communication platforms between online visitors and the museum. Recently, they have become an effective outlet for the museum to clarify false information. In addition to being frequently recognized by government agencies at all levels, these interactions have been reported and commended by newspapers and magazines. Using social media, the museum can effectively communicate with the public, publicize results and achievements in information and policy implementation, and further enhance the public’s awareness of its cultural relics to fulfill the NPM’s mission for educational outreach.

(2) In line with the launching and opening of various exhibitions, educational programs, and service spaces in the Northern Branch, the NPM has created theme websites to provide the latest information and services of the museum to the public. This includes information necessary for visiting, digital guides, as well as online extensions of learning resources that can be used both during and after the museum visit. The theme websites allow the public to quickly and easily browse an outline of the excellent services of the NPM, while indulging the pleasure of lifelong learning in culture and aesthetics. In 2019, a total of 31 theme websites were completed as follows:


(3) In recent years, the NPM has actively promoted digital applications, strengthened internet services, and integrated online marketing in hopes of introducing new vitality into the museum’s collection of artifacts, to connect with the daily life of the public, and to enrich modern society. With regards to online marketing and promotion, the NPM sends biweekly electronic newsletters in both Chinese and English to actively share the museum’s latest information with the public. By the end of 2019, the biweekly NPM Chinese and English e-newsletter had 280,199 subscribers.

◆ Promoting Digital Outcomes

Using masterpieces in the NPM collection as creative inspiration, the museum has integrated new audio-visual and interactive technology in order to develop multimedia interactive installations, launch new media art exhibitions, establish the “Multimedia Gallery of Painting and Calligraphy” and the “Painting Animation” exhibition areas, develop digital cultural creative films, and more. Utilizing rich and varied digital content to provide an educational experience that integrates both virtual reality and reality, the museum has accomplished its goal of providing educational entertainment and has won multiple awards for its achievements in Taiwan and abroad. Through these digital outcomes, the NPM has gone beyond museum walls to actively promote educational services and advance its professional role, receiving a widespread response from the public.

New Media Art Exhibition Room 210: The Painting and Calligraphy

Multimedia Gallery in the Northern Branch

Through new media technology exhibitions, the NPM presents innovative digital contents on national treasures and cultural relics, transcending the limitations of time and space, and promoting the collection on an international level. Through these exhibitions, visitors from all over the world can enjoy the museum's cultural relics up close and share in the common cultural heritage. In 2019, the museum organized "The Epitome of Aesthetics--New Media Art Exhibition." The exhibit focuses on six aesthetic aspects (color, proportion, texture, structure, construction, composition) and key artifact characteristics (mounting, themes, artistic conception, narrative, technique, style). It uses new media as an artistic instrument to show the mystery, beauty, and cultural meaning of each artifact. The exhibition was created in collaboration with educational and research institutions as well as other museums, including National Taiwan Normal University's Department of Fine Arts, National Chengchi University's Office of Translating Artistry, the National Taiwan University of Arts' Department of Multimedia and Animation Arts, the Taipei National University of the Arts' School of Theatre Arts, the City University of Hong Kong, and the National Museum of Marine Science & Technology. By combining aesthetic experiences with innovative lines of thought, participants show how diverse styles emerge when there is cross-disciplinary cooperation between museums and schools.

The Multimedia Gallery of Painting and Calligraphy and the Painting Animation Exhibition Area

In 2011, the NPM installed the "Painting Animation" area along the west wall of Gallery 102. The installation uses high-resolution projectors and a seamless technique, creating a wall illuminated with a full-sized projection of a given painting, allowing visitors to situate themselves within the composition through a high-tech environment. This exhibition features nine masterpieces from the NPM's collection, including: Up the River During Qingming; Syzygy of the Sun, Moon, and the Five Planets; Spring Dawn in the Han Palace; Imitating Zhao Bosu's 'Latter Ode on the Red Cliff'; Departure Herald and Return Clearing; Activities of the Twelve Months; One Hundred Horses; Besotted by Flower Vapors; and Su Shi's The Cold Food Observance. The painting animations on display changes seasonally, with four works displayed each year.



◆整體規劃內容

本院擘劃未來六年發展藍圖，以「新故宮—故宮公共化帶動觀光產業發展中程計畫(107-112年)」提報國家公共建設發展計畫，全案總計投入 87.82 億經費，期使打造具公共性的「新故宮」並成為世界級觀光亮點，帶動臺灣觀光產業發展。本案於 106 年 12 月 6 日經行政院核定同意，預期於 113 年建設完成後，將提高南、北院區參觀人數與創造門票收入成長、增加國際及國內參觀者消費產值。

為擴大本院外溢效益、深化故宮國際觀光能量並整備在地觀光質能，本計畫明訂「推動故宮公共化，營造世界級觀光亮點」、「促進臺灣博物館觀光資源整合」及「帶動觀光產業升級與創新」，整體透由景觀優化、展覽創新、活動整合、交通串連、行銷國際 5 個面向，具體規劃子計畫執行內容。

有鑑於蔡英文總統宣示政府將當旅遊產業界最有力的後盾，期許傾力推動觀光，並為求實踐總統對本院南部院區的政見承諾，積極跟進中央政府新南向政策，因此爭取國家公共建設計畫經費支持，預計於建設完成後，將能創新故宮價值，建立臺灣以博物館為核心的觀光產業環境，進而提升臺灣品牌形象，並提供完善資源與服務，讓國際旅客體驗臺灣多元文化，更主動將臺灣文化推介至國際社會。

◆ 108 年計畫執行情形

分項計畫一「故宮北部院區整（擴）建計畫」

1. 北部院區南側基地於 108 年 6 月 24 日臺北市政府召開「臺北市政府古蹟歷史建築紀念建築聚落建築群考古遺址史蹟及文化景觀審議會第 117 次會議」，有關「故宮藝文服務中心預定地文化資產價值審議案」決議解除暫定古蹟及造冊列管，各項工程隨即加速趕工，既有 5 棟建築物耐震補強修繕工程業已完工；「藝文服務中心環境整合統包工程案」於 12 月 16 日決標，於 109 年 1 月 31 日開工。
2. 北部院區北側基地「北部院區整（擴）建計畫委託專案管理技術服務案」歷經 3 次招標無法順利決標後，公共工程委員會建議本院先辦理「先期規劃案」，108 年 4 月 26、27 日公聽會後，決定停辦「廣場入口意象門廊」和「穿透性華表廊道」項目並報院辦理計畫修正，工作內容相對單純，將「先期規劃」及「專案管理」併案招標，業於 10 月 29 日決標，11 月 12 日開工。

分項計畫二「故宮國寶文物修復展示館建設計畫」

1. 「故宮國寶文物修復展示館工程」執行情形：
國寶館先期規劃案第二階段成果報告於 108 年 9 月 18 日審查通過，國寶館主體建築工程業於 108 年 6 月 25 日將代辦協議書與招標文件資料函文予營建署委託代辦；10 月 7 日設計監造標決標；至 108 年底已召開 4 次工作會議、1 次簡報會議，並由設計建築師陸續進行各處室需求訪談。
2. 景觀藝術化工程執行情形：
 - 「南部院區園區景觀藝術化工程」及「南部院區特色景觀及植栽佈置工程」於 108 年 2 月 11 日開工，已完工並於 12 月 13 日驗收通過。

7.子計畫「故宮整體行銷及媒宣推廣」

「捷運士林站及臺北車站故宮藝文空間」完成捷運士林站與臺北車站故宮藝文空間設計製作。

8.子計畫「新南向行銷及媒宣推廣」

- 「故宮亞洲藝術節—2019泰國月」活動期間自108年9月28日至10月31日，包含薩瓦蒂泰—故宮泰文化特展(展期自108年10月5日至109年1月5日)，推出多元文化體驗、表演藝術、特展、講座、電影、主題書展、美食文創市集等活動，超過2萬8千人次參與，當月份參觀人數超過12萬人。

- 「故宮新南向媒體觀光宣傳推廣」共25位新南向國家媒體參訪故宮南北院，包含馬來西亞、泰國、越南、新加坡、菲律賓五國，累積12則傳統媒體、178則網路媒體的曝光。

- 「馬來西秋季旅展暨胡志明市旅展」(108年8月9日於馬來西亞展出、108年9月5日於越南胡志明市展出)，整體行銷臺灣文化，讓東南亞國家民眾認識臺灣，並提升其來臺觀光及參觀博物館之意願。

◆ The Overall Planning Content

The NPM plans to develop a blueprint for the next six years and submit a national public construction development plan with the "New NPM Publicization and Tourism Industry Development Plan (2018-2023)." The total investment of 782 million NT dollars to build a public "New NPM" and uphold its status as a world-class tourist attraction will promote the development of Taiwan's tourism industry. The plan was approved by the Executive Yuan on December 6, 2017. It is expected that after the completion of the 2024 construction, the number of visitors to the Northern and Southern Branches will be increased, that ticket income will grow, and that the consumption and output value by international and domestic visitors will be increased.

In order to expand the spillover benefits of the NPM, deepen international tourism at the museum, and increase the quality of local sightseeing, the plan clearly outlines "promoting the publicity of the NPM and creating world-class sightseeing highlights," "promoting the integration of the tourism resources of Taiwan museums," and "driving the upgrading and innovation of the tourism industry." These goals will be achieved through landscape optimization, exhibition innovation, activity integration, traffic improvement, marketing, and planning sub-project implementation content.

In view of President Tsai Ing-wen's announcement that the Taiwan government will be the most powerful backer of the tourism industry, it is expected that the government will devote all its efforts to promoting tourism. Additionally, in order to fulfill the President's political commitment to the Southern Branch and actively follow up on the central government's "New South Direction Policy," the museum has sought support from funds for national public construction plans. It is expected that after construction is completed, the value of the NPM will increase and Taiwan's museums will be at the center of the domestic tourism industry. The tourism industry chain will further enhance Taiwan's brand image and provide better resources and services to enable international tourists to experience Taiwan's multiculturalism and take the initiative to promote Taiwan's culture internationally.

On June 24, 2019, the Taipei City Government held the "117th Taipei City Government Historic Sites, Historic Buildings, Memorial Buildings, Architectural Sites, Archaeological Sites, and Cultural Landscape Council Meeting" regarding the "Review of the Cultural Assets Value of the National Palace Museum

Art and Cultural Service Center.” As a result, construction on all projects speeded up. Work on the “Five Buildings for Earthquake Reinforcement” was completed. The tender for the “Art Culture Service Center Turnkey Project” was finalized on December 16, and construction began on January 31, 2020.

B. After the “Northern Branch Entire (Expanded) Construction Project Technical Service Case” failed at three biddings, the Public Works Committee recommended that the NPM handle the “Advanced Planning Case” first. However, after public hearings on April 26 and 27, 2019, it was decided to stop the “Entrance Porch Construction” and “Pillar Corridor” projects so that amendments could be made. Seeing as the content of the plan is relatively simple, the “advance planning” and “project management” parts were tendered together. The tender was finalized on October 29 and construction started on November 12.

Sub-plan 2:

The Design of the NPM National Treasures Restoration Exhibition Hall

A. Implementation of the “NPM National Treasures Restoration Exhibition Hall” Project

The report on the second phase of the “National Treasures Restoration Exhibition Hall” preliminary plan was reviewed and approved on September 18, 2019. The main construction engineers sent agreement and tender documents to the Construction Department on June 25, 2019. On July 7, the design supervision, construction, and bid awards were finalized; by the end of 2019, four working meetings and one briefing had been held, and the design architects had successively conducted need interviews.

B. Implementation of the “Landscape Art Project”

- The “Southern Garden Landscape Art Project” and “Southern Garden Landscape and Planting Layout Project” started on February 11, 2019, and were completed and passed inspection on December 13.
- The “Scenic Arts Parent and Child Interactive Zone Project in the Southern Branch” started on September 2, 2019, and is expected to be completed by the end of January 2020.
- The “Southern Branch Landscape Bridge and Dynamic Line Integration, Entrusted Planning, Design, and Supervision Technical Service Case” was finalized on September 12, 2019. The basic design was submitted on November 14 and is currently under review.
- The “Southern District Water, Surrounding Facilities, and Activities Evaluation Plan” has already completed its final report and has been closed.
- The “Service Case for the 2019 Landscape Light Sculpture Exhibition in the Southern Branch” was exhibited from September 13 to November 10, 2019, and the estimated number of visitors was about 38,637.
- The commissioned design competition, production, and exhibition of the “3D Water Curtain Projection Water Dance Performance in the Southern Branch” was performed from June 29 to September 1, 2019. The number of visitors was estimated at 75,731.
- In the “Smart Navigation and Self-Service System Procurement Case,” on July 30, 2019, touchscreens were installed in the Lucao Township Office and Puzi City Office; on August 15, the high-speed railway Chiayi Station TV was installed. Touchscreen installations on the second floor of Dingcai Garden, Liujiabao Library, Chiayi County Government, and the Southern Branch was completed on August 27; all site stations were completed on September 16.
- “Publicity of the New National Palace Museum Drives the Tourism Industry--A Plan to Build a Cultural Tourism and Transportation Facility” includes six townships near the Southern Branch, including Dongshi Township, Lucao Township, Xingang Township, Taibao City, Puzi City, and Liujiabao Township. A space combining images of the Southern Branch, local consciousness, and popular culture elements will create a chain reaction of tourism. In 2019, five localities including Dongshi Township, Lucao Township, Xingang Township, Taibao City, and Liujiabao Township have been closed. The sub-city office is scheduled to close in 2020.

Sub-plan 3:

Museum Group International Tourism Network System Construction Plan

A. Sub-project “International Curatorial Cooperation”

- “Expedition to Asia: The Prominent Exchanges Between East and West in the 17th Century” (December 20, 2018 to March 10, 2019), with a total of 880,309 visitors.
- “The Beauty of Interchange--Selections from Japan’s Kobe City Museum” (June 6, 2019 to September 8, 2019), with a total of 170,622 visitors.

- “Masks--Beauty of the Spirits: Masterpieces from the musée du quai Branly - Jacques Chirac” (November 15, 2019 to March 1, 2020), with a total of 241,145 visitors.

“A Carnival of Fantasies: A Special Exhibition of 21st Century Museums in the Southern Branch of the NPM” (December 17, 2019 to May 26, 2020): On December 16, the Southern Branch held the forum “New Virtual--Reality Art and Technology Discussion of Tomorrow” in conjunction with the exhibition. There were a total of 238 on-site registrations and a cumulative 46,293 online viewings as of December 31, 2019.

- The “East Asian Painting Curator Workshop” on July 27, 2019, had a total of 74 participants.

B. Sub-project “NPM National Treasures Go Out”

- “Flowers of Immense Charm: A Masterpiece Exhibition by Four Major Museums” was held from October 6, 2018, to February 10, 2019.
- “Taichung Flora Expo and NPM New Media Art Exhibition” was held from November 3, 2018, to April 24, 2019.
- “Timeless Legend: The Red Cliff and Historic Figures of the Three Kingdoms” was held January 25 to April 14, 2019.

Collaborations with different institutions aim to integrate the tourism resources of different museums and develop high-quality and in-depth cultural tourism in the region.

C. Sub-project “Organization and Operation of the International Tourism Union of Museum Groups” and “Friendly Service Facilities of the International Tourism Union of Museum Groups”

- The “Summer Joint Marketing of National Social, Educational, and Cultural Institutions” press conference was held on June 18, 2019. The “Northern Branch Summoner of Animals” went to the museum to play battle cards in the Northern Branch. During the activity, from July 5 to September 25, a total of 2,000 people participated. The Southern Branch held the “Southern Branch Discovery--Magic Grid Flip Card.” During the event, from July 2 to September 8, a total of 1,000 people participated.
- The “Museum Professional Symposium--NPM Cultural Relics Preservation Lecture and Workshop for Thread-bound Books” was conducted in Taichung and Kaohsiung over eight sessions, from October to November 2019, with a total of 240 participants.
- The “2019 National Palace Museum Fun Thoughts--Students Visit the Northern Branch with HI FUN” event was held from September 3 to January 31, 2019, with 133 schools and 6,660 teachers and students participating.
- The “Million Students Visit the NPM” initiative used 401 trips by the end of 2019, visiting 314 schools. A total of 24,819 students benefited from the program. Of the participating schools, 80 were rural schools with 3,962 participants, and two were indigenous schools (Namaxia School and Dabang Elementary School) with a total of 65 participants.
- The “2019 Children’s Creative Center Update” was completed in June 2019, and by December 31 the Center had received a total of 171,807 visitors.
- The “Pigment and Dyestuff Scientific Research Workshop and Cultural Asset Research and Preservation Forum” was held from November 26 to 27, 2019. The workshop had a total of 216 participants on November 26 and a total of 109 participants on November 27.
- The special exhibition “Curio Boxes of Emperor Qianlong” was opened December 25 and will last until December 26, 2021. The total number of visitors to the exhibition as of January 15, 2020 is 18,399.

D. Sub-project “Taiwanese Museum Joint Exhibition”

- During the 2019 International Council of Museums (ICOM) Kyoto Conference, held September 1 to 7, 2019, the National Palace Museum set up the themed booth “The Beauty of East Asian Museums,” echoing the 2019 conference theme “Museums as Cultural Hubs: The Future of Tradition.” In the booth, the NPM used modern digital technology and friendly service standards to present the NPM’s deep cultivation of Asian civilization and collection of Chinese art. The NPM also debuted the short film “The Future, Unexpected Encounters.” By December 26, 2019, the film had received 18,000 likes, 868,000 views, reached 1.53 million people, and had 9,099 shares.
- “The 2019 Summer Parent-Child Art Month,” from July 6 to September 1, 2019, was the National Palace Museum’s first large-scale event in conjunction with the “The Beauty of Interchange: Selections from Japan’s Kobe City Museum.” The initiative invited families to a series of adventure activities, including summer camps, puzzles, performances, and picture book camps. Not only could families visit exhibitions in the museum, but they could also participate in activities loved by both parents and children. During the month, about 110,000 people participated in educational activities, nearly 300,000

people visited the museum, and about 45 million people learned about it through online publicity.

Traffic Links: By linking traffic and enriching sightseeing routes, we can create tourism that helps facilitate experiencing Taiwan’s culture.

E. Sub-project “iTaiwan Museum Pass,” “Experience Taiwan Culture Package Tour App,” and “Museum Facility”

The “iTaiwan Museum Pass and the Integration of Transportation and Travel Services Marketing Case” held a press conference for the “iTaiwan Museum Pass” on December 19, 2019, and issued the first “iTaiwan Museum Pass.” On January 1, 2020, use of the museum passes commenced, and five tour packages around the Southern Branch were launched.

F. Sub-project “Adolescent and Children’s Education Center Service Upgrade”

The “2019 Taiwan International Forum on Children and Museums” was held October 25 to 27, 2019. Experts and scholars from the NPM, France’s Centre Pompidou, the National Museum of Korea, the National Gallery of Singapore, the United States’ Metropolitan Museum of Art, and other institutions were invited to publish papers and discuss aesthetic education, children’s exhibitions, multimedia technology applications, cultural equality, and more. There were 197 people in attendance on October 25, 105 people on October 26, and on October 27 a total of 28 participants attended museum visits.

International marketing: The National Palace Museum brand is marketed at home and abroad, enhancing the image of Taiwan and developing a new tourism market.

G. Sub-project “Overall Marketing and Media Promotion of the National Palace Museum”

As part of the “MRT Shilin Station and Taipei Main Station NPM Art and Cultural Spaces” project, the design and construction of branded museum spaces in MRT Shilin Station and Taipei Main Station were completed.

H. Sub-project “New Southbound Policy Marketing and Media Promotion”

- The “2019 NPM Asian Art Festival--Thai Month” event was held from September 28 to October 31, 2019, and included the special exhibition “Sawasdee Thailand: A Glimpse of Thai Culture at the NPM” (October 5, 2019 to January 5, 2020). The Festival launched multicultural experiences, performing arts performances, special exhibitions, lectures, movies, themed book fairs, gourmet cultural and creative markets, and more. Over 28,000 people participated in the festival events, while more than 120,000 visitors attended the Southern Branch during the month.
- As part of “The National Palace Museum’s New Southbound Policy Marketing and Media Promotion,” a total of 25 national media outlets visited the Northern and Southern Branches of the NPM, including representatives from Malaysia, Thailand, Vietnam, Singapore, and the Philippines. In total, there were 12 instances of traditional media exposure and 178 instances of online exposure.
- To market Taiwanese culture abroad, the “Malaysian Autumn Travel Exhibition and Ho Chi Minh City Travel Exhibition” was held in Malaysia on August 9, 2019, and in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, on September 5, 2019. The exhibitions spread Taiwanese culture in Southeast Asia and increased foreign audiences’ willingness to visit Taiwan and Taiwan’s museums.
- “The Southeast Asian Language Guide Training Program” was held during September and October 2019, focusing on recruiting new residents, second-generation residents, and overseas Chinese. The program combined multilingual and multicultural education, allowing the NPM to enter different cultural communities as well as cultivate future Southeast Asian tour guides. The program injected new multicultural energy into museum education and promotion. In total, 21 trainees passed the training courses, two in Thai, nine in Vietnamese, and ten in Indonesian. A certification ceremony and results presentation was held on November 16.
- The “International Workshop on the Curation and Preservation of Religious and Cultural Relics in Museums” was held November 16-17, 2019. Domestic and foreign scholars and experts exchanged practical experiences and research results to discuss the display, research, preservation, and restoration of cultural relics. This event invited museum practitioners, researchers in art and cultural preservation, and experts from related fields. The two-day agenda consisted of 14 sessions and included a total of 632 participants.

本院舉辦各項精彩展覽、活動，及推動諸多政策、願景，均藉由多元媒體管道向社會大眾宣告與推廣，包括大陸、日本及歐美國家的駐臺記者，均熱烈參與故宮重要記者會，並廣加報導，對於我國文化觀光產業產生實質正面的催化作用。此外，本院亦積極結合行政院新聞傳播處、文化部、外交部、交通部觀光局等中央機關及各級地方政府機關國內外行銷管道，並善用企業、媒體、社區等社會資源，協助宣傳本院展覽及活動，期能以有限預算發揮最大的行銷效益。

Public Affairs

In response to the NPM's wide range of functions, the museum initiated a series of plans to promote the "Good Neighbor Program" seeking cooperation with private enterprises and the "Friends of the NPM" via the effective incorporation of social resources. These plans aim to extend the cultural influence of the NPM collection. Through close cooperation with the media, society can experience and benefit from the wonderful resources of the NPM collection.

◆ Media Promotion and Public Relations

The NPM holds a variety of exhibitions and programs to promote the museum's policies and visions, which are announced to the public via the media. Reporters from China, Japan, and Europe have all actively participated in the NPM's press conferences. Positive coverage of the NPM's exhibitions and programs in turn boosts overall cultural tourism. Furthermore, the NPM has aimed to utilize foreign and domestic public marketing channels organized by the government, corporations, media, local communities, and other social resources. For example, with the cooperation of government organizations such as the Department of Information Services of the Executive Yuan, the Ministry of Culture, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Tourism Bureau of the Ministry of Transportation and Communications, local borough chiefs, and more, as well as private resources allocated to corporations, the media, the community and other social resources, the NPM has been able to maximize advertising effectiveness on a limited budget.

◆本院出版品、文物仿製品及餐飲服務

1. 本院依照立法院決議及行政院指示，博物館商店之經營管理業已依政府採購法辦理公開招標，委託專業廠商辦理。
2. 本院北部院區為服務參訪遊客之餐飲需求，目前有故宮晶華餐廳、閒居賦、富春居、至善園餐廳等多處餐飲空間，分別提供包括精緻餐飲、會議宴客服務，以及簡餐、輕食、飲料等餐飲選項；針對穆斯林觀眾，亦可於北部院區故宮晶華餐廳地下二樓用餐，該餐廳業經穆斯林友善餐廳認證。南部院區餐飲空間「嘉會廳」以委外服務型態進行營運，供應鍋物、鬆餅、霜淇淋、伴手禮、飲品等，並於遊客中心、博物館周邊休憩空間及園區北側候車亭，設置飲料及全熱研磨咖啡自動販賣機。

Recreational Consumption

The functions of modern museums have been extended from the traditional core roles, such as collecting, protecting, exhibiting, and education, to providing leisure and entertainment. The NPM strives to create a more vibrant recreational and consumer environment by marketing and cross-industry alliance strategies of business management.

◆ NPM Publications, Reproductions of Antiquities, and Catering Services

- (1) In compliance with the Legislative Yuan and the Executive Yuan, the operation and management of the museum store has been openly tendered in accordance with the law and commissioned by professionals.
- (2) The Northern Branch of the museum serves the catering needs of visitors. At present, there are many dining spaces at the NPM, including the Silks Palace Restaurant, Xianjufu Café, and Fuchunju Café, which provide dining, conference, and banquet options (such as light meals and drinks). Muslim visitors can also dine on the second floor of the Silks Palace Restaurant, which is certified as a Muslim-friendly restaurant. The Jiahui Hall, an outsourced dining space in the Southern Branch, serves meals, muffins, ice cream, souvenirs, and drinks. Vending machines for beverages and coffee are set up at the visitor center, the open space around the museum, and the waiting area on the north side of the museum.

◆ Budget Execution

Official Budget

A. In 2019, the NPM's budget revenue was NT\$1,316,714,000 and the final account was NT\$1,062,665,545, making the ratio of final accounts to budget 80.71%. The difference in revenue was NT\$254,048,455, mainly due to a decrease in ticket sales to the exhibition halls.

The NPM's Art Development Operation Fund

A. The total final revenue (including sales revenue and non-operating income) was NT\$850,000,000, while the final accounts was NT\$627,073,079.93. The ratio of final accounts to budget is 73.77%. The difference in revenues was NT\$222,926,920.07, mainly due to Taoyuan Airport Terminal 2 construction. The NPM's T2 shop there coordinated with the terminal construction project to adjust to temporary counters with less traffic. Additionally, China restricted the number visitors to Taiwan starting in August 2019, which affected the sales of goods.

B. The total final expenditure (including costs of goods sold, marketing, general and administrative expenses) was NT\$636,031,000, while the final account was NT\$503,635,723.66. The ratio of final accounts to budget is 79.18%. The difference in revenue was NT\$132,395,276.34, mainly due to a decrease in the sales of store goods and the resulting decrease in the costs of goods sold and marketing expenses.

C. After offsetting the revenue with costs and expenses, a surplus of NT\$123,437,356.27 was left this year, which is NT\$90,531,643.73 lower than the budget of \$213,969,000. The difference is approximately 42.31% of the budget.

◆ Result of Ethical Administration

Promoting the "Sustainable Ethics from One Generation to the Next at the NPM" Project

After the International Review Conference of the "First National Report of the United Nations Convention against Corruption" was completed on August 24, 2019, it publicly issued 47 concluding observations. In order to comply with these, the NPM undertook the 2019 "High-quality National Palace Museum" project on the implementation of clean government and discipline. The museum invited experts, scholars, and practitioners to teach related courses with topics such as law, curbing corruption, and other crimes, with the goal of improving the anti-corruption awareness of colleagues and achieving anti-corruption efficacy.

Executing Policies of Transparency

A. According to the "Proportion of Public Officials' Property Declaration Law" and its rules, there were 14 people who applied for regular property declaration in 2019, one applicant reporting for employment, and three reporting for resignation, with one in an acting position. All completed the declaration within the time limit. On January 17, 2019, a substantial examination into the declaration of property by officials in 2018, and a comparison of the declared property of each year before and after was held. Three were selected at random, and the results of the examination did not reveal any intentional declarations of false information.

B. In 2019, there were 14 people who made regular property declarations, and there were 14 people who were authorized to access property data. The proportion of authorized people reached 100%.

C. In 2019, the NPM did not violate the Public Official Conflict of Interest Avoidance Law, and achieved the "zero penalties" goal with good results.
